

The Aim of the Program

The need for qualified intermediate staff in the maritime sector is increasing in our country, a peninsula surrounded by seas on three sides, due to the advantages provided by its geographical location and the rise in foreign trade volume. The primary goal of our program is to contribute to meeting the growing demand for skilled workers in the maritime industry.



The advantages of our country's geographical location, along with the investments made, have led to a continuous increase in our maritime trade fleet capacity, the volume of cargo at our ports, the construction, maintenance, and repair of ships at shipyards, and the volume of agency services provided to ships.

Future of the Program

interdisciplinary program, the Maritime and Port Management Program aims to train qualified interns with both technical and business knowledge of the maritime sector based on the importance of the details of the business. In line with this objective, our students in the first year receive basic pre-graduate teaching courses as well as sector entry courses in the second year, with detailed sectoral courses. In addition, our students enhance their sectoral knowledge and insight through both their mandatory 30-day internships and various seminars, lectures, technical tours, etc. organized by the Maritime Student Club.



Istanbul Gelişim University, Istanbul Gelişim Vocational School, Maritime and Port Management Program, has a standard duration of two academic years for completion, with a minimum total credit requirement of 120 ECTS credits depending on the student workload.

In the first two semesters, students are required to take common courses offered by our vocational school and introductory courses relevant to the field. Starting from the third semester, the focus shifts towards professional courses, where students begin to take both mandatory courses necessary for their profession and elective courses.

The purpose of the double major program is to enable students who excel in their major programs, with a minimum GPA of 2.90 out of 4.00 and ranking within the top 20% of their undergraduate program, to pursue a second major and earn an additional diploma free of charge.

Through Erasmus+, the European Union's grant program for education, youth, and sports, our students have access to various opportunities abroad such as education, training, internships, professional development, and youth activities based on widespread learning.

20 different application and research centers conduct innovative, technological, and sociological studies across various fields with in our university. Additionally, thematic research groups contribute to science in 10 different areas ranging from food to construction, automotive to healthcare.
