

Summer heat also affects animals

Stating that respiratory system and various eye infections may be seen in animals exposed to air conditioning, Prof. Dr. M. Erman Or said: “We encounter cases that require long treatment. The animals should not be directly exposed to air conditioning and the owners should be immediately contacted with veterinary physicians if symptoms such as cough, wheezing, phlegm, hoarseness occur.”

Summer heat negatively affects people as well as animals that share life with them in this period. Explaining that with the increase of the sun rays, heat strokes can be seen in all animals, Prof. Dr. M. Erman Or gave important warnings. Telling that animals exposed to the sun will experience respiratory and circulatory insufficiencies as a result of increased body temperatures, Prof. Dr. M. Erman Or said: “For example pets can die of the lack of oxygen, by keeping the pets in closed places, either in the car with the windows closed or in transport booths. In such cases, it is vital that the pet is immediately taken to an environment where it can receive oxygen, kept in the shade and, if necessary, soaked in cold water. Then, the veterinarian physicians should be consulted as soon as possible. It should not be forgotten that we should not keep our friends in the atmospheric conditions we do not want to be exposed.”

“CONSULT A PHYSICIAN”

Referring that people are exposed to air conditioning in sultriness as well as animals, Prof. Dr. M. Erman Or said:

“Respiratory system and various eye infections may occur and there may be cases that need long-term treatment in our animals. They should avoid directly being exposed to air conditioning and you should be immediately contacted with veterinary physicians if symptoms such as cough, wheezing, phlegm, hoarseness occur. Another important issue is to wander with our dear friends in the meadow, the countryside, picnic areas in the summer months. There are various risks at these conditions. For example, ticks and fleas’ bites, and bee stings and injuries from wall barley, are the most common. Because fleas logarithmically multiply on dogs and tick bites, which are generally not noticed, cause both parasites themselves and various diseases carried by these parasites to be transmitted to animals.

Even though these parasites have been the cause, the skin should be continuously examined and contacted with the veterinarian physician without any intervention to the bites.”

ATTENTION TO THE BUG BITES

Pointing out bug bites and especially bee stings can prevent vital activities, Istanbul Gelisim University Assist. Prof. M. Erman Or said: “Therefore, the intervention of the bitten area with ammonia, the use of antihistaminic drugs, cold showers or ice applications should be thought. If there is a bee sting in the throat or nose of the animal, you should immediately consult with veterinarian physician because it may cause risk due to swelling of the respiratory area. Snake bites or scorpion stings are important factors in rural areas, whether or not in the city.”

“FOOD CAN BE SPOILED FAST”

Stating that the various feed and food residues given to animals to eat in good faith will spoil much faster in the summer, Prof. Dr. Or warned: “Animals may be poisoned. Likewise, there are poisonings caused by applying pesticide to various environments. In such cases, the main approach is to get the animal to be vomited and toxin out although animals need to see veterinary physicians as soon as possible.”

“ATTENTION TO SEA AND LONG HAIR”

Stating that pet owners should be careful while their pets are swimming, Assist. Prof. M. Erhan Or warned:

“Pet owners get their pets to swim to cool them down. This may be enjoyable for some pets, but some may not like it, and water leakage or suffocation may even occur in some cases. It should be tilted to prevent the water intake to the lungs as soon as possible and veterinary physician intervention should be immediately applied. Increased exposure to sultriness in animals with long hair causes compelling symptoms in the respiratory and circulatory systems. Therefore, shaving of animals in early summer is very important for their comfort during this period. The elderly and overweight animals should not be fed too much or too heavy, and they should not make long-term, effortful walks under the sun. Even sunburns can occur in animals with short white hair. The use of sunscreen with a high protection

factor is recommended. Summer should be spent together with our dear friends by experiencing every moment towards the days when the working period will be intensified again by taking careful and necessary precautions along with the risks as well as beauties of the summer.”

What should be considered while buying a sacrificial animal?

Stating that choosing a sacrificial animal is very important, Veterinary Physician Prof. Dr. Mustafa Nizamlioglu said that the animal must look healthy, and must not have any scar or swelling, and also must have vivid coloured and bright wool or hair.

Experts specified what to consider while buying a sacrificial animal, days before to Eid-al-Adha (Sacrifice Holiday). Veterinary Physician Prof. Dr. Mustafa Nizamlioglu from Istanbul Gelisim University said: “It should be noted that animals do not have notable symptoms making think that they have any disease. The animal should look healthy in appearance, not exhausted, and have vivid coloured and bright wool or hair.”

CHECK THE ANIMAL’S NOSE, MOUTH AND EAR HOLES

Pointing out the disease transmitted from animals to humans, Prof. Dr. Nizamlioglu said: “The streams from the animal's natural holes (nose, mouth, ears) with fetor, different colours or blood can be a symptom of various diseases. For this reason, registered animals that have passed veterinary physicians’ control should be purchased. There are many zoonotic disease factors that can be transmitted to humans from uncontrolled animals that have not been examined by a veterinary physician.”

DO NOT STRESS THE ANIMAL

On the other hand, Food Hygiene and Technology Specialist Assist. Prof. Dr. Semiha Yalçın put emphasis on the transportation of the animals after the purchase. Dr. Yalçın said: “In addition to all these criteria, religiously appropriate animals (not pregnant, non-blind) can be identified as sacrificial animals. Another point that should be considered after the purchase of animals is the transportation process. Animal transport processes should be planned so as not to cause stress in animals and should be hygienically applied without causing any infection.”

“GET IT REST FOR 12 HOURS FOR THE QUALITY OF MEAT”

Underlining that it is important to take precaution against possible traumatization during the transportation of the animal, Dr. Yalçın said: “Before slaughtering, the animals should be rested for at least 12 hours in summer to ensure that the meat has good quality. Tired, newly transported or stressed animals should not be slaughtered immediately, this period should be followed. Feeding should be stopped for at least 6 hours prior to slaughtering and the animal should only take water. Agreeing to slaughterhouses or sacrificial slaughterhouses for cutting operations is important for cutting hygiene and health.”

WHAT TO BE CONSIDERED DURING THE SACRIFICIAL CUT

Suggesting that the extravasation of the animal must be properly done during the cut of the sacrificial animal, Dr. Yalçın said: “Sacrificial animals should be slaughtered in places that meet minimum technical and hygienic conditions. Cutting should be done by experienced people, if possible. Extravasation should be provided. Otherwise, microorganisms can easily breed in the meat, causing the meat to spoil in a short time. Meat should not be immediately consumed. When meat is waited for 12 hours in a cold environment, meat gets tasty, crispy and aromatic.”

Turkey Cooks and Chefs Federation (TAFED) National Team and Pastry Arts Master Chief Tuba Geçkil, who approximately for seven years has been working in the confectionery sector, providing training and successfully representing Turkey in different competitions abroad, met with students who wants to study Gastronomy in the preference days.

Talking about cake decorating in the meeting in Istanbul Gelisim University, Tuba Geçkil said: “A very special level of this sector which we call as boutique pastry, in which the pastry sector has been progressing at a more artistic level, is this kind of style. With the participation of artistic designs in competitions abroad, the level has increased even faster in our country. I would like to let young people show themselves to work with great competent people in the world through these works because this sector is at high levels abroad. I hope that we will become a better level at the same speed and we will do great work together.”

Stating that the term ‘work of art’ must come to mind when someone speak of pastry, Geçkil said: “We will have reached that level in our country. I can foresee that due to providing training in this sector for seven years. I have trained hundreds of students in this regard. I will tell its importance to the students.”

HE WILL IMPROVE THE FAMILY PROFESSION

18-year-old Mustafa Şekercioğlu who is a son of a family engaged in confectionery for 7 generations stated that he preferred the Gastronomy department to hand down the family profession to his next generations and said “I want to study Gastronomy to continue the family profession. Our profession is Turkish delight and candy. I want to work on baking cake and biscuit, as well. I can run a café or patisserie. I would like to continue this work in addition to Turkish delight and candy. I am the seventh generations.”

“ALL MY GRANDCHILDREN WILL STUDY GASTRONOMY”

Mustafa Şekerciöđlu, the grandfather who did not leave his grandchild alone in the preference days said: I have worked as pastry cook all my life. This is like that ever since my grandfather and his father started to work. I want my grandchildren work in this field. Therefore, we are here for this major. We are self-trained. I am a primary school graduate, but I want my grandchildren work in this field as trained and thorough knowledge. I want my grandchildren to run café by getting trained in chocolate and pastry. I have six grandchildren; we will bring them successively. We all want the same department.”

Right wing in the UK started to change with Boris Johnson

Stating that after the new British Prime Minister Boris Johnson took over the ruling Conservative Party, the ‘right’ wing of the country will become more modern, a Faculty Member Political Scientist Dr. Alihan Limoncuođlu said: “The ‘right’ in the UK has a new and more modern look. Even though the name of the Conservative Party is ‘conservative’, it seems to have taken a new path.”

Assist. Prof. Dr. Alihan Limoncuođlu from Istanbul Gelisim University Political Science and International Relations analysed how Boris Johnson’s appointment to the country's new Prime Minister will affect Europe, how the Brexit process will work from now and how the relations between Turkey and the United Kingdom will be.

Stating that Boris Johnson who is the leader of Conservative Party brings a new and more modern look to the right wing of the country, Assist. Prof. Dr. Alihan Limoncuođlu said: “We had the opportunity to examine Boris Johnson closely as he became the leader of the Conservative Party. Frankly, he was the favorite candidate from the very beginning. He became a very popular name especially during the mayor of London. He is the one of the representatives of the new generation of the British right. Later, we see that he is the Minister of Foreign Affairs and now he is the Prime Minister, and as a result of all these events, we can easily say this: The ‘right’ in the UK has a new and more modern look now. Even though the name of the Conservative Party is ‘conservative’, it seems to have taken a new path.”

“THERESA MAY HAD A VERY UNSUCCESSFUL PERIOD AS PRIME MINISTER”

Stating that the Brexit process, which came to a deadlock in the Theresa May period, will result faster in the Johnson period, Alihan Limoncuoğlu said: “In the process, Theresa May followed the middle-of-the-road approach, but could not succeed. In fact, she angered the parties who wanted to leave and stay from the European Union at the same time. She had a very unsuccessful period as prime minister. Boris Johnson is a tough guy. There is support from both the public and the party to get out of the United Kingdom from the European Union. But for this, the party would not vote him as chairperson. Although there is a such intense media pressure over people, half of the country still wants to leave the European Union.”

“THAT HE IS AN OTTOMAN GRANDCHILD DOES NOT AFFECT FOR TUSKISH DIPLOMACY”

Johnson who is called as “Ottoman Grandchild” in Turkey is the son of Stanley Johnson who is the grandson of the last Minister for Internal Affairs of Ottoman Empire Ali Kemal who was killed. Stating that this situation will not affect the diplomacy between Turkey and the UK so much, Limoncuoğlu said:

“Not only in terms of the European Union, but the processes in Turkey and the Middle East will have some differences. In particular, we can see that he will take a pro-Israel policy on the Israel - Palestinian issue. We can see this both from his time of the foreign ministry and from his statements. Besides this, what is interested to us is the show side is that he is the grandson of the famous Ali Kemal... In fact, except for cultural and show part, I do not think that it will not affect the UK’s diplomacy with Turkey so much. He is a politician who sides for the relations between Turkey and the UK to keep good but he resists acception of Turkey to the EU. In this respect, his political approach resembles the President of the United States Donald Trump. I think that this will accelerate the processes between the United Kingdom and the United States.”
