Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Health, Culture, and Sports Department Biotechnology and Life Sciences Club hosted Vice Rector of Istinye University Prof. Dr. Erdal Karaöz within the scope of an event organized 4th time in the 2018-2019 academic year.

In the event held in IGU Gelisim Tower it was talked about “The Role of Stem Cells in Diabetes Treatment”. Prof. Dr. Karaöz said that type 1 diabetes is a health problem caused by the body's immune system cells that are programmed to fight foreign organisms such as viruses and bacteria, and that they detect and kill insulin-producing cells as foreigners for any reason.

Emphasizing that type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease Prof. Dr. Karaöz added that they have proven that there are stem cells that provide continuity of the organ within the pancreas and he said the following:

“In fact, there are cells that produce insulin in the pancreas of all diabetes patients. Because of the imbalance between construction and destruction, we deal with diseases. Construction and demolition exist in all our bodies. If for any reason the destruction increases, we are experiencing clinical consequences; this also applies to cancer.”

At the end of the event, Vice Rector of Istinye University Prof. Dr. Erdal Karaöz was presented a plaque of appreciation on behalf of Istanbul Gelisim University for his participation in the event.

An advice to young people from Turkey's oldest phenomenon: Don't move your frustration to the next day

Füsün Kaslak – the Fancy Füsün, who has been living for 20 years in Darülaceze that serves since 125 years in Istanbul, advised the young people: “Do not carry your frustration to the next day, so you can stay young as I do”.

Füsün Kaslak - the Fancy Füsün who started to stay in Darülaceze after her parents' death since 1999 is among Darülaceze's remarkable figures. Known as the oldest phenomena of Turkey who attracts attention with her cheerful attitude and well-maintained status, Füsün Kaslak also makes a mark with her accessoires. Kaslak, who is in the same frame with a photo of a youth in a photography exhibition entitled 'We owe every sycamore a generation debt' organized by Istanbul Gelisim University students, said that she is now younger, well-groomed and vigorous.

"DARÜLACEZE REMADE MY IDENTITY"

Füsün The Fancy who lives in Darülaceze where she calls her home since 20 years, said that when she first came she was a bit hesitated and frustrated, but now she says that it was a right choice.

Füsün the Fancy added: "Some conditions brought me here, but now I'm saying that it's good. I'm very happy right now, if I was home I was nothing but this place gave me a very good name and remade my identity".

"EVEN MY FAMILY COULD NOT MAKE ME GIVE UP"

Stating that she grow up under strict pressure by her family, Kaslak said: "They call me Fancy Füsün because I'm too fancy. I've been like this since I was young. Even my parents couldn't give me up. Our father was against make-up. He did the same pressure for my mother, but I said, "I'm not my mother." I started make-up at an early age, and I did what the adults did. No matter what people said, Füsün did as she wished. My father finally gave in and finally brought me a makeup set and said 'I lost, you won'. Nobody's gonna let me out of this wall. I find my self when I puff my hair".

"DON'T MOVE YOUR FRUSTRATION TO THE NEXT DAY"

Füsün the Fancy, who explained her dayly life with the videos she made via Youtube, told the formula of staying in the youth for a long time and concluded her words:

"If you're frustrated today, you can stay as frustrated as me without carrying the frustration the next day. You'il forget everything. Life cannot forget such a thing. I can't make it. I say 'Füsün, enjoy the rest, pour spilled. You live the life, it's so beautiful to live'".

"STUDENTS MADE A YOUTH VACCINE TO ME"

When she saw the photographs in the exhibition prepared by the university students, she was surprised and said that she was happy and asked 'Is that me?' Fancy Füsün continued as follows:

"Everyone says I'm much more beautiful than my photo. I was very surprised when I saw his photo. I said, is this me? I don't like myself. Coming together with young people is the best of emotions. They've been given me vaccinations."
