

“Ermenistan terör politikasına geçiş yaptı”

Azerbaycan’ın Karabağ’daki çatışma bölgesinden uzak Tovuz, Şemkir, Gence, Goranboy, Naftalan, Mingeçevir, ayrıca çatışma bölgesine yakın Terter, Beyleqan, Ağdam, Berde bölgelerinin yoğun füze saldırısına uğraması hakkında konuşan Sosyolog ve Uluslararası İlişkiler Uzmanı Dr. Behlül Aliyev, uluslararası hukukun çiğnendiğine vurgu yaptı. Aliyev, “Cephede ağır darbe alan Ermenistan, umduğu uluslararası desteği arkasına alamayınca terör politikasına geçit yaptı” diye konuştu.

Bölgedeki çatışmanın fitilini ateşleyen Ermenistan’ın, cephede art arda aldığı darbelerle sivil yerleşim yerlerini hedef almaya başladığını belirten İstanbul Gelişim Üniversitesi’nden Dr. Aliyev “Bu saldırılar özellikle çok yönlü olup hedef şaşırtmayı amaçlamakla birlikte Azerbaycan’ın stratejik açıdan önemli yerlerini da tahrip etmeyi amaçlamaktadır. Örneğin, Mingeçevir Azerbaycan’ın enerji kenti olmakla birlikte 16 milyar metreküp hacmiyle Kafkasya’nın en büyük su deposunu barındırmaktadır. Bölgede Azerbaycan için hayati öneme sahip hidroelektrik santrali yerleşmektedir. Daha önceler de Ermenistan tarafı Mingeçevir barajını patlatarak bölgeyi felakete sürükleyecekleriyle ilgili farklı mecralardan tehditler savurmuşlardı. Füzelere birinin santralin bir enerji bloğunun yakınına isabet etmesi ve şans eseri infilak etmemesi, Ermenistan’ın hukuk tanımazlığıyla birlikte savaş ahlakından da nasibini almadığının göstergesidir. Gence kentinin bombalanmasına gelince, Gence’nin Azerbaycan’ın kültür merkezlerinden biri olduğunu, kentte çok sayıda tarihi yapıların olduğu göz önünde bulundurulduğunda Ermenistan’ın aynı 90’lı yıllarda olduğu gibi medeniyete karşı vandal tutumundan vazgeçemediğini sergilemektedir” ifadelerini kullandı.

“UMDUĞU ULUSLARARASI DESTEĞİ ARKASINA ALAMADI”

Ermenistan’ın Karabağ dışında Azerbaycan’ın sivil yerleşim yerlerini hedef almasının ardında yatan nedenlere değinen Aliyev “Erivan durumu daha da çetrefilli yapmak için uğraşmaktadır. Bu bölgelere yapılan saldırılar, Bakü’yü karşı saldırıya tahrik etmek, böylece ‘mazlum Ermenistan’ imajına dönerek Kolektif Güvenlik Antlaşmasının (KGAÖ) devreye girmesi için uğraşmaktadır” dedi ve ekledi: “Cephede ağır darbe alan Ermenistan, umduğu uluslararası desteği de arkasına alamayınca terör politikasına geçit yaptı. Artık sıcak temas bölgesinden ziyade Azerbaycan’a farklı ölçülerde tahribat yaşatmayı ve böylece bezdirmeği amaçlamaktadır. Sözde rejim başkanı olan Arayik Arutyunyan’ın savaşı artık Azerbaycan topraklarına taşıyacaklarını açıklaması aslında çaresizliğin vahşi dışavurumudur” dedi.

“KGAÖ AZERBAYCAN’A GARANTÖR OLMALI”

Ermenistan’ın KGAÖ’ya dayanarak, Ermenistan topraklarından Azerbaycan’ın sivil yerleşim yerlerine saldırılarının asla kabul edilemez olduğunu vurgulayan Dr. Behlül Aliyev “Asıl sorulması gereken, KGAÖ, Azerbaycan kentlerindeki sivil altyapıya füze saldırıları sonucunda geniş teknolojik felaketlere karşı Ermenistan tarafından garantörlük yapacak mıdır? Ermenistan Antlaşma kapsamında istediğini yapabilir ve başka ülkenin topraklarına saldırı

gerçekleştirebilir diye bir şey yok. Azerbaycan meşru zeminde Ermenistan topraklarında uluslararası anlaşmaları ihlal ederek Azerbaycan'da güvenliği tehdit etmeğe devam ederse Azerbaycan'ın misilleme hakkı vardır ve o bölgede ateş noktalarını imha edebilir. Bu konuda eskalasyonun devam etmemesi için KGAÖ Ermenistan adına Azerbaycan'a garantörlük taahhüdünde bulunmalı" diye konuştu.

"RUS ORTODOKS KİLİSESİ AZERBAYCAN'I DESTEKLEDİ"

Azerbaycan'ın haklı mücadelesine farklı dini otoritelerin desteği olduğuna da değinen Dr. Aliyev, "Moskova Patrikhanesi'ne bağlı Rus Ortodoks Kilisesi (ROK), Azerbaycan Cumhurbaşkanı yazdığı bildiriye Azerbaycan Ordusunu cephedeki zaferlerinden dolayı tebrik etti ve Azerbaycan'ın işgal altındaki topraklarını işgalden azat etmesi konusunda tam desteğini ifade etti. Bildiriye diğer dini kurumların da başkanları, ROK başpiskoposu Aleksandr Bakinskiy, Kafkasya Müslümanları İdaresi Başkanı Şeyhülislam Allahaşükür Paşazade, Dağ Yahudileri Topluluğu'nun Başkanı Milih Yevdayev, Avrupa Yahudileri Topluluğu'nun Başkanı Aleksandr Şarovski, Alban-Udin Topluluğu başkanı Robert Mobili bildiriye imzalamakla Azerbaycan tarafına desteğini bildirdiler. Bu, çok kültürlü Azerbaycan'ın monoetnik Ermenistan üzerinde kültürel zaferi olarak nitelendirilebilir" şeklinde konuştu.

"The feeling of prevention triggers the tendency to violence"

The tension triggered by the COVID-19 epidemic among patients, relatives and other healthcare professionals increased the violence against healthcare professionals. Clinical Psychologist Ünal Erdem Elli, who evaluated the fact that the rates of violence in health reached the highest level of the last 11 years in the first 6 months of 2020, said: "During the pandemic process, an increase is observed due to the emergence of feelings of frustration in people in general."

The Family Medicine Workers Union (AHESEN) announced that the rates of violence in health reached the highest level in the last 11 years in the first 6 months of 2020. Violence in health is most common in family health centers and emergencies that provide primary health care. Clinical Psychologist from Istanbul Gelisim University Ünal Erdem Elli, who made a statement on the subject, stated that people tend to violence as a result of the feeling of frustration, "People learn that they have lost their relatives without seeing them, this is an angering situation in itself. There is an experience in which people cannot reach their relatives and feel blocked. In our statements on violence in general, we say that prevention is an important trigger."

"DISABLEMENT FEELING COMES TO THE FOREFRONT OF THE INCIDENTS OF VIOLENCE"

Stating that the increase in violence is also seen in the family, social events and traffic, Elli said: "One of the situations that we cannot gain awareness about the pandemic process is that the

virus separates people from their relatives. When people find out that their relatives are positive, they cannot get closer. Therefore, as in many forms of violence, those who lost their relatives also show a tendency towards violence. Another important point is that our people are not aware that it is normal for our people to experience these feelings and they think that their reactions to healthcare professionals are acceptable.”

“HEALTHCARE EMPLOYEES CAN INDICATE THEIR AGGRIEVEMENT WITH THE 'WHITE CODE' SYSTEM”

Mentioning that the white code system helps in reporting the violent incidents in the health sector quickly, but this system also requires severe sanctions against the perpetrators, Elli said: “The white code system is a well-intentioned initiative. They can get their white code by dialing 113 over a phone, or a unique platform has been created by the judiciary to handle it separately from other judicial processes when they are faced with an incident of violence by making a notification about it via [beyazkod.saglik.gov.tr](#)”

“FAMILY PHYSICIANS AND EMERGENCY SERVICE WORKERS EXPOSED TO PRIORITY VIOLENCE”

Stating that the occupancy rates of emergency services and hospitals have increased due to the pandemic and family physicians working in these places are exposed to primary violence, Elli said: “The relative of a patient who has applied to the emergency department is experiencing many concerns. Due to the pandemic process, the capacities of the hospitals are intense compared to the normal process. Patient relatives may think that they are not getting the answer they expected too much. In this case, we can understand that the person feels anger. There is a serious difference between feeling anger and being resorting to violence. First of all, we need to make this distinction and make society aware of this distinction. Of course, the first family physicians they meet or the paramedics who come across in the emergency room are unfortunately the masses that get the heaviest share of this. If we talk about the pandemic, there is a situation we need to take into account. Sometimes the relatives of the patients confront us with the result of applying the heat of the event and the anger they experience to people who first encounter them there, especially those they think cannot respond. This highlights the importance of strict sanctions.”

“MOST OF THE HEALTHCARE WORKERS ARE IN A DEPRESSIVE EMOTION”

Stating that healthcare professionals work by spending intense shifts under difficult conditions during the pandemic process and this situation pushes healthcare workers into a depressive state, Elli said: “When we look at the healthcare professionals, we are faced with another picture. Health workers are in a very worn situation. They have been working under very difficult conditions and intensely for a long time. As psychologists, we call this situation burnout, the clinical equivalent of burnout is depression. In fact, many of them are in a depressive mood. This is a situation that affects them in many areas. Health workers may also have a reduced tolerance. They may feel tired and exhausted. Moreover, this has great effects on working performance. Therefore, in order to protect healthcare professionals, both the

authorities and the forces that will organize it must take a much more active role in protecting them. We also need to raise this awareness to the society.”

“VERBAL VIOLENCE IS NOT REPORTED OVERALL”

Indicating that verbal violence stands out at the forefront of violent tendencies and that most of these violence are not reported, Elli concluded his words with the following: “One of the main difficulties of studies on violence in general is that physical violence can be turned into a judicial process when it is visible, but verbal violence is often ignored. Verbal violence is not generally reported. The same is true for healthcare workers. The harassment and verbal violence they suffer tend to increase like all other types of violence. Verbal violence is always more difficult to prevent than other acts of violence. First of all, we need to make it feel that the obvious, concrete responses of violence are faced with real sanctions.”

Faculty member of IGU won “the best paper” award

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Shehzad Ashraf Chaudhry, faculty member of Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Computer Engineering Department, won the 'best paper' award with his paper titled "Rapidauth: Fast Authentication for Sustainable IoT" presented in the conference titled 'Forthcoming Networks and Sustainability in the IoT Era' (FoNeS-IoT) in October.

Of the 40 applications made to the conference organized by EAI, a non-profit organization and professional community established in cooperation with the European Commission to strengthen global research and innovation and to promote cooperation between the European and International Information and Communication Technology (ICT) communities, only 37% were accepted.
