News from IGU

IGU became the patent application champion in the first half of 2022!

Turkish Patent and Trademark Office (TURKPATENT) announced the universities that made the most patent applications in the first half of 2022. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) ranked first among 333 patent and utility model applications from 14 universities.

IGU, which was chosen as the university that made the most patent applications in 2021 with the number of patent applications reaching 564, continues to maintain its success.

The number of patent applications made by universities (including research centers) in Turkey in the first half of 2022 has been announced. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) was ranked first by applying for patents with 17 national and international projects in the field of technology and engineering that were created and developed in its own research center laboratories, according to the results announced by the Turkish Patent and Trademark Office (TURKPATENT) based on January-June 2022 data.

According to TURKPATENT data, Istanbul Gelisim University, which achieved first in 2021 by making the most patent applications, pursues to hit the headlines in the education sector with its university-industry cooperation approach and scientific projects with a total of 603 patents.

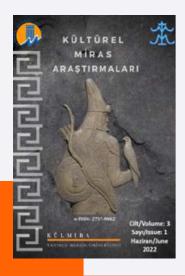

ONE OF THE SEVEN WONDERS OF THE WORLD: ARTEMISION...

Ephesus, located in Selçuk, the southernmost district of İzmir today, is among the most important cities of the Antiquity. The city of Ephesus, which is the center of trade, art, philosophy and politics of the period, is also the capital of the Asian state. The ancient city of Ephesus, thanks to its rich harbor, became the center of the best artists, philosophers and political people of the ancient world. Sculpture workshops, ceramics-painting workshops, philosophy and positive science schools in the city have drawn people from all over the world to study here and see this magnificent city. City streets are decorated with statues and monumental fountains. Even the city's theater, baths and library are still sufficient for the influx of visitors. However, in Antiquity, besides all these structures, there is a structure that none of them can compete with. Artemision, described by Herodotus as one of the 7 wonders of man-made all over the world, is a temple dedicated to Artemis.

There was an altar in the 7th century BC where the Temple of Artemis is located. In the next phase, there is a temple made of marble material. It is known that Lydia King Kroisos helped in the construction of this temple. It is the rebuilding and repair phase that took place after a madman named Herostratos burned the temple to put his name in history in 356 BC in the last phase. We know the temple, which is among the 7 wonders of the world, in detail with the narratives of the Ancient Historian Plynnus. The temple, which is at sea level, is 18 m. Its superstructure, lifted by high columns, makes it easy to see the temple from the whole Ephesus plain and even by sailors approaching the port. The statues and high reliefs of the temple were made by the most famous sculptors of the Ancient world. Some of these were specially brought to Ephesus for the construction of the temple.

People were considered inviolable within the boundaries of the temple, which was built in the name of Goddess Artemis. This has ensured that even criminals can live comfortably within these borders and have the right to seek asylum. However, as this situation was contrary to Roman law, the right of asylum was abolished by Emperor Augustus. The city of Ephesus did not owe its wealth and splendor only to its geographical location and port. At the same time, the Temple of Artemis was attracting many tourists to the city. People used to come here to see the Artemision sanctuary and the structures inside. All Ionian cities came to Ephesus Artemis Temple with Panionion festivals and performed rituals there. These meetings, in time, exposed a political union and the leadership of the city of Ephesus. The structure, which is among the 7 wonders of the world, lost its function in the Late Roman and Byzantine periods with the changing belief and thought systems; It was destroyed due to attacks and natural disasters.

Artemision, which is among the most important structures sought by archaeologists with the development of archeology in the 19th century, first came to light in 1869 by the British Architect, Engineer and Archaeologist John Turtle Wood, who started excavations in line with his research in the Ephesus section of the Smyrna Aid railway. A group of high reliefs, architectural elements and sculptures belonging to Artemision were taken to the British Museum in England. The Artemision excavations were then continued by the Austrian Archaeological Institute to understand the altar and temenos sites.

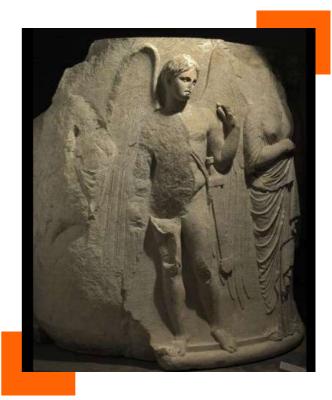

Within the Byzantine walls surrounding the Ayasuluk Hill, which is a part of the city of Ephesus, in the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage, the parts of the temple were extensively used as spolia items. These pieces are today's Ayasuluk Hill and St. Jean Monument that is preserved in the excavation warehouses as an important group of the Temple of Artemision.

The finds, which were included in the Ephesus Ayasuluk excavations, which have been sponsored by Istanbul Gelişim University since 2021, were designed to be re-evaluated together with the Austrian team. We hope that an important cultural heritage such as Artemision will open new windows to the world of science and tourism with the new data obtained as a result of the ongoing studies in 2022 with the participation of scientists from Istanbul Gelisim University Faculty of Applied Sciences, Faculty of Engineering - Architecture and many different universities.

Brand Beliefs

Consumers' beliefs about brands form a part of brand knowledge (Keller, 2003). These beliefs are created by means of brand-customer interaction such as purchasing, using the brand, and introducing brand-related advertisements, promotions and words to the consumer. Brand beliefs can be used to choose between brands by evaluating the advantages and disadvantages offered by different brands. The obtained brand information can lead to positive, negative or neutral beliefs about the brand. Positive beliefs represent qualities possessed by the brand and desired by the consumer (e.g. good value), while negative beliefs represent qualities possessed by the brand that are undesirable by the consumer (e.g. bad service).

He formation and/or change of beliefs about brands forms the basis of attitude towards the brand (Fishbein and Ajzen, 1975). Positive consumer beliefs cause an increase in purchasing tendency, and negative beliefs cause the potential consumer to reject the brand (Winchester, Romaniuk, & Bogomolova, 2008). Brand beliefs have a great influence on consumer behavior. Some beliefs about the brand constitute important consumption values. These; perceived brand quality, brand trust, and brand sustainability (Chaudhuri & Holbrook, 2001; Schultz & Block, 2015; Yoo & Donthu, 2001).

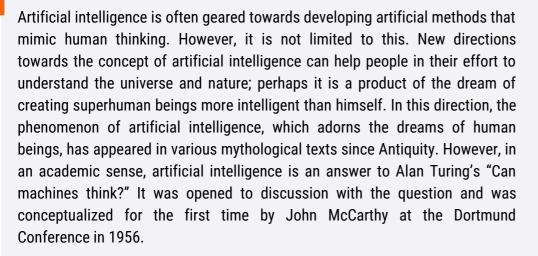

Artificial Intelligence and Media



Today, however, the effects of the significant realization of this dream on our daily life practices, social life, economic and political structuring are discussed. When we refer to the age we live in as the age of artificial intelligence, the age of machines or the algorithmic age, when we look at Mc Luhan's conceptualization of technological determinism, it is natural that this new technology will affect all levels of social systems and that a perestroika will be experienced as a whole. From this point of view, it is thought that the age of artificial intelligence will cause major breaks in the media field.

In other words, the phenomenon of artificial intelligence causes radical changes in the basic building blocks of society - both in cultural and economic dimensions - and the media is also a part of this change. Another important element related to this subject is the studies on artificial intelligence-oriented change and transformation in the fields of "journalism", "radio, television, cinema", "public relations and advertising" and "new media" within the general framework of communication sciences.

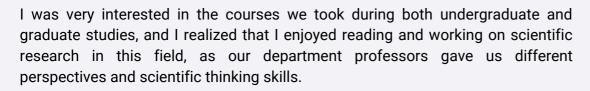


News from Our Alumni

Hello! It is Elis Ercan!

In 2013, I was accepted to the Nutrition and Dietetics undergraduate program at Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), Faculty of Health Sciences. Before the 2015-2016 fall semester, I wanted to take advantage of the double major program that was opened with the guidance of my department professors. I applied to the Faculty of Applied Sciences (UBF), Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department to do a double major and I was accepted.

During my education, thanks to the Erasmus+ program directed by our university, I had the chance to study for one semester at the University of Foggia in Italy in 2015. After getting to know many different cultures, traveling to multiple countries and successfully completing my education there, I came back with all my good memories. Different people from the industry participated in our practice courses, which will be held in parallel with our curriculum. Big Chefs kitchen coordinator Murat Aslan and the author of the book "CHEF" Rafet İnce are few of these names. With the participation of chefs in our practice classes, we met with countless chefs, learned about the working style of the chefs and had the chance to benefit from their experience. After graduating from the Department of Nutrition and Dietetics in 2017, as of 2017, I only took my Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department courses and did my compulsory summer internships. In the summer of 2018, I created an Erasmus+ internship opportunity where I could blend both nutrition and dietetics and gastronomy. During my internship, I was in London for 3 months to provide both gastronomy and nutritionist consultancy to the kitchen coordinators of restaurants on issues such as menu contents and calorie calculations. When I completed my Erasmus internship and returned, with the guidance of my dear professor Ass. Prof. Ismail Hakkı Tekiner; I applied to the Istanbul Gedik University Graduate Education Institute Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Master's program in 2018 to further examine the field of gastronomy with the different perspectives it brings to us in the lessons. As of 2019, I graduated from the Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department, and in February 2022, I graduated from the Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Master's Program with Thesis.

Dear Arzu Özarı Semiz, first of all, we would like to thank you very much for accepting our Istanbul Gelisim University FoAS online Monthly Bulletin interview. First, we would like to ask; What is "Upcycle", can you explain and define it, please?

"Upcycle" can be summarized as creative reuse or transformation that adds value to the old material. It is the process of transforming waste materials, old or unwanted products into new designs of better quality, or into products that are more valuable. One purpose of the upcycling process is to evaluate existing materials and prevent them from being wasted. It raises awareness on efficient use of resources.

In the "recycle" process, the waste materials turn into raw materials, while in the "upcycle" process, the waste material is added to the next level by adding value. Accordingly, "One person's trash is another's treasure" is a phrase adopted by upcyclists.



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Dear Semiz, you have raised very good awareness on a very important issue with the "Upcycle Istanbul" organization. Can you tell us about this organization that held between 4-5 of June 2022? What does Arzu Semiz and Keçi Events mean for all of these?

I am the co-founder of the "Upcycle Istanbul Platform" and a communicator for 28 years. After working as a manager in marketing communication and public relations in corporate companies, I have been providing corporate event management services through my own event agency Keçi Events for 17 years.

I have organized many social responsibility activities in recent years. And during this time, I realized that only socially influential, thought-provoking, transformative contents and cultural & artistic events motivate me. These thoughts intensified in the Covid-19 Pandemic and I took gloves off to launch my own social enterprise.

Sitting at home during the Covid-19 Pandemic, my husband, Ali Semiz, who is an interior designer, begun to craft decorative items from old objects he had collected from flea markets for years or from materials left over from his own work. When an acquaintance of mine said that this process is "uptransformation", I researched for this idea and started to question the following; If "upcycle", that is up transformation, can add value to a no longer used material and raise it to a higher level, is it possible to ensure the upcycling of people with an activity that focuses on upcycle? It's not just the climate crisis but also the pandemic reminded us of the importance of using our resources efficiently. As we rapidly deplete the world's resources, what we all need to do first is to initiate our own transformation. So, how will this transformation be achieved?

I started to think of a theme that would raise people's awareness on the efficient use of resources, make them question themselves, activate them, and inspire them with art and design. I shared this idea with my friend Şebnem Alp Alkın, the founder of Artnivo.com. When the idea hit him, a sustainable art festival with a social impact emerged as a result of our joint efforts; Upcycle Istanbul Art&Design Festival.

While working about the notion of the festival, so many different projects developed about upcycling that we decided not to limit our work only to the festival, but to organize events throughout the year, and we ultimately established the Upcycle Istanbul Platform





Our platform held Turkey's first upcycling festival "Upcycle Istanbul Art & Design Festival" at Museum Gazhane on 4-5 June in 2022.

Within the scope of the festival, the Upcycle Bazaar, which featured installations by artists who give weight to the environmental issues, performance artists, upcycled designs and ecological productions, workshops, talks and concerts took place.

Every detail of the festival was acted with an awareness of environmental friendliness. For example, our concert stage constructed by waste pallets, our stands were made of recycling materials such as cardboard beverage waste, our nameplates were prepared by using textile wastes. Even the musical instruments of the band called Fungistanbul, which gave a concert during the festival, consisted of waste materials.

This sensitive approach made the participants, visitors, and supporters happy. The hope of everyone involved in the festival to become a nature-friendly society and achieve a sustainable life was strengthened.

Where can we individually obtain information about upcycling or craft various productions? Do you have any centers?

Upcycling is a concept that has started to become widespread in our country in the last year. In particular, the textile industry is working more actively in this regard. As consciousness and awareness increased in other sectors, various upcycling projects began to emerge.

Textile is the second most damaging sector to the world... It is also one of the factors that triggers the consumption frenzy the most... Therefore, it is very important to raise awareness of "liable production and liable consumption" and take action.





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In the festival, we tried to raise awareness by organizing a Sustainable Fashion Exhibition in cooperation with 7 universities, and in our workshops by making the participants experience the solutions that can be applied individually at home. Such workshops are repeated at the Museum Gazhane and Hope Alkazar throughout the year...

Dear Semiz, What is your advice to our young students who want to work on Sustainability and Upcycle?

Young people have a lot of responsibility on the matter of sustainability... First of all, I recommend that they research this concept thoroughly. Researching on that, they will see that this matter does not only involve with environmental and climate issues. The United Nations has "Sustainable Development Goals" consisting of total of 17 items covering issues such as ending hunger and poverty, access to quality education, access to health services, gender equality, access to clean water, responsible production, responsible consumption, and justice.... By examining these goals, they can take action on the issue they find closest to them. There are also NGOs and associations operating on these issues, young people can take their first steps by joining these institutions and organizations voluntarily. For example; Upcycle Istanbul Platform also cooperates with young volunteers...
