

STUDENTS SHOWED THEIR SKILLS IN CIVIL AVIATION

“SHY-147 Recognized School Aircraft Structural Exhibition” was organized by Istanbul Gelisim University, Faculty of Applied Sciences. University students introduced their products at the exhibition.

At the exhibition organized by Istanbul Gelisim University, the young people exhibited their handicrafts related to the building materials of airplanes. In the exhibition, in which the Chairman of the Board of Trustees Abdülkadir Gayretli also participated, a plaque was presented to Lect. Mehmet Ateş, from the Faculty of Applied Sciences, Istanbul Gelisim University. Success certificates were also presented to graduates who passed the module exam for the first time among universities in Istanbul. Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin, who made the opening speech of the exhibition, stated that as a university in the field of civil aviation, they will focus on national and internationally funded projects, publications and innovative activities.

“WE WILL CONDUCT NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL PROJECT-BASED WORKS”

Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin: “Our department has made good progress for 7 years. We are among the few schools in Turkey that have received the SHY-147 certificate. Congratulations to all those involved. We are ambitious in aviation. We set our goals accordingly. We are trying to establish the aviation ecosystem in this university. Therefore, our exhibition is very valuable to us. From now on, we will focus on national and international funded projects, publications and innovative activities.”

“OUR UNIVERSITY WILL RISE TO B1 LEVEL”

Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya, Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences: “Our school is at the recognized school level, namely A1 level, stating that the Department of Aircraft Maintenance and Repair provides education in accordance with the YÖK (Council of Higher Education) education program and in the status of a school recognized by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation. All infrastructures for the B1 level have been prepared, the necessary correspondence has been carried out, and an audit will be carried out by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation at the end of this month or next month, and we expect to upgrade to the B1 level as of April.”

“Our first graduates received certificates of success. 5 of our students passed the module exams this year. For the first time, we graduated our students who passed the module exam at our university. This is not only a first for our university, but a first among all state and foundation universities in Istanbul. Our exhibition consists of the products produced by the students of our department during their TASK training last year. It is entirely the work of our students.”

“WE PROVIDE APPLIED TRAINING”

Lect. Mehmet Ateş, who organized the exhibition, made the following statements:

“The standards of aviation are set on an international scale. Our university has a recognized school competency in accordance with these standards. In this context, our students exhibited their handicrafts related to the aircraft structure. In weather conditions, airplanes can be subject to much damage and flexes occur in the fuselage. Due to these flexions, deterioration occurs over time. We try to give our students all the training related to their field. In this regard, they receive one-to-one hands-on training in 38 TASKs, aircraft, classrooms and workshops, which are practical skills resources.”

Lect. Ateş also gave advice to young people considering the aviation profession and added the following: "Aviation is a profession with a high level of material and moral satisfaction. Turks are one of the pioneer nations in aviation. We pursue our training from where our ancestors, who have written their names in Turkish history in aviation, left off. I recommend young people who want to choose the aviation profession to choose universities that are recognized in the selection process and accredited by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation."

UNDERAPPRECIATED FOR 200 YEARS: DEMAND FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLES IS INCREASING

In the "Coffee Talks" series held every week by Istanbul Gelisim University, the subject of "electric vehicles and carbon footprint" was discussed this week. In the event where Lect. Izzet Yavuz from the Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School Electricity Program was a speaker, many topics were evaluated, from the development of electric vehicles to the effects of carbon footprints on the climate.

This week, "electric vehicles and carbon footprint" were discussed at the Coffee Talks event, where the academicians and students of Istanbul Gelisim University, which carried the main theme of "sustainability" to its education curriculum, campuses and social activities, were able to share interactively. The speaker of the event, Lect. Izzet Yavuz, discussed many topics from the development of electric vehicles to the activities that make up a person's carbon footprint.

"INCREASE IN ELECTRIC VEHICLE USE"

Although electric vehicles have been on the agenda in recent years, their history actually dates back to the 1800s. Lect. Izzet Yavuz: "In 1859, the free use of electric vehicles by getting rid of rail systems greatly increased the interest in electric vehicles. However, the fact that petrol-powered vehicles have more intense energy and faster refueling times in the future has reduced the interest in electric vehicles. In recent years, there has been an increase in the use of electric vehicles as a result of environmental pollution, shortage of oil reserves and other economic reasons.

ELECTRIC VEHICLES PRODUCE LESS CARBON FOOTPRINT

Research over the years has confirmed the positive impact of electric vehicles on the environment. According to current analysis, the phase associated with the highest environmental pollution during the life cycle of vehicles is the moment of use. In this respect, electric vehicles outperform other car models, producing a significantly lower carbon footprint. Lect. Izzet Yavuz underlined that the electric car produces up to 50% less CO₂ during its lifetime compared to the diesel car in the European Union countries.

A DEPRESSED MOOD CAN CAUSE ADDICTION, ADDICTIONS CAN CAUSE DEPRESSION!

Istanbul Gelisim University Coordinatorship of Struggling with Addictions brought Mental Health and Diseases Specialist Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nermin Gunduz together with the students as part of the "Technology Addiction" seminar. Stating that there is a dual relationship between depression and addictions, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Gunduz underlined that a depressive mood can cause addiction and addictions can cause depression.

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Coordinatorship of Struggling *with Addictions* organized a "Technology Addiction" seminar to raise awareness about addictions, one of the most significant problems of our time. Prof. Dr. Nuri Kuruoglu, Vice Rector of Istanbul Gelisim University, made the opening speech of the seminar in which Mental Health and Diseases Specialist Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nermin Gunduz participated as a speaker.

“ADDICTIONS AFFECT NOT ONLY THE INDIVIDUAL, BUT ALSO THE SOCIETY THE INDIVIDUAL IS IN”

Treatment and rehabilitative health services are very crucial in addictions, but as health professionals, preventive health services are the priority. Asst. Prof. Dr. Nurten Elkin, Coordinator of Coordinatorship of Struggling with Addictions:

“Within the scope of protective measures, YÖK (The Council of Higher Education) has also created an 'Action Plan to Fight Addictions'. In line with this action plan, we established the "*Coordinatorship of Struggling with Addictions*" in order to protect our students from addictions and to increase their knowledge and awareness about addictions. Addictions reduce the quality of life by causing physical, psychological, social and economic negativities in individuals. Hence, addictions affect not only individuals but also the society in which individuals live.”

“CHILDREN HAVE DIFFICULTY IN THE DISTINCTIVE DIAGNOSIS OF AUTISM BECAUSE OF INTERNET ADDICTION”

The internet and technological developments, which we actively use in every moment of our life, take place in every moment of our daily life. However, these developments, which brought with them many negativities, caused "technology and internet addiction", which has become one of the most important problems of today. Addictions cause multidimensional health problems. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nermin Gunduz, Mental Health and Diseases Specialist stated the following:

“Especially in children and adolescents, when the internet is not used correctly and carefully and is not supervised, it can cause a lot of negativity in terms of duration and content. The use of social media can cause many problems, not only for children and adolescents, but also for adults in the family. At the same time, due to internet addiction, the differential diagnosis of autism in children is difficult. It should not be forgotten that addiction to gambling in the virtual environment is an increasing problem and that it can lead to suicides.
