"GENERATION Z, FUTURE SCIENTISTS, MANUFACTURERS AND LEADERS"

Making statements after the seminar, Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Dr. Nail Öztaş said that as a university, they organize training and information seminars for the Generation Z with various activities all over Turkey. Rector Öztaş said, "Our university organizes various activities in cooperation with private schools in various provinces of our country within the framework of beneficial development for the society. In the activity we organize today, one of our school's staff, Aslıhan, talked with our counsellors and administrators about the Generation Z. This generation is a generation that is mentioned a lot. This is a generation that we have not yet defined and from which very big changes are expected. We need to get to know them who will be the producers, consumers, leaders and scientists of the future. The world they will live in will be differentiated by their mode of production. It will differ with their educational habits. "The more we understand and know these young people, the better we will have the opportunity to prepare them for that future."

Speaking at the seminar, Lecturer from Istanbul Gelisim University Aslıhan Selçuk said, "We talked about the Generation Z in our seminar. Those who were born in 1995 and after are called Generation Z. Because this generation has different dynamics, their view of life is totally different from ours. They have different

characteristics. They are a little against authority, transparent and truthful. They defend their rights, but they are also very serious social media consumers. It is important to understand the Generation Z in this sense and to learn from our counsellor teachers. We talked about how we can communicate with this generation and how we can bring it together. It was a very productive training.”

'HIGH SCHOOL WINTER ACADEMY' FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS BEGINS

Istanbul Gelisim University announced that the 'High School Winter Academy' will be held this year between January 24 and February 4, both face-to-face and online.

THE 4TH TURKEY SPORTS SUMMIT HELD

The 4th Turkey Sports Summit was held with the theme of "Sustainable Future in Sports Sciences" in cooperation with Istanbul Gelisim University School of Physical Education and Sports and Sports Policies Association (SPOLDER).

Sessions titled 'Women are Strong Together: Those Who Succeed with Sports' and 'The Future of Sports Investments in the 21st century' were held at the summit, starting with the World FairPlay Cartoon and Photograph Exhibition of the Turkish National Olympic Committee and organized by Istanbul Gelisim University and Sports Policies Association. An award ceremony was also held at the end of the summit. While Turkish National Paralympic athletes Zübeyde Süpürgeci, Hamide Doğangün and Büşra Ün were awarded for their achievements. Among the awardees were Turkish National Football Team Manager Hamit Altıntop and Turkish Basketball Federation General Coordinator Ömer Onan, who attended the summit as speakers. Önder Özen received the Sports Commentator of the Year Award.

"AS WOMEN WE ARE DOING A GOOD JOB"

Professional tennis player İpek Öz, who received an award at the summit, said that such events would be beneficial for Turkish sports and added, "It was a very enjoyable and beautiful day. I hope I will be here again next year and be able to speak."

Expressing that women are not in the place they deserve in sports, but they achieve remarkable things as women, Öz said, "I hope we can get to the place we really deserve in the near future."

She said that her goal is to participate in the Grand Slams, which are the important tournaments of tennis, and to be in the top 100 and rank firsts.

"GIRLS CAN ACHIEVE ANYTHING, AS LONG AS THEY WANT"

Returning with a gold medal from the Para Athletics European Championship held in Poland in June, Zübeyde Süpürgeci expressed that she was very happy for the

award she received at the 4th Sports Summit and that the sport they did was difficult. Sprgeci said, "I would like to thank Istanbul Gelisim University for crowning our success by making us worthy of this award."

Emphasizing that "Girls can achieve anything, as long as they want to" for girls who want to be involved in sports, Sprgeci said, "Of course, our life is very difficult in every field, but as women, we can overcome this difficulty. Let's believe in ourselves."

Sprgeci said about her next goal, "I want to be the first in the 2022 World Championships in Japan and then become the champion in the Paris 2024 Paralympics."

"WE SHOW WE CAN DO GREAT THINGS WHEN WE ARE GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY"

Paralympic athlete Hamide Doangn, who came fifth in Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games and received an award at the 4th Sports Summit, is very happy to receive an award and her next goal is to be ranked in the 2024 Paralympics to be held in Paris and represent Turkey in the best way possible.

Speaking about girls who want to progress in sports but face different obstacles, Doangn said, "We show that we will do great things when given the opportunity. I want them to be given the opportunity and see what we can do."

"I WANT TO REPRESENT MY COUNTRY IN THE BEST WAY AND WAVE THE FLAG"

Bra n, the first Turkish female tennis player to participate in the Paralympic Games, stated that the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games held last year were very bumpy, intense and tiring. It's really an honor to be here."

Stating that her goal is to always be able to do better, n said, "I don't know what will change or what will happen in this process. I want to represent my country in the best possible way and wave the flag."

Noting that female athletes don't have to follow the stereotypes, n said, "They can do whatever they want, whatever branch they want. They can be successful in whatever they want after giving their due and working hard. Keep working."

“CROWNING ACHIEVEMENTS ENCOURAGES PEOPLE”

Serap Özçelik Arapoğlu, who represented Turkey at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, where karate took part for the first time, and won the World and European Championship, said, “I am really happy. Crowning achievements encourages people. In this way, we can take more solid steps towards our future goals. This has been an incentive for me. I hope I can do better.”

Arapoğlu stated that her next goal is to be successful in the European championship.

STUDENTS DESIGN CAT AND DOG HOUSES FOR STRAY ANIMALS

University students, who want to draw attention to the shelter needs of animals with their social responsibility project titled “Together in Our Living Spaces: Let's Design Cat & Dog Houses Around Us!”, designed cat and dog houses.

Inspiring from the idea of how to improve the situation of cat and dog houses they see in their neighbourhood, university students made brand new designs. It is planned that the designs, which are made by considering the environmental conditions and the ergonomic conditions of cats and dogs, will be produced from materials that are suitable for the physical conditions of the context and will not harm the environment.

ENVIRONMENTALLY RESISTANT FOOD CONTAINERS DESIGNED

Providing information about the project process, Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Faculty of Fine Arts, Head of the Department of Interior Architecture and Environmental Design Asst. Prof. Zerrin Funda Ürük said, “Replace the food containers that are damaged by external factors around our living spaces or the materials used as food bowls, with environmentally resistant and functional food containers. We wanted to make it easier for our friends to meet their food and beverage needs with its design and to draw attention to this in our living spaces.”
