APPLICATIONS FOR THE STORY COMPETITION ON YUNUS EMRE STARTED

Applications for the short story contest titled "Living Like Yunus in the 21st Century: Tolerance, Dedication, Patience, Love" have started. All short stories to be written with the themes of "tolerance, patience, self-sacrifice and love" from Yunus Emre's teachings are accepted within the scope of the competition.

Due to the 700th anniversary of his death, 2021 has been declared as the year of commemoration of Yunus Emre by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). With the Presidential circular, it has been decided that 2021 is the Year of Yunus Emre and Turkish language.

Istanbul Gelisim University, Faculty of Economics, Administrative and Social Sciences, Turkish Language and Literature Department organizes a short story competition, which makes students think about how to live by taking Yunus Emre as a guide during the global epidemic.

THEMES: RESPECT, PATIENCE AND SELF-SACRIFICE

Short stories to be written on the themes of "tolerance, patience, self-sacrifice and love" from Yunus Emre's teachings, one of the cornerstones of Turkish language and civilization, are accepted within the scope of the competition. The competition will be open to 12th grade students of secondary education institutions who apply with their school IDs.

In the written statement made by the university, the following words were emphasized about the competition:

"We chose the short story as the literary genre. Standing out in contemporary literature, the short story requires using words economically in number and rich in meaning. Another aspect of Yunus Emre that stands out as a poet is his mastery in the art of concise speech, which is called Sehl-i mümteni, which seems easy but is difficult when trying to apply. The experience of writing short stories will be useful in understanding Yunus Emre in this context as well." The deadline for submission of stories is September 30, and applications are made via the university's website. The winners of the competition will be rewarded with cash prizes.

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GÖKKUŞAĞI COLLEGE GRADUATES IB STUDENTS FOR THE FIFTH TIME

Graduating its first Turkish and foreign students group in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program in 2017, Gökkuşağı College held the 5th International Baccalaureate (IB) graduation ceremony.

The graduation ceremony held at Gökkuşağı College Bahçelievler Campus started with a moment of silence and the singing of the National Anthem. The opening speech of the ceremony was made by the Chairman of the Board of Gökkuşağı College, Abdülkadir Gayretli. This year, girls ranked the first, second and third places in the school, which happened for the first time.

Abdülkadir Gayretli said, "The happiest days of families are the days when they see their children's graduation. They have graduated from the world's most prestigious high school diploma program and will be accepted into the world's prestigious universities. Thanks to the International Baccalaureate (IB) program, students who continue their education journey at universities such as King's College London, Birmingham University, Polytecnico di Torino, IFA Paris have no trouble getting admissions from universities like Manchester, King's College, Durham, KU Leuven, Kanada British Columbia, City University of London, Edinburgh, Queens, Lincoln, York, Essex."

"After the former graduates who achieved a maximum of 41 IB points, there are students who expect 43 IB points this year" said Abdülkadir Gayretli, who stated that the 5th IB graduates, consisting of 20 students, are waiting for the IB scores to be announced two weeks later, and continued:

"The International Baccalaureate (IB) program, which functions as a preuniversity program, brings students to university life, learning and working skills expected at university, and the ability to conduct scientific and academic research, while educating young people with high foreign language skills. Adopting the principle of a balanced life, IB directs its students to art, music, sports and activities, while raising sensitive young people who worry about global and local problems and seek solutions through community service activities. The system, which integrates critical thinking skills into all courses, allows students to gain a broad perspective and reach a rich cultural perspective."

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ADVICE FOR UNIVERSITY CANDIDATES: CHOOSE THE PROFESSION THAT WILL MAKE YOU HAPPY FOR LIFE

The university exam marathon, which lasted for two days, is over. Candidates are now waiting for the YKS results to be announced on August 4. Making suggestions to the candidates for the next period, Counseling Specialist Elif Aluç Gülşen stated that the departments should be started to be researched. Gülşen said, "Candidates should invest in themselves and choose the departments that are suitable for them. They should do the jobs that will make them happy for the rest of their lives."

Stating that university promotions will be carried out online due to the coronavirus epidemic, from Istanbul Gelisim University Guidance Specialist Elif Aluç Gülşen said, "Candidate students can communicate with the lecturers of the departments they are interested in during the promotional days broadcast live on the social media accounts of the universities."

Gülşen said, "With the promotion days of the universities, information is given about the departments of the universities, foreign language opportunities, accommodation and scholarship opportunities, social, cultural, sports activities, life on campus and academics."

"PREFER WHAT SUITS YOU BEST"



Stating that the candidates usually approach to this preference by asking "Which departments will be the most advantageous?", Gülşen said, "Ideas such as choosing the department that currently has job opportunities are not correct in the long run. A profession that is popular for a few years may lose its popularity after a few years. Candidates should invest in themselves and choose the departments that suit them. They should do the jobs that will make them happy for the rest of their lives."

"WIDE RANGE OF CHOICES IS BETTER"

Emphasizing that the candidates should make a wide range of choices since they have the right of 24 choices, Gülşen said, "Candidates need to evaluate the first 5 choices well when creating their preference lists. It is useful to contact universities as much as possible to get information about the possibilities of universities and to get support from experts if they do not have experience of choice."

The Ayasuluk Hill and St. Jean Monument excavations that will be attended by the expert researchers from Istanbul University, Akdeniz University, Ege University, 9 Eylül University and Manisa Celal Bayar University will begin on July 4.

The 2021 excavations will be carried out in the Basilica where the Gospel Writer St. John is believed to have written the Bible, around and inside the Hagia Sophia and the contemporary church, where St. John's grave monument is located.
