HISTORY

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School started education with 9 programs in 2008 and became a school that forms the main core of Gelisim University. It has grown and developed in a period of 10 years, reaching 19 departments, 37 programs and 9.321 students. In 21 of 37 programs, evening instruction is carried out.

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School continues its educational activities with its experienced and strong academic staff. In addition to the permanent academic staff, the leading names of the sector are employed part-time, providing the students the opportunity to learn their practical experience in business life.

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School, that has moved to its new campus as of the Fall Term of the 2017–2018 Academic Year, offers a field of application with a total of 22 workshops, mainly Aircraft Maintenance Workshops, Mock-Up, Kitchen, Electricity, Construction, Automotive, Serigraphy, Ceramics and fashion workshops and 7 Computer Laboratories one of which is MAC in its new campus so that students can apply their theoretical education practically.

Our School's Aircraft Technology Program has the School Approval Certificate recognized by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), as well as the Flight Operations Specialist Training (Dispatcher) Authorization Certificate from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation.

Apart from our two programs with Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) authority, licensing processes for the "Certified Cabin Crew Basic Training Establishment Certificate" for Civil Aviation Cabin Services Turkish and English Programs and "Certified Ground Handling Training Establishment Certificate" for Civil Aviation Transport Management Turkish and English Programs at Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) are continuing.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Each academic year consists of two terms, fall and spring. Each semester includes a 14-week educational process. Mid-term exams are held in the middle of the 14-week process, and final exams and make-up exams are held at the end. Important issues such as course selection and final enrollment, add and drop courses, applications for double major and minor programs, summer school enrollment and training, and exemption exams take place on certain dates within the scope of the academic calendar. No action can be taken on related matters outside of the specified dates. Therefore, it is very important to follow the academic calendar.



ELECTIVE AND COMPULSORY COURSES

- Compulsory courses: Refers to the courses that the student has to take.
- <u>Elective Courses:</u> It refers to the courses that the students can take among the courses specified
 in the curriculum. These courses will be displayed as "Departmental Elective and NonDepartmental Elective course pool" when choosing courses on your OBIS account.

COURSE SELECTION


Student Information System (OBIS) is the information service offered to our students at our university. Almost all the transactions that our students perform in the student affairs office can be performed through this system. In order to enter the OBIS system, you need to obtain information such as "Username", "Password" from The Directorate of Student Affairs which you are affiliated to. Course selection procedures are going through OBIS. In the meantime, there are Compulsory courses offered to you and elective courses separated as Non-Departmental Elective and Department Elective. By choosing these courses, you will be able to select courses within the framework of the required ECTS credits. Click to access OBIS.

EXAMS

Exams are held face-to-face during the Midterm and Final weeks, which are stated in the Academic Calendar. If you cannot attend the midterm exams due to health reasons, you can request an Additional Midterm Exam by sending the report which you received from a full-fledged state hospital to myo@gelisim.edu.tr. If you encounter a similar situation in the final exams, you can compensate for the final exam by taking the make-up exam.

Students who cannot attend the midterm exams due to their health situation apply to the relevant secretarial within one week following the exam date, with a petition stating their excuses and their reports from state hospitals. Students whose reports are accepted by the relevant Administrative Board can take the additional exam between the dates specified in the academic calendar. A second make-up exam is not allowed for make-up exams.

GRADING SYSTEM

The final grade of a course is calculated by adding 50% of the grade received from the semester studies of that course and 50% of the grade received from the final exams on the condition of getting at least 40 points. For the course taken below 40 points in the final exams, FF letter grade is given.

Students who successfully complete the course/courses corresponding to each module in the associate degree education programs (Aircraft Technology and Flight Operations Management), which are given the authority and responsibility of the school recognized by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), are given the right to enter the Recognized School Graduation Certificate Module exams. Those students who get at least 75 out of 100 or BB letter grades in each of the module exams are given a Recognized School Graduation Certificate in addition to their diplomas upon graduation.

Students who successfully complete the courses corresponding to each module in the Flight Operations Management Associate Degree authorized by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) are given the right to take the Flight Operations Specialist Basic Training Certificate Module exams. Those students who get a letter grade of at least 75 out of 100 or BB in each of the module exams are given a Flight Operations Specialist Basic Training Certificate in addition to their diplomas upon graduation. SUCCESS EVALUATION

For each course students take, one of the following letter grades is assigned by the instructor as the end-of-term course grade. The grades shown in the transcript out of 100 are indicated in the image on the right. Grades not included in the average are:

- G (Pass) grade; it is given to students who are successful in non-credit courses in educational programs.
- K (Fail) grade; it is given to students who fail the non-credit courses available in the curriculum.
- D (Absent) grade; it is given to students who fail because they cannot meet their obligations regarding course attendance or course practices. D grade is treated as an FF grade in the GPA account.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS SCHOLARSHIP

Istanbul Gelisim University rewards our successful students with Success Scholarships during their education. In addition, successful students with insufficient financial situation are provided with scholarship opportunities at the rate determined by the Board of Overseers.

DOUBLE MAJOR PROGRAMS (DMP)

The aim of the double major program is to enable students who carry out their major programs with outstanding success to study at the same time by receiving a diploma free of charge in a second department. Students with an overall GPA of 2,72 out of 4,00 in the major program and who have achieved 20% success in the undergraduate/associate degree program can apply for the second major diploma program free of charge. They can register if application resulted positively.

INTERNSHIP

Internship is the period of developing professional skills by learning practically. Internship application and process are as follows:

- Student -> Forms and Documents -> Summer Internship Form (The form should be filled in the computer environment.). To reach the form <u>click</u>.
- The completed form must have an ink signature and stamp by the institution where the internship is performed.
- out completely by the intern student should be sent to myostaj@gelisim.edu.tr. Students should use their xxxxxxx@ogr.gelisim.edu.tr university mail address while sending mails (If you cannot access to your university mail account, click for information.) The internship application form must be sent to the determined e-mail address no later than 10 days before the determined internship start date.
- Students who are approved eligible for internship should perform their internship in the relevant dates. During the internship period, the training record book must be filled out by the student as required.
- Students who have completed their internship must hand over their record books to their internship coordinator teachers.



SUMMER SCHOOL

In the summer school, students can take the courses that they have never taken in the previous terms, they can take courses that they took in the past but missed the final exam or failed, or they can take courses to increase their grade point average (GPA).


GRADUATION

Students who have been successful in all the courses shown in the curriculum, have GPA at least 2.00 and have met the graduation requirement, are given a bachelor's or associate's degree diploma and a diploma supplement. Certificates of those who are entitled to receive high honor and honor certificates are also given with their diplomas.

Students who are entitled to receive a diploma must obtain a discharged certificate from the relevant units to receive their diploma.







HEALTH

INFIRMARY AND HEALTH SERVICES

Except for the infirmary located on the campus of Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School and serving with experienced health personnel between 08:30 and 22:00, our students can receive health services from the infirmaries located in all campuses of our universities, including the Rectorate Building.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING UNIT

Counselling service is the unit where students can consult and get support for their needs. Istanbul Gelisim University aims to support the individual, social and academic development of its students throughout their university life. Erasmus+ Program is the EU's grant program in the fields of education, youth and sports. It supports education, training, internship, professional development, non-formal learning-based youth activities and cooperation between institutions abroad.


There may be differences in the application requirements for each academic year. For this reason, the current conditions are stated in the announcement text of that academic year. However, the general principles are as follows:

- The student must be at least a second-year student at the time of participation in the program & have at least 30 ECTS equivalent courses before graduation.
- Grade Point Average (GPA) must be at least 2.20/4.00 at Associate's/Bachelor's level.

Note: Students who will participate in the mobility must be full-time and have a course load that can follow 30 ECTS credits for the semester they will study.

- <u>Study Mobility:</u> This opportunity allows students to get education and training in another country. <u>Click</u> for detailed information.
- Internship Mobility: This opportunity gives students the opportunity to do an internship or gain work experience abroad. All students can benefit from Erasmus+ Internship Mobility. Students who will be placed within the scope of Internship Mobility have the right to do internship for a minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 12 months. SECRETARIAT OF VOCATIONAL SCHOOL

Vocational School secretariat is the administrative unit employed to take the necessary precautions for the effective, efficient, and compatible work of the members of the administrative organization within the framework of the legal regulations, to plan, coordinate and organize administrative activities, to supervise, and to assist the unit managers in administrative and technical matters.

There are total of 170 academicians, including 14 assistant professor and 156 lecturers, working within the Istanbul Gelisim University Vocational School. In the Vocational School, the 'Program Heads' of all programs are the academic advisors of the students. The advisor lecturer provides support in all matters related to the adaptation process of the student to the university and the program student is enrolled in, learning and maintaining the operation. The advisor lecturer registration gives support to students about many issues such as adding and dropping courses, vertical and lateral transfer, scholarships, double major opportunities, internship processes, student clubs, etc.

LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (LMS)

LMS is a set of web-based applications created for online education, where course materials (such as videos, documents, announcements) are shared and reports are made, established to increase the efficiency of training with the distance education system.

LMS works in sync with OBIS for students and PERSIS for instructors. Through LMS, students can easily access course documents, asynchronous course videos, synchronous live lessons, online exams and homework submission.

Our students can log in to LMS using their nine-digit student numbers and OBIS passwords as usernames.



STUDENT INFORMATION SYSTEM (OBIS)

Our students can reach class-term, ECTS and general academic average information, can easily add-drop, withdraw from courses, see the transcript and compulsory courses to be taken for graduation, learn the exam schedule, access the course schedule, communicate with their advisor. It is a system that they can pass through.


Our students register for the courses by choosing the courses they will take for that semester from the OBIS automation program on the dates determined in the academic calendar. In our university, the first week of each semester is the week of adding, dropping and withdrawing from courses. During this period, our students can drop some of their registered courses and add new ones.

Our students can log in to OBIS by using their nine-digit student number as their username and their OBIS password. In order to enter the OBIS system, you must obtain information such as user name and password from the Registrar's Office to which you are affiliated.




ORIENTATION MEETINGS

Orientation meetings are the meetings organized by the department chair to provide general information about the department and university life for the first year of universities. According to the academic day, it trains the education schools and the student before the first week.

Erasmus+ program learning mobility activity is the realization of a part of the education of a student enrolled in a higher education institution (Turkish citizen and non-Turkish citizen) in a higher education institution abroad that is partnered by bilateral agreement. The activity period covers a period between 3 and 12 months, which can be completed within the same academic year. All students who meet the Erasmus+ application requirements can benefit from the program.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE COURSES

Our curricula are prepared for the development of foreign language education of our students. Basic foreign language courses can be selected in the 1st and 2nd semesters and vocational foreign language courses can be selected in the 3rd and 4th semesters. Foreign Language courses are carried out by instructors who are experts in their fields.





ENGLISH COURSE

As Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School; One of the activities we continue with the aim of increasing the human equipment of our students within the framework of the vision of continuous development is our vocational English courses. In the courses planned to start as of the second week of April; It is aimed to provide an education based on social sciences and natural sciences. Participation in the courses is completely free. In the courses that take place, it is desired to reinforce the basic English knowledge of our students by working on the English texts specific to the fields. DGS COURSE

In our free Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS) course, we cover topics related to DGS, especially basic mathematics and geometry. In the 2021-2022 Academic Year, 84 regular education and 130 second education second year students from a total of 34 different programs of Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School were enrolled in our course, which can be followed by distance education.



LIBRARIES

In the campus of Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School, students are provided with the opportunity to study and do research with 1 library and 1 reading room. Within the library, there is a computer infrastructure that allows students to search both the academic research sites of the university that they have membership online and the general web search with the internet infrastructure. In addition, thanks to the free wi-fi network in the library, students have the opportunity to conduct research by providing internet access through their own computers with their student numbers and system passwords.

The reference books in our library are updated at the beginning of each semester with the advice of the instructors and up-to-date resources are offered for the students. 

IGU Four Awarenesses

Emphasizing the importance it attaches to the development of its students with the slogan "Be Open to Development", Istanbul Gelisim University combined the advantages it offers to its students under the title of "four awarenesses".

- o Istanbul Gelisim University encourages undergraduate and associate degree students studying in Turkish programs to improve their foreign languages. If students have obtained at least 70 points by taking the YDS and YÖKDİL exams at the end of the foreign language courses they have attended, the fee they pay for the course is covered by IGU.
- The round-trip flight tickets of the students who will go abroad with their own means for language education are covered by IGU.
- Istanbul Gelisim University gives full support to the projects that students want to implement with the "I Have an Idea" program.
- IGU encourages its graduate students to establish their own workplaces.
 The office furniture of the graduate students who start their own business is covered by the university.





ETHICAL AND DISCIPLINARY RULES

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES THAT STUDENTS CAN RECEIVE

Reprimand: It is the condemnation of the student by written notification. A punishment of reprimand is taken in line with issues such as giving the information requested by the authorities of the institution incompletely or incorrectly, disrupting the operation of the works such as lectures, seminars, applications, conferences, and attempting to copy.

Warning: It is the written warning of the student to be more careful in the said behavior.

Suspension from the Higher Education Institution from One Week to One Month: The student receives a suspension from the university within this period; it is the written notification that he/she will not be able to attend the courses and exams during this period.

One Semester Suspension from the Higher Education Institution: It is the written notification that the student will not be able to benefit from the student rights for one semester. A semester suspension is taken in line with issues such as cheating or having it taken, plagiarizing in thesis, seminars and publications, threatening or actually attacking the staff or students of the institution.

Two Semester Suspension from the Higher Education Institution: It is the written notification that the student will not be able to benefit from the student rights for two semesters.

Dismissal from the Higher Education Institution: It is the written notification that the student has been removed from the higher education institution in order not to be taken again.

Scholarship Cancellation

In order for the scholarship of a student studying in the faculties or colleges of the university with a scholarship to continue;

- Has not taken any disciplinary action,
- Except for the preparatory class, the student must not exceed the normal period of study.

All scholarships of a student who has been disciplined are deducted from the date of finalization of the disciplinary action.

HOW TO ENTER OBIS AUTOMATION PROGRAM?

You can log in with your student number and password given to you from student affairs by logging in to http://obis.gelisim.edu.tr/login.aspx from your web browser. If you are logging into the system for the first time, change your password.

HOW TO RENEW RECORDS?

Students choose the courses they will take for that semester from the OBIS automation program on the dates determined in the academic calendar and enroll in the courses by having them approved by their advisors. The petition to take a course is printed out on the automation system and signed and a copy is delivered to the student by the advisor.

HOW TO ADD - DROP - WITHDRAW FROM A COURSE?

The first week of each semester is the week of adding, dropping and withdrawing courses. During this period, students can drop some of the courses they are enrolled in and add new ones with the approval of their advisors.

WHO IS THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR AT OUR UNIVERSITY?

Every semester, starting from the first year, the head of the relevant program guides every student registered at our university in examining the courses chosen by the student, checking the eligibility, approving the add, drop and withdrawal processes, and conduct the internship procedures.



HOW TO GET A STUDENT IDENTITY CARD, WHERE TO USE IT, WHAT TO DO IF LOST?

Student ID cards are issued by the Registrar's Office after the registration process for our students who have the right to enroll in our university. A student ID card with a photo and valid for 1 year is given to the students who register or renew their registration at our university, by the Registrar's Office for the purpose of entering our university and benefiting from the opportunities of our university. In case of loss, the Registrar's Office should be informed as soon as possible.

WHAT IS A TRAVEL CARD, WHERE IS IT USED?

It is a discounted transportation card used in public transportation vehicles affiliated to the Metropolitan Municipality within the borders of Istanbul. The fee will be automatically deducted from the card after the student tops up the card.

WHAT IS A STUDENT CERTIFICATE, WHERE IS IT USED, HOW TO GET IT?

The student certificate is the document that shows that the students enrolled in our university continue their studies. It can be arranged to be given to any institution based on the demands of our students. It can be obtained from the Registrar's Office or from the Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School secretariat.



WHAT IS A TRANSCRIPT, HOW TO GET IT, WHERE TO USE IT?

Transcript is the grade status document showing the final success status, semester and overall grade point averages of all the courses that the student has registered until the relevant date. It can be obtained from the Registrar's Office or the Vocational School secretariat. The student requests the transcript via OBIS and then receives the document from the secretariat. It can be arranged to be given to any institution upon the request of the student.

HOW AND IN WHICH SITUATIONS ARE MILITARY SERVICE PROCEDURES PERFORMED?

The information of the students who are registered to our university, which is transferred daily to the higher education information system, is shared with the military branches. Branches follow your school status here.

HOW TO UPDATE STUDENT INFORMATION?

If there has been a change in their contact information, our students can update their information by personally submitting a petition to the Registrar's Office or by logging into the student information system (OBIS).



HOW ARE STUDENT GRADES, EXAMS AND SUCCESS DETERMINED?

The passing grade of a course is calculated by adding 50% of the grade received from the semester studies of that course and 50% of the grade obtained from the final exams (provided that at least 40 points are obtained). A letter grade of FF is given for the course taken below 40 points in the final exams. (IGU Examination Regulations, Chapter 4, Article: 23). Students who successfully complete the course/courses corresponding to each module in the associate degree education programs (Aircraft Technology and Flight Operations Management) recognized by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation (DGCA), are given the right to take the recognized school graduation certificate module exams. Those students who get at least 75 out of 100 or BB letter grades in each of the module exams are given a Recognized School Graduation Certificate in addition to their diplomas upon graduation. Students who successfully complete the courses corresponding to each module in the flight operations management associate degree curriculum authorized by the General Directorate of Civil Aviation (DGCA) are given the right to take the flight operations specialist basic training certificate module exams. Those students who get a letter grade of at least 75 out of 100 or BB in each of the module exams are given a Flight Operations Specialist Basic Training Certificate in addition to their diplomas upon graduation. You can also examine the grade success points and equivalences in Chapter 4 and the grades section of the regulation. Click for regulations.

HOW CAN I APPLY FOR THE DOUBLE MAJOR PROGRAM?

The purpose of the Double Major program is to enable students who successfully carry out their major programs to receive a free diploma in a second branch at the same time. Students who have a cumulative grade point average of 2.72 out of 4.00 in their major program and who are in the 20% success rate in their undergraduate/associate degree program can apply for the second major diploma program free of charge. As a result of the positive result, they can register.



HOW ARE THE SUCCESS GRADES?

For each course students take, one of the following letter grades is appreciated by the lecturer as the end-of-term course grade.

The grades shown in the transcript out of 100 are as follows:

Grades not included in the average are:

- G (Pass) grade; It is given to students who are successful in noncredit courses in the curriculum.
- K (Fail) grade; It is given to students who fail the non-credit courses in the curriculum.
- Grade D (Unattended); It is given to students who are unsuccessful because they cannot fulfill their obligations regarding course attendance or course applications. D grade is treated like FF grade in GPA calculation.

DO STUDENTS HAVE TO ATTEND CLASSES, PRACTICES, AND EXAMS?

The attendance requirement is at least 70% (for theoretical courses) and at least 80% (for applied courses) of the total education period in that semester. A student who does not fulfill the attendance obligation of a course for any reason, including suspension from the university due to a report or disciplinary penalty, is considered unsuccessful in that course. With the approval of the Rectorate, the absences of students who participate in meetings, sports, arts or similar activities on behalf of the University or Turkey are not taken into account on these activity days. Module exams for our DGCA approved programs (Aircraft Technology and Flight Operations Management) vary. Click to access the regulation.

I MISSED MY EXAM, WHAT CAN I DO?

Students who cannot attend the midterm exams due to their illness apply to the relevant secretariat within one week following the exam date, with a petition stating their excuses and their reports from state hospitals. Students whose reports are accepted by the relevant administrative board use their exam rights between the dates specified in the academic calendar. A second make-up exam is not allowed for make-up exams.



IS THE HEALTH REPORT VALID FOR MY ABSENCE?

Absences of students who participate in meetings, sports, arts or similar activities on behalf of the university or Turkey, with the approval of the Rectorate, are not taken into account. Apart from this, no excuses are accepted for attendance, including a medical report.

DO I HAVE THE RIGHT TO OBJECT TO THE EXAM RESULT?

Students can object to the exam results within one week from the announcement of the grades. The objection is made with a petition given to student affairs. If a material error is detected as a result of the examination made by the relevant lecturer, this error is corrected. If it is understood that there is no material error, the situation is processed by the lecturer on the petition and the result is reported to the relevant student. Objections are finalized within fifteen days at the latest from the acceptance date of the student's objection petition.

WHAT SHOULD I CONSIDER WHILE MAKING COURSE SELECTIONS?

Course registration must be done on the dates specified in the academic calendar. First of all, the previously failed courses are taken. The course registration form must be approved by the advisor. If the compulsory courses overlap with another course, even partially, these courses cannot be taken. In case of overlapping, the first course to be taken is the previously failed one.

WHICH HEALTH REPORT IS VALID?

It is valid if it is taken from a full-fledged state hospital.



WHAT SHOULD MY GPA BE IN ORDER TO GRADUATE?

Students who have been successful in all the courses shown in the curriculum, have increased their GPA to at least 2.00 and have met the graduation requirement, are given a bachelor's or associate's degree diploma and a diploma supplement. Certificates of those who are entitled to receive high honor and honor certificates are also given with their diplomas. Students who are entitled to receive a diploma must obtain a dismissal certificate from the relevant units in order to receive their diploma.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T REGISTER FOR A COURSE?

Students who do not register for courses at the beginning of the semester cannot take classes and exams that semester and cannot benefit from their student rights. This period is counted from the student's education period.

CAN I FREEZE REGISTRATION?

If the student applies for justified and valid reasons within thirty days at the latest from the beginning of the academic year, he/she can freeze his/her registration for two semesters in associate degree education and maximum four semesters in undergraduate education with the decision of the relevant administrative board.

Registration may also be frozen during the semester for reasons that the student will declare as an excuse, such as illness, natural disasters, detention, economic reasons, conviction and the abolition of military service suspension.

In case the registration is frozen due to the reasons stated in the second paragraph, the student must apply to the Registrar's Office within twenty days at the latest and prove the incident with the necessary documents. If the aforementioned reasons continue, the registration freeze period may be extended by the relevant board of directors.

The student who freezes the registration cannot attend the classes and cannot take the exams. In case of registration freeze, 20% of the tuition fee for the frozen semesters must be paid.



WHAT ARE THE SINGLE COURSE EXAM CONDITIONS?

Students who have fulfilled the exam requirement for graduation, but have failed in a single course with an FF, can take the single course exam for this course at the end of the semester they fail, if they apply with a petition. The success grade of the students who take the single course exam is determined only according to the score they get in the single course exam, without considering the scores obtained from the activities during the semester.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE SINGLE COURSE EXAM?

If the student wishes to take a single course exam during the semester, he/she is obliged to register for the course. If the course is outside of the semester, a single course exam can be taken without registering for the course. Students can take the exam on the date of the Single Course Exam in the academic calendar by applying to the relevant Dean's Office/Directorate secretariat on the application dates specified in the academic calendar.

IS ABSENTEEISM VALID FOR BOTH MIDTERM AND FINAL EXAMS?

Losing the right to take the exam due to absenteeism is valid only for the final and make-up exams.

WHAT WAY SHOULD I FOLLOW FOR THE MANDATORY SUMMER INTERNSHIP?

The internship process is as follows:

- o Determining the internship place
- o Determining the start and end dates of the internship
- Filling the internship application form
- Filling the internship book
- Receiving the internship book
- Finalizing the internship procedures



INTERNSHIP APPLICATION IS AS FOLLOWS:

Internship is the period of developing professional skills by learning practically. Internship application and process are as follows:

- The form can be accessed by following the Student -> Form and Documents -> Summer Internship Form. The form must be filled in on the computer (<u>Click</u> to access the form).
- The completed form must be stamped with a wet signature by the institution where the internship is held. The student must also sign his wet signature.
- The form will be filled in completely by the intern and sent to myostaj@gelisim.edu.tr e-mail address. When sending an e-mail, use your university e-mail address with the extension xxxxxxxx@ogr.gelisim.edu.tr. (If you cannot access your university e-mail address, click for information.) Internship application form must be sent to the specified e-mail address at the latest 10 days before the determined internship start date.
- Students who are deemed appropriate to do internships do their internship within the relevant date range. During the internship period, the internship book should be filled in as desired by the student.
- Students who have completed their internship are required to submit their notebooks to the internship coordinator instructors.

HOW CAN I DO AN ERASMUS?
