


Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Ranking 2022, the ranking institution of world universities, has been announced. Among the 1180 universities in the world, Istanbul Gelişim University (IGU) increased its success ranking, which was 24 last year, to 16th place in the category of "Quality Education" by increasing 8 steps this year. It continued to maintain its success last year, ranking 1st among Turkish universities.

The success of Istanbul Gelişim University (IGU) was ranked in five different categories in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, in the list of 1406 universities, which are listed in the 2022 ranking of the UK-based, world's leading higher education rating agency Times Higher Education (THE).

In the Impact Ranking 2022 list, Istanbul Gelişim University (IGU) increased its degree from 24th to 16th among 1180 world universities in the "Quality Education" category, while maintaining its 1st place among Turkish universities.

DO NOT DO IT TO YOUR PETS!

The craziness pertaining to the dying the hair of dogs and cats turned out to be a trend worldwide in recent years. <u>Prof. Dr. Rıfat MUTUŞ</u>, who made an explanation about the matter, indicated that the use of dye products on animals may cause serious health problems, even further the death as well.

The pets with their hair dyed by their owners, who want to distract attention. frequently seen at streets. This treatment, made entirely towards the discretionary and visual anxieties of people with the effects of social media sharings, has serious negative effects on the animals. The use of these products on the animals may be causing the occurrence of serious health problems such as allergy, poisoning and changes in behaviours and even the deaths of them as well.

Dyes Have Toxic Effect

Prof. Dr. Rıfat MUTUŞ, who is the Dean of the Faculty of Health Sciences and indicated the dye products, produced for people, have negative consequences for the animals, further said that " The contact of these products with the animal skin may cause various types of skin problems such as irritation, itching, burning and so on. Nevertheless, it may cause digestive system problems where the symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhoea and so on, as a result of toxic effects of the dyes following the licking by dogs and cats of their hair." and also indicated that the sense of smell of animals are developed very well and distinguish even the smells at low-density."

Natural Smell of Animals is not to be Suppressed

It is necessary to abstain from the behaviours that will spoil natural structure animals through the use of aesthetical materials, designed for the people, over the pets. Mr. MUTUŞ, who indicated that the materials so used mav affect the behaviours of the animals by creating toxic effect on them, further said: "The sense of smell takes up a role at the first degree in animals at structuring the emotional behaviours. As a consequence, the use of dyes having a certain aroma that suppress the natural smells of animals may cause abnormal changes in the behaviours of animals."

OBESITY IS SEEN IN 40 % OF PATIENTS SUFFERING FROM ASTHMA



The asthma disease that has been a serious public health problem affecting an approximate number 370 millions of people of throughout the world is seen on one among every 13 persons in our country. Dr. Nurten Elkin, who is a Public Health Specialist from the Istanbul Gelisim University and drew attention to the fact that there was not any drug therapy available in any part of the world totally eliminating the asthma, emphasized the false facts in asthma on the occasion of May 5 International Asthma Day.

The asthma, which affects the people from every age, however, can be taken under control only through correct methods of treatments, is not a disease of childhood as thought and may be developed at later stages as well. Mrs. Elkin, who made evaluations with relation to the disease, experienced relevant increase in the number of cases every year, emphasized that there might be a fall in the daily life qualities of the patients suffering from the asthma.

'NO DRUG TREATMENT TOTALLY ELIMINATING THE ASTHMA IS AVAILABLE ANYWHERE IN THE WORLD'

The asthma, known as a chronic lung disease, is not a contagious infection, however, allergens, occupational factors, use of tobacco products, domestic and external air pollution, infections, upper respiratory tract infection (flu, sinusitis, nose polyp and so on), psychological factors, drugs, foods and so on, may cause the asthma.



Dr. Nurten Elkin, who is a Public Health Specialist from the Faculty of Health Sciences of the Istanbul Gelisim University and said that no drug treatment totally eliminating the asthma was available anywhere in the world, continued to indicate as follows:

"The disease shows itself with symptoms such recurrent difficulty in breathing. wheezing/rattle/whistling occurring while breathing, chest tightness, cough and so on. The objective of the asthma treatment is to take the complaints of disease under control and cause the life of the patient to be maintained in a way as close as to the normal life. The symptoms of the asthma could be taken under control with administering convenient drug treatment. It is crucially important to abstain from the factors causing the occurrence of the disease and use of drugs in a proper and regular manner."

The asthma is seen in one among every 12-13 adults and one of every 7-8 children in our country

OBESITY IS SEEN AMONG 40 PER CENT OF THE PEOPLE SUFFERING FROM THE ASTHMA

The researches so made show that the use of drugs by the patients as instructed by their physician, giving up smoking and loss of weight by the obese patients, nourishment in a balance and sound wav. exercising regularly, keeping the ambient air breathed clean facilitate the control of the asthma. It is reported that 30-40 % of the patients suffering from the asthma also suffer from the asthma as well, and loss of weight could improve the control of the illness. Mrs. Elkin indicated that the loss of weight among the asthmatic patients, who also suffer from the obesity, under the observation of physicians and dieticians would affect the course of the disease in an affirmative way, and it is also understood from the researches that giving up smoking and loss of weight among the patients suffering from obesity have facilitated the control of the asthma.





IF YOU SUFFER FROM THE ASTHMA, KEEP AWAY FROM THE FOLLOWING!

The Academic Member Dr. Nurten Elkin, who indicated that there are many false facts available among the public, listed up especially those that the patients suffering from the asthma have to pay attention thereto. In this respect it is necessary:

- 1. To increase ventilation in residents and workplaces.
- 2. To protect from domestic dusts and mites, and wear mask while doing domestic work.
- 3. To wear mask while getting in touch with the pets.
- 4. Not to disregard wearing sun glasses and masks in order to protect from pollen during the midseasons.
- 5. To prevent the contact of the patient with tobacco smoke.
- 6. To abstain from the gases arising from paints and polishes, stoves, oven fuel, fried oil and so on, and the rooms related thereto have to be ventilated properly in case of these kinds of circumstances.
- 7. That it is possible to make exercises and even further, heavy sports if the disease is under control in the patients suffering from the asthma.
- 8. That the opinion having indicated that the asthma drugs cause addiction is entirely untrue, and none of the medicines, used in the treatment, has any effect creating addiction. When the medicines abandoned, the patient will never suffer from the lack of such medicine(s).
- 9. Not to use the substances having irritation effects such as bleaches, hydrochloric acid and so on, among the cleansing materials at domestic places.

The Academic Member Dr. Nurten Elkin, who indicated that it was possible to put the asthma under control through the related treatment, further emphasized that taking necessary protective measures and raising the conformance of the patient to the treatment might create important developments in the course of the disease in the event that the triggering and risk factors were abstained therefrom.







"Creative Drama Workshop" organized by Istanbul Gelisim University Faculty of Health Sciences Child Development and Health Awareness Club was held with the participation of students from the Turkish and English Departments of Child Development.

Asst. Prof. Filiz Arzu YALIN, Lec. Buse KERİGAN, Lec. Mert AKYOL, Ress. Ass. Kevser Tuğba ÇINAR, Ress. Ass. Hatice Zelal BİNGÖL and international students participated Creative Drama Workshop.

During the Creative Drama Workshop, Lec.Buse KERİGAN, a practicing trainer, talked about the history-characteristics of creative drama, its effects on children's developmental areas, the fields in which creative drama is used and the application steps of creative drama.

The creative drama workshop was started by playing introduction games so that the group could communicate interactively with each other.

In the dating games, firstly, the students were helped to remember their names by using the ball, and then informative activities were carried out about their personal characteristics with the toilet roll technique. After the acquaintance games were completed, the posh-it game was played, allowing everyone to talk to each other within the time determined by the drama leader, and at the end of the 5-question question-answer activity, the person who collected the most names was chosen as the winner of the game. After the 3 games were completed, the empathy game, which is a relaxing game, was played in order for the participants to evaluate the process and manage their energies. For the empathy game, before the workshop, an empathy basket was prepared by the drama leader and different materials were placed in it. (Toothbrush, ball, socks, Band-Aid, banana, apple, syringe, ketchup, tu etc.). Before the participants were informed about the game, they were directed to choose the objects they wanted from the basket. After the participants took the objects, they asked them to empathize with the object they took by asking "........ if it were you, how would you feel?" Each participant was asked to make a statement.

In the last game of the creative drama workshop, some papers on which questions were written were distributed to the participants by the drama leader. Participants were asked to find the answers to these questions by walking around the group and asking each other. (Sample questions; who has a tattoo?, who can play the piano?, who can perform imambayildi? etc.) The creative drama workshop was completed in a pleasant way with the games.

"EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND INNOVATION IN HEALTH AND WELL-BEING STUDIES"



NIDA ISLAND WHERE AT THE WESTERN POINT OF LITHUANIA AND THE BALTIC COUNTRIES



Bülent SAKA Talks About Murat DILMENER (1941-2020)

Professor DİLMENER was born on October 10, 1941 in Mardin. After completing his primary and secondary education in Mardin (1948-1959), he won the Istanbul Faculty of Medicine and graduated from the Istanbul Faculty of Medicine in 1965 as a Medical Doctor. He worked in Mardin and Şırnak Central Health Centers, respectively, and worked at Admiral Bristol Hospital between 1973-1974.

In 1974, he started his specialization in Internal Medicine at Istanbul Medical Faculty. He received the title of Internal Medicine Specialist in 1978 and continued to work as a chief assistant in the Internal Medicine Clinic of Istanbul Medical Faculty. In 1983, he completed his thesis titled "Examination of Various Diseases of the Gallbladder and Its Paths with the 99mTc-Hida Cholescintigraphy Method Comparison with Other Radiological Methods" and received the title of Associate Professor. He started to work in the Department of Clinical Bacteriology and Infectious Diseases in 1985. He became Professor of General Internal Medicine in 1988 and Professor of Clinical Bacteriology and Infectious Diseases in 1991. Between 1991-1998, he served as the Head of the Department of Clinical Bacteriology and Infectious Diseases. In 1999, he was assigned to the Department of Internal Diseases, General Internal Medicine Department, and served as the Head of the Department of Internal Diseases for 3 terms until 2008.

Professor DİLMENER is married and has 3 children. There are a total of 179 domestic and international publications and book chapters. He was fluent in English and Arabic. Among the foundations of which he is a founding member are the Turkish Infection Foundation, Avni Sözen Anatolian High School Foundation and Mardin Education Foundation. He served as the Internal Diseases Representative at the Istanbul Medical Faculty Foundation. Among the associations he is a member of are the Internal Medicine Education and Solidarity Association, Behcet's Disease Association. Turkish Medical Association, ANKEM Association, KİLİMİK Association and Istanbul University Faculty Members Association.





Prof.Dr.Murat DILMENER (19412020)



Professor DİLMENER's memorable features while he was working at the Istanbul Medical Faculty include reading a lot, being a hardworking, disciplined and full duty person, benevolent personality, and a life free from arrogance and ostentatiousness. He valued his patients very much, always felt that the other person was human, taught that this was the foremost, and was often reminded during his visits. He always taught something to his students and the physicians around him, by constantly asking questions and then answering them in detail. Besides the medicinal properties of diseases, he liked to talk about the history of medicine and the discoveries and discoverers of diseases. During the time I worked with him, I witnessed that he conveyed to us what he learned from previous generations with his seriousness, narratives and evaluations in bedside visits, adding the atmosphere of that time. In a way, our dear teacher, who worked with many teachers who led the development of medicine from the foundation of medicine in the Republic of Turkey, was determined to keep the teachings and feelings of those days alive in front of us. Professor Dilmener and other Professors from the same period were people who played the role of conveying the teaching of medicine between us and past generations. They handed us that flag.
