Res. Asst. İlknur Külekçi Participated in Erasmus+ Training Mobility!







A TRANSDICIPLINARY FIELD: ECOCINEMA STUDIES

If ecocritical consciousness is an awareness like feminism or something more than that, how can we understand that movies are based on this consciousness, or what qualities do they offer us in this direction?

Even if we work or teach in different fields, we have to somehow refer to the etymology of the concept of "economy" or "ecology". Eco/oikos introduces the concepts of "home, land and management". In other words, the concept establishes its bond with "managerialism" etymologically from the very beginning and prepares a critical ground for the masculine critical attitude.

Although anthropocentric approaches are initially accepted on the basis of ecocritical studies, it expands by encompassing not only the relationship between human and nature, but also the refusal to think through fundamentally dualist distinctions such as non-human living things and nature. Another focal point of ecocritical studies was to criticize the position of regenerating nature, to which he is indebted to nature, and his moves to consume it, by taking that "man" into the center of life(s), while neoliberal policies produce "debted man". Thus, we see that ecocritical studies intersect with many different fields, contain less critical thoughts as well as extreme views, which we can call more radical, and consist of scattered thoughts with different problematizations, such as ecocentric or non-ecocentric, which are brought to the main argument. Moreover, each of these fields carries with it its own internal critical dynamic and the criticisms directed at it, in other words, the fields are borrowed with their contradictory potentials. And we are faced with a paradigm shift after all. If the problem in this change is clearly the problem of putting the (male) human being in the center, it is a paradigm shift based on thought, which at best criticizes the anthropocentric order that places humans at the center of the universe, but whose main purpose is to overthrow it. It is the change of a thought that we know, that we are used to, that we accept as natural.

The clutter of the aforementioned area creates a structure that allows you to draw your attention, rather than providing a tidy thinking opportunity for film works, which is already an eclectic field. First of all, the concept of eco-cinema does not have a singular counterpart in film studies; Sustainability studies, eco-feminism, eco-criticism or cultural studies include the concepts and thoughts of different fields within eco-cinema studies, just like the traditional cinema theories before it, and this points to the relationality and even functionality of eco-cinema studies. As a matter of fact, the concept of ecocriticism, which we mostly associate with social sciences today, was first used for a critical view of the literary field, just as critical methods in cinema are based on literary texts.

In the context of conventional narratives in cinema, the filmic environment or ecological perspective is focused only on the nature-human relationship or the cinematic environment with a representational and shallow description at first glance. However, can't there be ways to benefit more effectively from the structure we're talking about as fragmented and messy? Exactly this fragmented structure and point of view requires asking before answering many questions in the field of cinema as well. Can eco-cinema by itself point to a methodology? If ecocritical consciousness is an awareness like feminism or something more than that, how can we understand that movies are based on this consciousness, or what qualities do they offer us in this direction? In this view, is it necessary to highlight the filmmaking practice, aesthetics or the director? Before answering these questions, it may be useful to look at the relationship between the feminist movement and cinema, which left its mark on the 70s, with an anachronistic turn, by laying the groundwork for the discussion. If there is to remember the films made with experimental and avant-garde practices and feminist consciousness in this period, it would be appropriate to come to terms with the past deficiencies and mistakes. However, an experimental or avant-garde ecological consciousness development or cinematic ecology can create a pedagogical effect by reminding the medium-based ties of the field. This can be functional in terms of creating an ecological consciousness by becoming associated not only with the ecological references in the narrative, but also with a view that emphasizes the film form/form when considering the relationship between ecology and cinema.

Nature Photographer and Director Burak Doğansoysal:

"Being able to deliver visuals in motion, along with sound and music, takes storytelling to another level."

Thank you for accepting our FoAS Monthly e-Bulletin interview request. Could you tell us about the story of becoming a nature photographer and documentarian begin?

Actually, I was a photographer first, then I became a nature activities enthusiast, and when I met Africa, I became a nature photographer. I can say that it was almost a coincidence that I started making documentaries. When DSLR cameras came with the ability to shoot HD movies, I changed my body and bought a body that could shoot movies, and photography gradually evolved into film. Being able to deliver visuals in motion, along with sound and music, takes storytelling to another level.

Could you briefly tell us about the realization processes and stages of nature photography and documentary shootings?

The most important process is the idea generation stage. After an idea comes up, the logistics / organization part of the job, which I think is the most difficult process, begins.



It is necessary to find answers to hundreds of questions such as "How many people will be filmed with a team, where and when the shooting will take place, how will the permissions be obtained, if the shootings are abroad, how will the equipment pass through customs, will the local guide be used, and if so, who will they be?" When the answers are found, the budget of the work emerges. According to the budget, I either work with a producer or finance it with my own resources. In nature documentary, especially if you have a limited budget and therefore time, like me, you can never shoot everything you plan. After the shooting is over, we start editing by revising the script / texts according to the material at hand.



JUNE INTERVIEW

What makes you choose the subject of a documentary? What is the process of finding, selecting, funding and applying topics work in your personal work?

Topics I enjoy and places I want to be are always my priority. Unfortunately, wildlife documentarianism is not a popular and sought-after branch in Turkey, and orders are not received from magazines and channels. That's why I project whatever I want to shoot, and for the financing, as I just explained, I either find a producer or meet it from my own resources, I go and shoot. Then I set it up and present it to the market. I can say that the easiest part of the process is the shooting phase, which is the most physically tiring and risky part. When the business hits the market, we both participate in festivals and participate in international production fairs, promoting our work to channels and distributors. After that, it's pretty unpleasant things like contracts, follow-up of publications, copyright infringement and tracking.

It can be said that in your documentaries, you focus on the relationship between man and nature. What is your view on the nature-culture-human relationship? What do you pay attention to when conveying this perspective to your work?

There are two relationships that I try to touch on my documentaries. The first is to encourage people who have no relationship with nature in daily life and who know nature through magazines and television to establish a physical relationship with nature by provoking stories and images, thus capturing individuals who will actively contribute to nature conservation through documentaries. The second is to show what we are in essence by conveying the indigenous peoples, who are still not deeply connected with nature, to the audience, not with a romantic language, but as they are. While conveying these, I try to add my interpretation only to the visuals and to give the story as close to reality as possible without interpretation.





What are your suggestions for new graduates or candidates who are interested in photography and documentaries to improve themselves and take action?



JUNE INTERVIEW

You have to look at a lot of photos and chase after a lot of photos. The good shots we capture are the result of moments we've come across different variations of in the past. It is valid for every subject, but it may be a little more important for wildlife. Considering that many interesting movements take place in seconds, it is very important to be able to make a quick decision by mastering the technical features of the equipment. So the nature photographer should be one body with his equipment.

He was born in 1978 in Bursa. He graduated from Robert College in 1996 and got his bachelor's from Marmara University, Department of Business Administration in 2000. He has been a photographer since 1995 and a professional photographer since 2005. His photographs and travel articles were published in BBC Wildlife Magazine, National Geographic, Wheat Magazine, Photograph Magazine, Bilim ve Teknik, RC Quarterly, TRT Vizyon, Skylife magazines. He has become a Magma Magazine photographer and writer. He toured 64 countries on five continents. He has been shooting wildlife and nature documentaries for Turkish and world television since 2009, and his documentaries are broadcast in 70 countries. Between 2011 and 2015, he was the coordinator of the vulture protection project supported by the United Nations.

He has memberships of IDA (International Documentary Association), IAWF (International Association of Wildlife Filmmakers), GTC (Guild of Television Camera Professionals), Photojournalists Association of Turkey (TFMD), Robert College Alumni Association, Ornithophoto Bird and Wildlife Photographers Association, Wheat Supporting Ecological Life, and the Nature Research Association.

Erasmus+ mobility as a Gastronomy Student...

Greetings, I am Doğa Yeşiloğlu, a student of Istanbul Gelisim University Gastronomy and Culinary Arts (English) Department. In this part, I present the education and experiences I received at the Instituto Politécnico da Guarda school in Seia, Portugal, where I went with the Erasmus+ project in my 4th year of my university and department.

On my journey that started from Turkey, I first reached Lisbon, the capital of Portugal. After spending my first night in the capital, I reached the city of Seia, which gave its name to the university, with a short bus ride. Before I came to Portugal, the university assistant I talked to about my Erasmus+ project and got the information from met me at Seia Bus Station. We had a pleasant conversation with the university, departments and students during the car journey from the bus station to the dormitory. When we arrived at the dormitory, he introduced me to both my dorm and my department friends. Portugal is a country that gathers people of many races under its roof, so the students' approach to me was sincere and warm.



The next day, I had the opportunity to tour the university. My guidance teacher who accompanied me introduced me to all the kitchens and mixology laboratories of the institute. This building of the university was only teaching on Kitchen and Bar training. So the kitchens, service restaurants and bar labs were very extensive. 




Widows. Ariel Nofman


No One Writes to the Colonel, Gabriel Garcia Marquez

Porland Saved 1,989 Grown Pine Trees From Being Cut!

Standing out with its environmentally friendly vision that contributes to sustainability, Porland continues to develop new projects to support the solution of this problem. Youtube Disables Story Feature!
