SHY-147 Recognized School B2 Avionics Laboratory Opening Ceremony of Faculty of Applied Sciences was Held!

SHY-147 Recognized School B2 Avionics Laboratory within the body of Avionics Department of the Faculty of Applied Science (FoAS) was inaugurated on 22.05.2023 with the participations of Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin, Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Nuri Kuruoğlu and Prof. Dr. Necmettin Maraşlı, FoAS Dean Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya, Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry Prof. Dr. Mahir Günday, Director of Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School Assist. Prof. Dr. İsmail Cem Ay, FoAS Vice Deans and Faculty Members and students.



At the opening ceremony of the laboratory located in the classroom number 086 in the G-Block Vocational School campus, Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya underlined in his speech the fact that the laboratory is unique in Turkey, as well as its superior and different technical features that offer students the opportunity to perform a wide variety of applications.



At the opening ceremony of the laboratory located in the classroom number 086 in the G-Block Vocational School campus, Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya underlined in his speech the fact that the laboratory is unique in Turkey, as well as its superior and different technical features that offer students the opportunity to perform a wide variety of applications. Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya stated that IGU/ FoAS Avionics Department is one of the few in Turkey with the "Recognized School" status authorized by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) within the scope of B2 Avionics. Dean Prof. Kamil Kaya said that: "Our students take B2 Avionics category SHY 66 module courses in addition to YÖK courses. At the end of the academic year, students who both meet the course success criteria set by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK) and who are successful in SHY 147 Task application trainings are eligible to take module retention exams and are entitled to receive the SHY 147 Recognized School certificate together with their undergraduate diplomas. SHY 147 TASK training is an applied training and is given by instructors with industry background in full-fledged laboratory environments approved by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA). The inaugurated B2 Avionics Laboratory is an educational establishment equipped with synthetic training sets required for TASK trainings and meets the criteria of DGCA." Dean Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya also expressed his gratitude to Mr. Abdülkadir Gayretli, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and all those who contributed to the establishment of the laboratory.



Later, IGU Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin stated that he is delighted to have 147 Recognized Schools B2 Avionics Laboratory, which offers a wide application area to students in terms of technology.




After the opening speeches, the ribbon cutting took place thereafter the laboratory was visited and examined, and Lecturer Mehmet Ateş from the Aircraft Maintenance and Repair Department showed the participants and students the applications of the Fire Warning System Training Set and Flight Simulation Training Set in the laboratory and explained the working principles. Avionics1st and 2nd grade students presented the circuits and projects they had previously made in laboratory courses to the participants and fellow students.

Later, Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin and the participants visited the other aircraft laboratories under the guidance of Lecturer Mehmet Ateş after the inaugurated B2 Avionics laboratory and informed about the aircraft class-laboratories and related equipment.

Istanbul Gelisim University has more than one department recognized by DGCA. In addition to 10 SHY-147 Recognized School laboratories established with the support of our Chairman of the Board of Trustees Abdulkadir Gayretli for these departments, there is also Pilot Melike Kuvvet Aircraft Hangar-Cessna 340A aircraft in Block J.







Simultaneous Translation Laboratory Opening Ceremony was Held!

The opening ceremony of the Simultaneous Translation Laboratory, organized by the Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences and the Department of English Translation and Interpretation, was held on Monday, May 8, 2023, between 10:00 and 11:00 in A Block FoAS E-212, with the participation of Chairman of the Board of Trustees Abdülkadir Gayretli, Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin, Vice Rectors Prof. Dr. Nuri Kuruoğlu and Prof. Dr Necmettin Maraşlı, Dean of Faculty of Applied Sciences Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya, Faculty of Applied Sciences Deputy Deans Assist. Prof. Dr.Nevruz Berna Tatlısu and Assist. Prof. Dr. Sevinç Koçak, Head of English Translation and Interpreting Department Assist. Prof. Dr. Görsev Sönmez and faculty lecturers and students. The ceremony, which started with the opening speeches and ribbon cutting, ended with the promotion of the Simultaneous Translation Laboratory equipment and the simultaneous translation practice.




In the Simultaneous Translation Laboratory, an environment is created in which students can perform both consecutive and simultaneous translation practices. Accordingly, there are three cabinets in the laboratory that allow interpreting. Each of these booths allows two interpreters to make simultaneous translations in different language pairs at the same time. On the other hand, with the help of the desk microphone and the traveling microphone in the laboratory, the seminar, conversation and interview environments can be animated and consecutive translation application can be carried out. Students, who have the opportunity to put theory into practice, look for solutions to translational problems that may arise during translation process with these simulations.

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The state-of-the-art DICENTIS system developed by Bosch, a multinational technology and engineering company, is used in the Simultaneous Translation Laboratory. This system is a conference system designed to facilitate communication and cooperation between participants in meetings and conferences. The DICENTIS conference system consists of various components such as wired and wireless interpretation units (Translator Headphones, Digital Modulator, Sound Processor and Switch Unit) and multimedia devices (8-Channel Digital Infrared Pocket Signal Receiver, Radiators). The conference units are equipped with high quality microphones and speakers that provide clear sound for the participants in the meeting. 40 students could check simultaneous translations done in the booths on any channel, thanks to the mobile signal receiver and earphones.

The Simultaneous Translation Laboratory with 3 booths and capacity of 52 students has started to be used for the courses of the Department of English Translation and Interpreting as of the 2022-2023 Spring Semester.



Naciye SÖYLEMEZ Social Worker / Fatih Municipality

The story of my journey in studying the department at IGU began with the "social work" option that my geometry teacher dictated to my preferences while I was in high school. I tell this coincidence with a smile every time. The reason I smile today is different. Learning eclectic information about all social sciences in each of my years in the IGU "Social Work" department motivated me to read my department even more fondly. At the end of high school, I only had thoughts such as what kind of work I wanted to do and where I wanted to see myself, but I couldn't find out which department and profession it was in.



I have always been a strong person in communication with people, since middle school. The reasons why I consider my communication strong are; I am not ashamed to speak in public, I only comment on a subject that I do not know as much as my own ideas; otherwise, when there is something I do not know, I would say it frankly and immediately go and research it. I would never avoid talking about my friends' problems and would do my best to be a solution to them, and I would find my interlocutor and talk to them as soon as I could stop and wait for someone to understand my own problems. Otherwise, I would never feel comfortable. Since somone who does not marginalize or discriminate among my friends or people, I would accept him, and I would think that maybe just keeping a distance from doing harm would be enough.

Students studying social work will understand me very clearly here, I was also aware that I could not tolerate injustice and that I had a habit of "advocacy" that was valid for everyone I did not know. The first time I realized its place in social work during my undergraduate education, I was very excited to turn this habit into a professionalism. Here, my geometry teacher, with whom we have a healthy communication and who reflects to us that he loves us and his job, will have experienced some realizations in my temperament, as I have expressed many times, so that he told me that I could also research the social work department, which started my university adventure. I started to dream, to get excited and to research where and how I could study this department.

Naciye SÖYLEMEZ Social Worker

One of the things I loved about IGU from the first year to the last year was to study in a peaceful and qualified environment. I believed that the wide range of opportunities and the peacefulness of our university would bring luck to all of us. Our professors, who were experts in their fields, introduced us to the positive aspects of the profession along with all the difficulties, and opened horizons by recommending various books.

After the first year of getting used to both the university and the social work department, we were gradually reaching the qualified academic level required at the undergraduate level. In the following years, the "theories" that made us feel that we were stepping into professionalism in the field of social work were now getting involved and the education was more enjoyable. With our new terms and professional concepts, our SHU eye was now looking at the world, events and phenomena from the perspective of "social justice". The awareness of what a social worker means was settling in the minds of each of us. We knew that the strongest hand of the social worker was a professional intervention for dysfunctional individuals and families and the importance of SIR (Social Investigation Report) reporting.



For me, a lecturer at university meant everything. For us, it meant the deepening motivation that was reflected to us by the professors with deep knowledge. Sharing their professional knowledge, field knowledge and theoretical knowledge with us closely was the most beautiful aspect of our pleasant lessons at our university.

In recent years, I have begun to understand the difference between being progressive and being "Open to Development" much better. One of the activities that our teachers got us used to during this undergraduate period was to read a lot and to do book summaries. Recommended book titles, articles, photocopies, printouts... Recommended series, movies...

In addition to my compulsory internship, I can say that my volunteer internship was very beneficial for me to learn the job from the kitchen and to see the field, and it gave me a lot of experience. I could understand the education I received and the quality of what I learned from my conversations with fellow students from my other field during the internship, and from my conversations with friends from my other field in environments such as seminars and symposiums I attended.

In the last year, we had learnt to do resource research and access foreign resources, while the last exams and thesis writing process. The saddest part of our graduation was that it coincided with the pandemic. In 2021, it was an exhausting and exciting process that all exams and the submission process of the thesis were over. Prof. Dr. İsmet Galip YOLCUOĞLU, who is the academician who produced the most books in our profession, joined the staff of IGU in February 2019 when we were in the 3rd grade, which excited us all. Indeed, our teacher's more than 30 years of academic and practical experience opened very wide horizons for us and allowed us to gain vision as the most indepth SHUs of our country. After receiving my diploma in June 2021, I prepared a CV and left it to the institutions with suitable working conditions.

My kindergarten experience, where I worked for 2 months after graduation, ended with my own consent, because I couldn't see myself happy there and not being happy made me unproductive in my job. After I quit my job, I entered the process of waiting for the return of my job application from the district municipality. In this process, I decided to get an education that I wanted for a very long time. Announcer and reporter course. While the training was continuing, I was called for an interview from Fatih Municipality Communication Center and was hired. I realized the connection between Social Work and the Communication Center shortly after I started working. In both cases, regardless of the subject, there was a client, the focus was people, and communication was very important over the phone as well as face-to-face.

All of this actually corresponded to the field applications of social work in our knowledge of "working with the community" theory. I continued to educate myself by turning to more in-depth books and my position in Fatih Municipality started to become more solid.

In a short time, I started to guide the groups in the tour program where the services of the municipality were introduced at the Directorate of Press and Public Relations. However, with the support of our manager, I started to face the camera in the works of digital media. Even my business made me happy when the works that I loved to do were gathered together. After 1.5 years, I was transferred from the communication center to the Directorate of Press and Public Relations as a position. At the moment, I am carrying out the activities of travel guide, reporter, organization and field follow-up in the follow-up of the president's program.

I will always be honored and proud to be a social work graduate of IGU and to be a part of such a big family...

BARRIER-FREE EDUCATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION...

According to the World Health Organization (WHO), disability is a complex, dynamic, multidimensional and controversial concept. WHO defines disability as a limitation or inability in the process of performing any activity within the limits considered normal. On the other hand, disability is defined as the restriction or inability to fulfill the expected roles of the individual based on age, gender, social and cultural factors due to a disability or handicap (WHO, 2011: 3-4). According to another definition, disability is the difficulties encountered in performing the activities of daily life, either congenitally or later, physically, mentally or psychologically, partially or completely (inan et al., 2013: 725).

According to the World Disability Report published by the World Health Organization (WHO) in 2011, 15.6% of the population over the age of 18 is disabled (WHO, 2011: 27). In our country, it is stated that 6.9% of the total population had at least one disability in 2011, according to the 2011 Population and Housing Survey conducted by the Turkish Institution (2011). As a result of the transition to higher education exam held in our country in 2017, the number of students with disabilities enrolled in associate (1545) and undergraduate (1278) programs is 2823 students. Of these students, 26.4% are other disabled, 26.1% are physically disabled, 24.8% are visually impaired, 18.1% are hearing impaired, and 4.6% are temporarily disabled. Melekoğlu, 2017).

According to Article 42 of the Constitution of the Republic of Turkey, "No one can be deprived of the right to education and training." According to the Social Services and Child Protection Agency Law No. 2828, which was published and entered into force on July 17, 2005, the disabled person is defined as "a person who is in need of protection, care, rehabilitation, counseling and support services, who does not comply with the requirements of normal life due to the loss of physical, mental, spiritual, emotional and social abilities at various degrees as a result of congenital or subsequent illness or accident." (Tekin, 2019).



In the Law No. 5378 on the Disabled, the disabled refers to the individual who is affected by the attitudes and environmental conditions that restrict his full and effective participation in the society on equal terms with other individuals due to the loss of his physical, mental, spiritual and sensory abilities at various levels. In a sense, it can be said that the individuals we describe as "disabled" are victims of the environment (Karakuş et al., 2017: 2578).

The right to education, which is a fundamental right that all individuals have and is guaranteed by national and international legal regulations, has revealed that all children should be protected without discrimination with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948), the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), the European Social Charter (1961; 1996) and the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (2009). In accordance with this legislation, the state should make plans to ensure that individuals with disabilities receive education at all levels within the general education system, necessary measures should be taken to include individuals with disabilities who have started their formal education programs late for different reasons. Article 26 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights also refers to education and emphasizes that primary and secondary education should be free and that higher education should be open to everyone with full equality (www.tbmm.gov.tr).

According to the results of the survey conducted throughout our country in 2020, the data presented below is at a substantial level.

The following statements are included in order to take the necessary measures within the framework of possibilities in order to make education in higher education institutions as accessible as possible to our students with disabilities:

- It should be determined whether there are students with disabilities in the relevant programs of the universities and the lecturer should be informed about the precautions to be taken according to the disability group.
- Measures should be taken to eliminate the problems experienced in the live lesson platform by contacting students with disabilities for live lesson connections.
- These students should also be informed in writing about the distance education systems used.
- Measures such as providing the course content as text for hearing impaired students, giving lectures with subtitles if possible, sending the course content to the student as text in advance, paying attention to the use of rich text formats that can be used by the reader systems of our visually impaired students, using large font and contrasting colours in presentations, describing visual content, graphics and tables during lectures, describing graphics especially in exams, allowing additional time in exams according to disability status should be evaluated.

- Care should be taken to ensure that a small number of students with intellectual disabilities and autism spectrum disorders are not disconnected from higher education, contact with the family and the student at regular intervals, and if necessary, support from academics from psychology and other fields should be provided within the possibilities.
- If students with chronic illnesses apply with this condition, their needs should be evaluated within the framework of their illness.

As a result, keeping in mind that every individual is a candidate for disability, it is of great importance to implement the suggestions for barrier-free education in higher education institutions as much as possible.

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MAY INTERVIEW

BARRIER-FREE CAFE OWNER FERRUH KALEDİBİ:

"We are trying to exist everywhere together with the other members of the society with the slogan of "We Are in Life!"

Thank you for accepting our FoAS Monthly E-Bulletin interview request. What is a barrier-free cafe? What prompted you to open a barrier-free cafe? Can you tell our readers about these processes?

I opened the barrier-free cafe to show that private individuals can participate in social integration and employment, and that they can produce something like normal individuals. I am also the father of a 25-year-old child with Down syndrome. My awareness started with the development of my child. Awareness always starts to form after the first steps of an entrepreneur. I also have different businesses serving in this field. We set out from my belief that private individuals can do something. Currently, 5 mentally handicapped individuals are working in our restaurant business. Such businesses are protected and licensed by the ministry of family social policy.





MAY INTERVIEW

What kind of services are provided in the disabled cafe? What kind of activities and projects are there besides serving as a cafe?

Our establishment, which we established in 2015, serves many things from breakfast to à la carte world cuisine. We have everything from hot to cold drinks. In short, we can provide all the services you expect from a cafe. Our colleagues have made a great contribution to the families of other individuals with special needs who are like themselves. Every family has become a hope by seeing our employees for the answer to the question of what they will be and what they will do when they grow up. The education they will receive in each period will reinforce their being in life. With the motto of "We Are In Life", we try to exist everywhere together with other members of the society, from sports competitions to exhibitions, we strive to live together. Instead of hearing words like we love you as individuals with special needs, make room in your workplaces by allocating a place in your class for us. Instead of being remembered on 3 December, 21 March, 2 April, 10-16 May, let every day be together. In addition, instead of working only through cafes, we want to work in areas such as packaging, greenhouse and ornamental planting, cleaning, hotel floor attendants, which can be done by individuals with special needs.

Should barrier-free cafes be seen as a commercial enterprise or a social responsibility project? What are your thoughts on this?

Accessible cafes should be seen as a business enterprise. These businesses can be longterm by turning themselves. Having a pitying approach to employees destroys the sustainability of businesses. It should be able to compete with other businesses, individuals with special needs should be able to do their jobs in the best way, if you cannot improve their inadequacies. If you do not give good education on this subject, if you behave tolerantly, you will hinder development. The worst part of such businesses is failure. At the end of the failure, the operator may go bankrupt and move on to another job, but since the business is known as the place of individuals with special needs, the society says, "Oh look, individuals with special needs couldn't do it" and there is an image that they can't do this. Disadvantaged group businesses have such a risk. For all these reasons, the state should have follow-up support in this regard. In places rented from the public or municipalities, priority should be given on the condition that the rental price is within the scope of support, the same product, the same work, the same price in the tenders. Supports such as tax and SSI premium support are necessary for sustainability.



MAY INTERVIEW

How do barrier-free cafes contribute to the development of special individuals? Can we say that barrier-free cafes offer employment and socialization opportunities to private individuals?

Our cafe was established with the motto of "We Are In The Working Life" of individuals with special needs. When our individuals joined working life, both their private and social lives have changed significantly. Not only did they change themselves, they helped society break their prejudices about these individuals. 27 personnel were transferred to other workplaces in our cafe. Thanks to the self-confidence and the subconscious mind of the employers, they have been supported by the employers, thanks to the breaking of the mentality that they can't do anything.

We find this interview with you very valuable in order to increase the awareness of our students. Thank you very much for your time and the comprehensive information you provided for the FoAS Monthly E-Bulletin.

Erasmus+ Mobility in Central Europe...

Greetings, I am Istanbul Gelisim University FoAS International Trade Department Research Assistant Nuran Aktaş. I would like to share with you my visit to Žilina University in Slovakia in April 2023 as part of Erasmus+ Staff Training Mobility and my experiences there.

First of all, one of the reasons I chose Slovakia is that it is one of the countries that left the Soviet Union therefore it was related to my master's thesis. 
Stevi Stefan Church (Iron Church)


Special days in May




BOOK RECOMMENDATIONS

Asst. Prof. Dr. Görsev SÖNMEZ Department of Translation and Interpreting Erich Fromm. The Art of Love

The book begins with a wonderful quote by Paracelsus.

"One who knows nothing loves nothing. One who can do nothing understands nothing. A person who understands nothing is worthless. But the one who understands both loves, is sensitive to everything and sees.... The more knowledge there is in something, the greater the love. ... One who thinks that all fruits ripen at the same time as strawberries does not know grapes at all. "



The book consists of 4 chapters that will be read with pleasure with the meaning this quote imposes. In the first chapter, the author discusses what it means to love and whether love is an art. According to him, loving is an art. According to him, love is an important concept and everyone thinks this way. Although everyone knows that love is important, they don't tend to make an effort to understand and learn about it. Very few pay attention to it and search for something about love. There are so many movies, songs, books, etc. about love, but very few people think about it. People are starved for love.

In the second part, the author describes the nature of love. The belief that love will solve the problem of human existence is emphasized. He says that although the underlying element of love is sexuality, the underlying element of love is the emotional state that develops over time. In the third chapter, the author examines love in different ways and describes it by dividing it into sections. He divides it into sections as brotherly love, motherly love, sexual love, self-love and love of God. According to Fromm, to the extent that you love yourself, you love the other person(s). Self-love is not selfishness.

"If I can say to a person 'I love you', I should be able to say 'I love everyone in you, I love the whole world in you, I love myself in you'."

The last section deals with the practice of love. Many people avoid love, which is said to be the most difficult emotion to practice among societies. No matter how much we read and no matter how hard we work, we will always fall short of love and it is not in our hands.

This book will disappoint anyone who wants ready-made knowledge of the art of loving. On the contrary, what is meant to be shown here is that love is not an emotion that can be enjoyed by anyone at random, without reaching a certain maturity. The purpose of the book is to show the reader that unless they develop his whole personality creatively, their efforts to love will fail, and that love cannot be satisfied without the ability to love one's neighbor, true humility, boldness, faith, and discipline.


A Guide for the Disoriented / Kemal Sayar

A Guide for the Disoriented (Kemal Sayar)

At the beginning of the book, the author makes the following statements as a summary of the book. "This book is for those whose heads are split and whose hearts are broken by falling into the world. A guide not to extinguish the light of the heart. Where there is sincerity and care, there is heartbreak, reminding us that we are human. What did you hope for, what did you find, what did you lose? We are hurt by those we love... The world hurts us because we dream for things to be better. Why does one read? You come across a line or a sentence and you say, "This is exactly the feeling that I've been experiencing but I can't name it!" Your loneliness fades away for a moment. You find a kinship with other souls. You multiply and heal. A Guide for the Faint of Heart is a collection of essays written with the desire to heal together. Each essay is a letter to my own soul and to other wounded souls."



As can be understood from this statement, Kemal Sayar offers a therapeutic book to his readers who have difficulty coping with today's problems.



Breathless Breath / Ayşe Kulin

Known for her mastery in blending historical and contemporary realities with fiction, Ayşe Kulin once again conveys a different side of the world to her readers in this novel, Breathless Breathless, a story set during the Second World War. While dealing with Nazism, one of the cruelest realities of history that swept Europe, and the delicate balance that the Turkish diplomacy of the time took care to maintain, she also tells the story of the love and escape of a Jewish young man who married the daughter of an Ottoman vizier on the front side of this historical plan. Breathless Breath is one of the most important novels written in recent times that sheds light on the inevitable intersection between the history of individuals and the history of humanity, thus justifying its place among the masterpieces of a master writer.
