IGU launches a "Disaster Relief Campaign for Earthquake Regions"

After the earthquake disaster, the epicenter of which was in Kahramanmaraş and which caused great destruction in 10 provinces, Istanbul Gelisim University launched a "Disaster Relief Campaign for Earthquake Regions" to be sent to earthquake zones. The aid collected within our university is delivered to those in need with the coordination of AFAD.

Aid reaches those in need!

A state of emergency was declared for 3 months in 10 provinces where the earthquake disaster caused great destruction. People who got together from different cities of Turkey started to collect materials to be delivered to the earthquake area. The aid collection under the banner of "Disaster Relief Campaign for Earthquake Regions" is delivered to those in need with the coordination of AFAD. Istanbul Gelisim University students and staff provided necessary assistance by taking necessities such as blankets, tents, diapers, baby food, winter boots and coats, scarves, hats, gloves, powerbanks, food parcels, ready-made food, canned food and raincoats to the IGU SKS Office in Block J.

Regarding the 7.7 magnitude earthquake disaster, the epicenter of which is Pazarcık district of Kahramanmaraş and causing great destruction in 10 provinces, we wish God's mercy on our citizens who lost their lives, our condolences to their families and our nation, and a speedy recovery to our wounded.

Istanbul Gelisim University Students Aids for the Victims of the Earthquake!

Istanbul Gelisim University students and university members have been helping earthquake victims since the first day with support campaigns. This time, IGU students are providing food support to earthquake zones by preparing "a total of 104,195 sandwiches". The prepared food packages are delivered to the victims of the natural disaster through the Red Crescent.

104,195 sandwiches prepared!

With the cooperation of Istanbul Gelişim University and the sector, 104,195 sandwiches were prepared to be sent to our brothers and sisters in the earthquake zone through the Red Crescent. Gastronomy Department of Istanbul Gelisim students and staff produced more than 104 thousand sandwiches for those affected by the earthquake, the epicenter of which was Kahramanmaraş and caused great destruction in 10 provinces.

Istanbul Gelisim University Secretary General and Gastronomy Departments Coordinator Assoc. Dr. Serdar Egeli says "After the earthquake that caused great destruction and loss of life, we managed the process by planning from the first moment to be with the earthquake victims. As Istanbul Gelisim University, we started to produce sandwiches in order to meet the most basic need for people. Our sandwich production, which started with 10,500 units, reached 31,060 units on the last day. We carry out this process in our 3 separate kitchens, with 120 people every day, approximately 300 students, food engineers, academics from the culinary and gastronomy department, and people who come to help from the sector and bring supplies. We established this sandwich production line in order to help the disaster victims and we are producing seriously in this line. The sandwiches we make are delivered to earthquake victims through the Red Crescent."







SOCIAL SERVICE IN EARTHQUAKE AND DISASTERS

Earthquakes with magnitudes of 7.8 and 7.6, which took place on the Gaziantep-Maraş-Hatay axis on February 6, 2023 at 04:17 and in the following minutes, caused great destruction and loss of life in 10 provinces in the region.

Our country is located on the Alpine-Himalayan Earthquake Belt, which has the most serious earthquake risks in the world. The North Anatolian fault is a gigantic fault with a total length of 1,200 km and a width of kilometers in some places, and the Eastern Anatolian fault line descending towards our south is a very long fault extending from Erzincan to Hatay. In the last fifty years, erroneous, incomplete and lack of scientific paradigm, consistency and scientific decisions can be counted as the main factors causing this disaster.

After all, the damage of the earthquake to individuals and families is the most important result. In addition to serious problems such as death, injury, permanent or temporary disability, family break-ups, mental disorders, job and education losses, lack of basic needs, heating, transportation, communication and shelter problems were common.

According to the figures announced by our state, the number of those who died after 21 days reached 45 thousand, and the number of the beneficial ones exceeded hundreds of thousands. Disasters are events that destroy the normal life of the society by disrupting the ecological balance, loss of life and property. Disasters, which are natural and technological events that cause physical, economic and social losses for people, and affect communities by interrupting normal life and human activities; The normal flow of human life is damaged. It is necessary to consider natural or man-made disasters that affect settlements and cause significant material and moral losses, not as an event itself, but as a result.

This perspective is also extremely important in terms of social work, and the results of the event should be seen as the starting point in all processes of planning, implementing and evaluating social work intervention in disaster situations.

The magnitude of disasters, the measures to be taken before the disaster on the basis of scientific knowledge, and effective and systematic interventions after the disaster are important in terms of quickly eliminating or mitigating the effects of these disasters. In our Anatolia, which has a lot of risky areas, it is necessary to create social awareness against disasters, in other words, a "disaster culture" in the society.

Disaster management is basically a broad concept that requires the organization of all institutions, organizations and resources of the society in order to direct, coordinate and implement the work to be done by following the steps to be addressed in order to prevent natural or human-made disasters and reduce their damage. Activities related to disaster events; mitigation, pre-preparation, recovery and first aid, recovery and reconstruction. The pre-preparation phase is essentially the most vital and scientific process, and it includes efforts to eliminate the consequences of disaster hazards that may have negative effects on people, by taking countermeasures, in a timely manner, in the most appropriate way, with the most effective organization and methods.

In the post-disaster days, it is of vital importance to meet the basic needs of the people living in that region and to restore them to their physical, mental and social health. After disaster response; The main purpose of the works carried out during the recovery phase is to ensure that individuals, families and communities; communication, transportation, water, electricity, education, long-term temporary residence, economic and social activities, etc. It is the realization of all interventions in order to meet their extremely important needs such as the main purpose of the "reconstruction" phase is the reconstruction of all destroyed or damaged structures; It includes activities that spread to areas such as restoring the economic, social and spiritual integrity of the society that has been disrupted due to the disaster.

The distress of the people who are exposed to it is at the highest level at the stage when the disaster occurs and the negativity and destruction are experienced with all their intensity. Shock, fear and bewilderment are common at this stage. The post-disaster phase begins when the affected people find time to reconsider the situation they face and think about what happened to them. The person feels lucky to have survived. Many people and organizations in the community are helping. He/She is also eager to rebuild his life. As time progresses, the inability to meet the needs adequately leads to emotional reactions such as anger, fear, loss of confidence, addiction or anxiety. The last stage of the process after the disaster is the "return to new normal life stage". People who have lost their job, home, loved ones, and have suffered emotional changes after the disaster may experience problems in family communication and marriage, not being able to accept their changing situation, mental problems, turning to crime, drug and alcohol use habits and similar problems.

Psycho-social effects of disasters, which create significant changes in people's physical environment, on individuals and families are loss of income, loss of home, breaking of social ties, insecurity about the future, anxiety and stress, difficulties in coping with multiple systems and socio-psychological effects caused by losses. While all members of a family who lost their relatives experience psychological problems after the disaster, the family as a whole may remain in economic deprivation, the education of the children is disrupted, the family may be deprived of their relatives, relatives, neighbors, in other words, social support systems because they have to leave the place where they live and settle in another place. The family-oriented social work intervention will only be effective and beneficial with a holistic and multi-level assessment of problems and emerging needs.



FEBRUARY INTERVIEW

Academician and Translator Sinem Canım:

"The use of machine translation in the industry is increasing, and the need for translators who make post-translation corrections will increase..."

First of all, we would like to thank you for accepting our FoAS Monthly e-Bulletin interview request. Can you tell us about yourself and your entry into the sector?

Hello. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to meet with you and your readers. Between 2001 and 2005, I was an undergraduate student at the Department of English Translation and Interpretation of Istanbul University and entered the sector while I was still a student. Initially, I worked as a freelance translator, then worked as an original copywriter and translator as an assistant editor at an advertising agency in Sultanahmet. In the summer of 2004, I worked as an intern in a translation company in Taksim. Then I became a permanent translator of the same company in 2005. Our paths diverged after I joined the academy in December 2005, but since then I have been doing written translations for various translation companies as a freelance translator.

Sinem CANIM - Academician and Translator

Could you please tell our readers about the translation industry?

I had experience in the Turkish translation industry and some in the American translation industry. I think both are sectors that are open to innovation and development. Especially large enterprises are taking important steps in translation technology and institutionalization. In large enterprises, there are different departments such as human resources, accounting, customer relationship management, job descriptions are clear and not everyone has to do every job. This is a very valuable development. The translator is doing the translation, the proofreader is like the proofreading. Because I was compelled to translate in a private field that I did not want to specialize in at a company I worked for, and this significantly reduced my enthusiasm for translation. Afterwards, I said goodbye to permanent translator. In the Turkish market, working as a translator was not very attractive to me at that time. But I hope a lot has changed since then. There is also a general complaint, unfortunately I still hear. The figures paid to translators in the Turkish market are very low. This was one of the reasons why I quit my job as a translator. In other words, both conditions are heavy and wages are low. As such, graduates either turn to other jobs, work remotely abroad, or work as translators in companies of foreign origin. The Turkish market needs to go a little further in order to look attractive to our graduates.

What do you think about the translation technologies that translators frequently use? What are the translation technologies that translator candidates should know and use?

First of all, there are a limited number of types, but a large number of brands. I always emphasize to my students that you cannot specialize in the use of products from all brands. But try and compare one or two brand-manufactured products of a particular type of technological tool. I'm being a bit of a guide here. I take a few of them to class and ask them to do homework on these tools. Afterwards, they are curious about the products of other brands and continue on their way.

In my opinion, office software is indispensable for every profession, term management software, optical character recognition software, translation management/translation memory systems, machine translation systems, as well as conscious use of the internet are important. Localization software, if the person has the motivation to work in the localization field.

Does the knowledge of these technologies affect the recruitment process of a translator who is about to enter the translation industry?

No doubt! Of course, in-service trainings are provided in businesses, but it should not be easy to give training to someone who has no background at all.

In extraordinary times (such as pandemics and natural disasters), many sectors are affected, how do you think the translation sector is affected by these situations?

In my opinion, the increase in communication flow and information production also increases the work flow in the translation industry. No matter what disaster happens in the world, the need for international communication never goes away. Production is slowing down, and accordingly, the text production of the production sector is slowing down and the need for translation is also slowing down. However, the flow of communication and information never stops.

After two major earthquake disasters centered in Kahramanmaraş, where our country lives, and affecting 11 provinces, distance education was passed with the decision of YÖK, how do you think our students will adapt to translation technologies education in this process? What would you recommend our students to have a more effective learning process?

Technology teaching with distance education is not something we are familiar with. Our teachers are experienced from the pandemic period. Due to the possibilities of IU, I have been teaching information technologies in translation for many years without using a computer laboratory. I have developed a functioning teaching system. I had concerns at first, but my students adapted easily. During the lesson, I make an example of the application we will use for my students. I offer both theoretical explanation and demo. Then I give them tasks and ask them to do these tasks at home using the relevant application on their computers. In the next lesson, I want them to tell about their experience while using the application and what they have learned or failed to learn.

Sinem CANIM - Academician and Translator

Finally, what are your suggestions and recommendations for prospective translators who are about to graduate and who are interested in the translation industry to improve themselves in translation technologies?

Let them improve themselves in project management, machine translation, localization, content development and translation memory systems. The use of machine translation in the industry is increasing, and the need for translators who make corrections after machine translation will increase even more. Project management is an alternative line of business, and we have graduates who are happy to work as remote project managers for American translation companies. Localization and content development are also on the rise. Finally, translation memory systems have been an indispensable part of written technical translation for many years, one or two tools must be experienced. You can start with free software. In addition, vehicle manufacturers sign a cooperation agreement with universities, allowing free use of the vehicle for educational purposes. Students can request this from their instructors, and our instructors can contact the relevant vehicle manufacturer and inquire whether this is possible.

Clash of the Cuisines: Portugal and Türkiye

Hello, I am Gizem Hülağa Kaderoğlu, Research Assistant at Istanbul Gelisim University, FoAS Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department. In this episode, I would like to share my visit to ESAD-College of Art and Design in Porto, Portugal, as part of Erasmus+ Staff Mobility and my experiences there

On my journey that started from Turkey, I went to Porto with a transfer in Lisbon. After the tiring but enjoyable journey, I met coordinator Mr. Antonino Jorge at university. An orientation presentation was prepared with the participation of participants from different countries. In the presentation, the coordinator included general information about their universities. information. campus their collaborations and opportunities. After the orientation presentation, I joined the campus tour with the coordinator and other participants. Within the scope of the tour, classrooms, workshops, laboratories were toured and brief information was given about the workshop and laboratory practices. After the trip, we went to the Erasmus+ office, where there was a detailed presentation showing the faculty campuses.



One of the reasons I chose Porto, or rather Portugal, was my curiosity about Portuguese cuisine, especially its famous wines, which is a Mediterranean country like Türkiye. I think that I should mention the similarity to the Mediterranean cuisine in terms of gastronomy within the academic framework. Although I have examined many studies that focus on the similar and different aspects of both cuisines from a theoretical perspective, being caught in the Mediterranean wind and experiencing this culture, food and people on-site thanks to Erasmus+ mobility has made a real contribution to my academic experience. I recommend that people who want to gain experience abroad by benefiting from this program—staff, academics or students—prefer countries that can touch their lives and develop their vision.



Man's Search for Meaning - Viktor Emil Frankl

If you want to lead a beautiful life, find a meaning in life or create a meaning for yourself. Man's Search for Meaning, which was first published in 1946, translated into more than thirty languages and reached more than 12 million people, is among the educational and reference books in the field of psychology. The book describes the experiences of neurologist and psychiatrist Viktor Emil Frankl in the Auschwitz-Birkenau Nazi concentration camp during the Second World War and the principles of Logo therapy that he established as a result of his experiences.



The first part of the book, which consists of two parts, is the autobiographical part where Frankl shares his experiences in the concentration camp and his observations based on his experiences. In the second part, Logotherapy, which is the combination of the Greek words "logos" meaning "meaning" and "therapy" meaning "healing", is explained. Viktor Emil FRANKL states that the meaning of life can be discovered in three ways: First, by creating a work or by doing a job. Second, by experiencing something or encountering a person. Third, by the attitude we take towards it in the face of inevitable suffering.

Man's Search for Meaning, which has left unforgettable traces for many people who read it, is a bedside book that aims to contribute to the search for meaning in life, guiding people to keep them alive despite all kinds of pain, despair and hopelessness.


Understanding Post-earthquake Psychological Reactions and Self-Help Methods - Claudia Herbert

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
EARTHQUAKE GUIDE

IF YOU ARE BUILDING AT THE TIME OF EARTHQUAKE;

- Try to stay calm.
- Create a life triangle by crouching under the table supported by solid chairs, if any, or next to items that can provide protection such as armchairs and sofas.
- Stay away from areas that are most damaged by an earthquake, such as balconies, elevators, windows, door sills and stairs.
- Stay away from unfixed cabinets, shelves and white goods.
- Do not try to leave the building before the shaking is over.
- Do not light matches, lighters, or touch electrical switches.

IF YOU ARE OUTDOOR AT THE TIME OF EARTHQUAKE;

- .
- Move away from power lines and poles, trees, other buildings, and under walls.
- Do not stay under slopes where landslides may occur, stones or rocks may fall.
- Be wary of chimneys, broken glass and plaster that may fall from buildings.
- Be careful against dangers from underground sewerage, electricity and gas lines
- Get away from the seaside.



WHAT SHOULD BE IN THE DISASTER AND EMERGENCY BAG?

- Food (High-calorie, vitamin and carbohydrate-containing foods that prevent water loss and are durable).
- Photocopies of important documents
- Clothes
- Hygiene materials
- Other supplies (First aid kit, Sleeping bag or blanket, pocketknife, whistle, small scissors, paper, pen, battery radio, flashlight and spare batteries)

WHAT ARE SAFE PLACES IN YOUR HOME?

One of the most important measures in earthquakes is knowing which parts of the houses are safer. While the rooms where the overturned objects are located are dangerous, you should also protect yourself from the objects that will fall on your head during the shaking. That's why it's vital that you identify safe places in your home ahead of time.

Generally, the outer walls of apartments are dangerous. Try to stay away from these places during an earthquake. Corridors are often safer as they are surrounded by interior walls.

Places where there are objects (paintings on the wall, ornaments, bookshelves, etc.) that will fall on your head during the shaking,

furniture that can be knocked over,

Window sills are dangerous as they are both external walls and their glass may break. Identify the safest places in your home with your family!
