

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ISTANBUL GELISIM UNIVERSITY IS 16TH IN THE WORLD AND 1ST IN TURKEY IN THE FIELD OF "QUALITY EDUCATION"!

Times Higher Education (THE), the ranking institution of world universities, has been announced the Impact Ranking of 2022. Among the 1180 universities in the world, Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) increased its success ranking, which was 24 last year, to 16th place in the category of "Quality Education" by increasing 8 steps this year. It continued to maintain its success last year, ranking 1st among Turkish universities.

The success of Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) was ranked in five different categories in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, in the list of 1406 universities, which are listed in the 2022 ranking of the UK-based, world's leading higher education rating agency, Times Higher Education (THE). In the Impact Ranking 2022 list, Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) increased its degree from 24th to 16th among 1180 world universities in the "Quality Education" category, while maintaining its 1st place among Turkish universities.

5 ACHIEVEMENTS FROM 5 DIFFERENT CATEGORIES

In the ranking carried out in line with the categories in 17 fields determined by the United Nations within the scope of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), Istanbul Gelisim University is among the universities of Turkey, with its studies in the field of education, innovative projects and its contributions to the society;

- SDG4: Ranked 1st in Turkey in the Quality Education category,
- SDG7: Ranked 4th in Turkey in Accessible and Clean Energy category,
- SDG3: Ranked 12th in Turkey in the category of Healthy and Quality Life,
- SDG6: Ranked 12th in Turkey in the category of Clean Water and Sanitation
- SDG17: Ranked 24th in Turkey in the Partnerships for Purposes category, it proved itself in many areas such as lifelong learning practices, community-oriented learning, personal development opportunities, quality and sustainability of the education provided.


The fields in which our university stands out both in terms of research quality and research intensity. Its ranking among Turkish universities are given in the table below.

“The 2nd Workshop on Sustainability in Teaching Turkish as a Foreign Language in the 21st Century”

“The 2nd Workshop on Sustainability in Teaching Turkish as a Foreign Language in the Twenty-First Century” was organized by Istanbul Gelişim University, Turkish and Foreign Language Application and Research Center. After Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin, Prof. Dr. Abdurrahman Güzel made protocol speeches at the workshop. In the workshop consisting of two sessions, 8 commissions and 8 topics were discussed.

It was established to teach Turkish to foreign students coming from abroad to study in higher education institutions, to organize courses in foreign languages, and to work on necessary documentation and materials. After the first workshop held in 2022 by the Turkish and Foreign Language Application and Research Center, the “2nd Workshop on Sustainability in Teaching Turkish as a Foreign Language in the Twenty-First Century” was held on June 15, 2023. The workshop, which included 64 participants from 25 different universities from Turkey, consisted of two sessions, and was based on 8 commissions and 8 topics. In the workshop, problems encountered in teaching Turkish as a foreign language under various headings and solutions were discussed. In the workshop, the problems encountered in institutions where Turkish is taught as a foreign language and solutions were discussed. The problems encountered in the use of approaches, methods, techniques and solutions were discussed. Problems encountered in preparing and using materials and solutions were discussed. It is aimed to make general evaluations from the workshop outputs and to report them and present them to the relevant authorities.

Earthquake Safety of Infrastructure Systems: The Example of Kahramanmaraş Earthquake

Infrastructure systems are an integral part of developed societies. With the increasing population, the need for infrastructure systems continues to increase. With infrastructure systems, we can transport many resources such as drinking water, waste water, natural gas, oil. The use of pipelines has many advantages such as low operating costs and no safety problems. However, it is critical for the continuity of societies that these systems become resistant to natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, landslides. In the recent past, the Northridge (1994), Kobe (1995), Kocaeli (1999), Tohoku (2011), Christchurch (2011), and finally the 7.7Mw Pazarcık and 7.6Mw Elbistan earthquakes on 6 February 2023 have caused great damage to the infrastructure systems.

Damages occurred in drinking water, waste water, natural gas pipelines, treatment plants and pumping stations in 11 provinces affected by the earthquake, including Kahramanmaraş, Gaziantep and Hatay. Due to the damage to the water intake structures and drinking water pipelines, many cities could not receive water after the earthquake. The importance of water lines for the survival of search and rescue efforts and the people affected by the earthquake has emerged once again. Both land conditions and weather conditions made it difficult to reach many damage points. According to the records of Gaziantep Water and Sewerage Administration (GASKİ), a total of 116167 drinking water and wastewater damage was intervened in the province between 6 February and 31 May 2023. According to the records of Kahramanmaraş Water and Sewerage Administration (KASKİ), 775 drinking water and 955 waste water pipeline failures were intervened between 21-28 April.

In addition to the damages in the distribution networks, a large number of damages occurred in the transmission lines.

In addition to the intensive work and successful operations of the water administrations (GASKİ, KASKİ, HATSU, etc.) of the provinces in the earthquake zone, many water administrations of Turkey (İSKİ, KOSKİ, etc.) have been active in the region and have ensured that the cities get water again. In addition to drinking water and waste water pipelines, natural gas pipelines were also damaged.

Kahramanmaraş earthquakes have shown us again that the continuity of infrastructure systems and structures has a critical importance after the earthquake. Scientific studies to be carried out in the region will be a guide for building resistant cities against future earthquakes.



CONSENT OF SPOUSE IN BAIL CONTRACT



Obtaining the consent of the spouse of the surety in surety agreements is one of the new regulations introduced by the TCO No. 6098. The aim here is to ensure the sustainability of commercial relations and at the same time to protect the guarantor if the guarantor is not aware of the obligation he has undertaken. It is clear that if the guarantor does not fulfill his debt, his family will also be affected. Although the family is not related to the main debt relationship, it is aimed to protect the family unity with the arrangement regarding the consent of the spouse, since the surety may be affected by this debt and the family unity may be shaken.

In Article 169/2 of the abrogated Civil Code No. 743, it was regulated that the permission of the Magistrate was required for the dispositions to be made by one of the spouses. With the Turkish Civil Code No. 4721, the permission to be given by the judge was tied to the request of the other spouse. It is possible to say that this arrangement is much more appropriate. Based on this regulation, it was argued in the doctrine that before the regulation in the TCO, it would be possible for the surety's spouse to limit the actions of the surety with the permission of the judge for surety contracts. We can say that these discussions came to an end with the regulation in the TCO No. 6098.

Article 584 of the TCO No. 6098 seeks the consent of the spouse before the bail contract is established or at the latest at the time of the conclusion of the contract. Article 584/2 of the TCO regulates the exceptional cases in which the consent of the spouse is not sought with the provision that 'The changes made later in the surety contract that do not cause an increase in the amount for which the surety will be liable, or that the ordinary surety will turn into several guarantees or that the guarantees for the benefit of the surety will not significantly decrease'.





In addition, with Article 77 of the Law No. 6455, the cases where the consent of the spouse is not sought has been expanded. Accordingly, article 584/3 of the TCO is as follows: The consent of the spouse is not required for the guarantees to be given by the owner of the commercial enterprise registered in the trade registry or the partner or manager of the trade company in relation to the business or company, and the guarantees to be given by the tradesmen or craftsmen registered in the tradesmen and craftsmen registry in relation to their professional activities, Guarantees to be given for loans to be used within the scope of the Law on the Use of Interest Supported Credits Executed by State-owned Banks, dated 27/12/2006 and numbered 5570, and guarantees to be given in loans to be extended to cooperative members by public institutions and organizations.

A subsequent change in the marital status of the spouses will not make the invalid bail contract valid. For example, if the current spouse's consent was not obtained at the time of signing the surety agreement and the surety later divorced his spouse, this situation does not make the invalid guarantee agreement valid due to the consent of the spouse.

Pursuant to article 584 of the TCO, if the surety is married, obtaining the consent of his spouse is a condition of validity for the surety agreement. In addition, in order for the surety agreement to be valid, the written consent of the spouse of the surety must be obtained. It is sufficient that the consent of the spouse is declared and signed in ordinary written form, and the condition of qualified form or official form is not sought.

Article 584/3 of the TCO clearly regulates that the spouse's consent must be given before the conclusion of the surety agreement or at the latest during the conclusion of the contract. The consent of the spouse will not be valid after the surety has made the contract, and the spouse's subsequent approval will not make the contract valid. The aforementioned regulation regulates the status of the guarantor being married at the time of the conclusion of the contract. In this respect, the fact that the consent of the guarantor's spouse was not obtained at the time of the conclusion of the contract will not change the invalidity of the contract in case of divorce after the conclusion of the contract.

In accordance with Article 584/2 of the TCO, changes such as increasing the maximum amount that the guarantor is responsible for, converting the ordinary bail to joint bail or significantly reducing the guarantees for the guarantor's benefit will lead to an increase in the guarantor's responsibility, and in such cases, the consent of the spouse will be sought. It is necessary to understand the situations that will aggravate the responsibility of the guarantor from the expression "significant reduction of guarantees" in the article.


It is possible to establish a surety agreement between the spouses, that is, one of the spouses is the creditor and the other is the surety. In such a case, the creditor spouse may not want the spouse to be the surety for the principal debtor who owes him. However, if he has established a surety agreement with his wife and his wife has become a guarantor for the principal debtor, in this case, the invalidity of the surety agreement should not be resorted to on the grounds that the spouse's consent is not available.

It is also possible for a person to be a guarantor for his spouse's debt. There are different views in the doctrine as to whether the consent of the spouse should be sought in this situation where one of the spouses is the principal debtor and the other is the guarantor. According to one view, if a person is a guarantor for his spouse's debt, the consent of the spouse who is the main debtor is not sought. Here, a surety contract is made for the benefit of the principal debtor spouse. However, another view argues that in such a case, the consent of the spouse who is the principal debtor should be obtained. Because the spouse who is under the obligation as the main debtor may not want his spouse to be under an obligation again as a guarantor.

According to the last view, this situation should be evaluated from two perspectives. First of all, if the surety agreement and the main debt agreement are in the same text and are signed together, in such a case, it will not be incompatible with the honesty rule to invalidate the surety due to the lack of consent of the spouse who is the main debtor. However, if the surety agreement is to be concluded after the original debt agreement, the consent of the spouse, who is the main debtor, must be obtained. In our opinion, it is necessary to obtain the consent of the other spouse, as the responsibility of the other spouse as well as the main debtor spouse will create a double burden in terms of the family economy.

It is also possible for the spouses to jointly guarantor for the same debt. Considering the purpose of TCO Article 584 to protect the marriage union, in such a case, it would be appropriate to obtain the consent of the other spouse for the validity of each spouse's bail.

A seminar on "Structural System Design Principles and Common Mistakes According to TDBY 2018" was held within the System Analysis course on 29.05.2023 by IGVS Construction Technology program. With the invitation of lecturer Yasemin KILIÇ ERDİM, Civil Engineer Dr. Rıza TORKAN attended the event as a speaker, and the things to be considered in the design of the structural system according to the earthquake regulation that came into force in 2018 were explained through the static calculation program. Common mistakes made during the designs were examined. Students' questions were answered.

The event called "Kahramanmaraş Earthquakes Field Observations" within the scope of the IGVS, Construction Technology program was carried out by Lect. Muhammet ÇEYLAN, who took part in the post-earthquake studies.
