IGU's Rise in URAP World University Rankings Continues!

The '2022-2023 World Area Ranking 2022-2023' data prepared by METU University Ranking by Academic Performance Laboratory (URAP), where universities with the highest academic performance are ranked, has been published. According to the report prepared by taking into account the "World's Best Universities" lists, Istanbul Gelisim University rose 492 places to 2299th in the world and 73rd among Turkish universities.

URAP Research Laboratory listed the best universities in the world according to different fields of science in the 2022-2023 field ranking, which was prepared to draw attention to the strengths and aspects of universities open to improvement. The impact of universities' articles, total documents and citations in the relevant field and international cooperation criteria were the main criteria used in the URAP field rankings. In the report, in which 206 higher education institutions from Turkey were evaluated, IGU continued its successful rise in the list since 2020.

Ranked 73rd among Turkish universities

Ranked 2791st in the world in the '2021-2022 World Area Ranking' data, IGU rose 492 places in the newly published '2022-2023 World Area Ranking' report and ranked 2299th in the list. Istanbul Gelisim University, which showed this successful rise in the world rankings in the list of universities in Turkey, rose 60 places compared to the previous year's data and ranked 73rd in Turkey.





International Youth Day is celebrated on August 12 every year in order to raise awareness about the problems of youth by addressing these problems. The United Nations General Assembly adopted the recommendation of the World Conference of Youth Ministers in 1999 to declare 12 August as International Youth Day. The Youth Day celebrations, which took place for the first time in 2000, later turned into an organization that takes place every year on a world scale.

This year's theme of World Youth Day, which has been working on different themes since 2000, is "Green Skills for Youth: Towards a Sustainable World". Specifically, this theme was chosen because of the need to strengthen the capacity of the international system to act together and implement solutions to pressing challenges and threats. With this year's theme, International Youth Day focuses on green skills and sustainability and aims to evaluate how young people's participation at local, global and national levels can be significantly increased for a sustainable environment

Developing these skills is important for promoting sustainability, tackling climate change and protecting the environment.

According to United Nations world population estimates, 16 percent of the world's population consists of young people between the ages of 15 and 24, and there are approximately 1.2 billion young people worldwide. By 2030, the target date of the UN Sustainable Development Goals, it is estimated that the number of young people will increase by 7 percent and reach approximately 1.3 billion. YOUNG ENTREPRENEUR and FOUNDER of uzmancoin.com: BURAK KÖSE "Many opportunities come from new trends, and those who recognize those trends in time are one step ahead".

Thank you for accepting our interview request for FoAS Monthly e-Bulletin. First of all, could you tell us a little bit about yourself? As a young entrepreneur, how did you decide to establish Uzmancoin?

After graduating from university, I started my first journalism experience at Fanatik Newspaper's internet service. I worked there for about 6-7 years. The time I spent there contributed significantly understanding of the dynamics of internet journalism. I have also been following technology trends closely since the past. My interest in this field led me to meet Blockchain technology and of course Bitcoin in 2017. As I wanted to deepen my research, I realized the inadequacy of Turkish resources. Thus, I launched Uzmancoin, one of the first in Turkey. My intention was to help those like me who could not get answers to their questions and at the same time provide an accurate, up-to-date and fast news flow to those interested.





What do you think about young people's use of new media tools? Are they using them correctly? Is there a roadmap you can suggest for them to seize the opportunities?

This is a very important and topical issue, but to say that new media tools are being used "correctly" or "incorrectly" can be very relative. Just like everything has its pros and cons, new media tools have their own advantages and disadvantages. Thanks to social media, young people are becoming more aware of world events and can express their creativity on various platforms. However, they need to be careful about time management. Also, safety and privacy is an important issue. It is very important for young people to understand that they should not share information that could expose them or their families to dangerous situations.

Here is a roadmap I would suggest for them to take advantage of the opportunities: They should definitely get digital literacy training. This will enable them to critically evaluate the information they receive in an online world full of information garbage and manipulation. On the other hand, I recommend them to manage their time properly when using new media tools. They should not overdo it. And of course, they should keep their perception open when it comes to following trends. Many opportunities arise from new trends, and those who recognize those trends in time are one step ahead.

Does the consumption of information flow between generations X-Y-Z increase the intergenerational knowledge and perception gap?

KDefinitely, there are noticeable differences in information consumption between generations X, Y and Z. The main drivers of these differences are often the rapid advancement of technology and the socio-cultural dynamics that shape the zeitgeist. For example, while radio, television and newspapers may be the first sources of information that come to mind for Generation X, Generation Y has experienced the golden age of the internet and has grown up with blogs and social media channels. For Generation Z, the situation is much more radical, with an almost completely digitized life. Platforms such as TikTok and Instagram can influence young people's worldview even with fast-consuming 'micro-information'.

These diverse information consumption habits, of course, lead to a generational shift in perspective. For example, for Generation Z, accessing information on a topic is almost at their fingertips, but this speed also makes it difficult to do in-depth research or analysis. Generation X, on the other hand, is perhaps slower but has the opportunity for deeper information discovery, as they may have accessed this information through more traditional sources, what we call 'slow media'.



These generational differences in information consumption certainly create a 'gap of understanding'. But it is important to remember that this is only one of many factors that contribute to the differences. So yes, this diversity in information consumption is certainly widening the gaps between generations.

Within the scope of new media, it can be said that the openness of social media to the content production of its users and the increase in their sphere of influence have started to reduce the demand for traditional media. What are your thoughts on this subject? Which areas would you advise young people to turn to?

Traditional media is undergoing a major transformation and this transformation started 20 years ago. It is still going on. Traditional media organizations are trying to keep up with this transformation and I can say that some of them have succeeded.

On the other hand, I disagree with the idea that traditional means of communication will eventually disappear completely and everything will exist on the internet. Radios, magazines, newspapers still exist and will continue to be in our lives. Television is still number one in reaching the masses with information. Therefore, there will always be opportunities in these areas.

As for social media being open to users' content production, yes, this affects the dynamics of traditional media. Now anyone can have a YouTube channel, write a blog or reach thousands of people on Instagram with a smartphone. So we are experiencing a democratic evolution in terms of journalism and content production, but at the same time the risk of disinformation and the spread of poor quality content has increased. In this environment, I think the value of communicators who use new media tools effectively, question, research, look critically and have a principled approach will increase.

My advice to friends would be this: If they are considering a career in media and communications, it would be a good way to diversify their skills, both to understand traditional media mechanisms and to be able to use new media tools effectively. I would advise them to be creative, understand technology and data analytics and develop their skills, especially in storytelling.







What are your suggestions for students who are about to graduate or have already graduated to use new media tools more effectively and efficiently?


In addition to producing written content, I recommend them to be competent in different formats such as video and visual editing, podcast creation. Data analytics is a field that is becoming more and more important every day and they can see great benefits when they acquire this skill. It is necessary to learn at least basic data analytics to understand which types of content get more engagement. This will help them shape their content strategy. In addition, as we just mentioned, they may not get the results they initially hoped for, as every social media user is competing with every other social media user when it comes to content production. Therefore, it is important to produce content persistently. If possible, it is even better to create a content calendar. Finally, I would say that social media is an opportunity not only to produce content, but also to build a community and interact with other people. Keeping this in mind, interacting with them will pave the way for them to reach a much wider audience after a while.

An Erasmus+ Experience in a Balkan State

Hello, I am Nevra Üçler, Research Assistant at Istanbul Gelişim University, FoAS Public Relations and Advertising Department. I would like to share with you my visit to the University of Business Academy in Novi Sad in Belgrade, the capital of Serbia, as part of Erasmus+ Staff Mobility, and my experiences there.

I was able to provide transportation to the city of Belgrade after a long journey by transferring from Istanbul to Ankara. Although my journey was tiring, it was enjoyable, I was experiencing the excitement of seeing a new country. We had a program before the mobility with Prof. Dr. Dragan Ćalović, Erasmus+ coordinator, Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts. In line with this program, I first interviewed him. Ćalović informed about the departments, curricula, applied courses of the university and the practical courses of the faculty, and shared information about the exhibition they were preparing to evaluate them. Likewise, I informed them about the curriculum, applied courses, internship and other education and training activities of Istanbul Gelisim University FoAS Department of Public Relations and Advertising. During this process, I had the opportunity to exchange ideas about applied courses and possible future collaborations.



Located at the intersection of the Danube and Sava rivers, Belgrade is a city that should be visited with its nature, history and cultural heritage. This city, which hosts many visitors especially due to its visa-free travel opportunity and its proximity to Turkey, is becoming the focus of attention of tourists because it is called the gate of Europe. 

The Call of Cthulhu / H.P. Lovecraft

"The Call of Cthulhu" by American author H.P. It is a short story written by Lovecraft. The work was first published in "Weird Tales", one of the underground magazines, in 1928. It is considered one of Lovecraft's most iconic and influential works and is one of the foundational works of the cosmic horror genre.

The story is a series of interconnected narratives presented as a series of documents and narratives compiled by an anonymous narrator. These descriptions have been obtained from various sources and contain different information about the mysterious and malevolent entity known as Cthulhu.



Madness from the Sea: In the last part of the story, the life of a Norwegian sailor named Gustaf Johansen is told. His diaries detail the horrific events that took place during his journey to R'lyeh and his discovery of the sunken city and the gigantic, nightmarish entity, Cthulhu. Johansen's account reveals that Cthulhu is asleep but not dead, and his existence is incomprehensible to human understanding. "The Call of Cthulhu" is most famous for Lovecraft's creation of the Cthulhu Myth, a fictional universe that characterizes the effects of ancient and extraterrestrial powerful beings and the insignificance of humanity in the face of these cosmic horrors. Lovecraft's style deals with the unknown and the unspeakable, revealing the fear and dread of the unknown.

Overall, "The Call of Cthulhu" is an eye-opening book that has left a lasting impression on horror literature, inspiring countless writers, filmmakers, and artists to explore themes such as cosmic horror, existential horror, and the limits of human understanding in the face of vast, ancient and reckless cosmic forces. is work.

Frankenstein ya da Modern Prometheus/Mary Shelley

Time Regulation Institute/Ahmet Hamdi Tanpınar

The novel enters the inner world of the protagonist Hayri İrdal, revealing his inner struggles and his disappointment with the world he finds himself in. Tanpınar deftly depicts the psychological complexities of his characters, offering insights into the emotional tolls of an orderly lifestyle. He criticizes how the people in the novel are inclined towards superstitions, how they try to make easy money by dealing with alchemy, stealing, and claiming undeserved inheritances instead of having a profession and earning money.



Translation Studies Reader/Lawrence Venuti

This anthology translation, edited by Lawrence Venuti, is one of the main works in the field of his studies and consists of various articles covering various theoretical approaches and historical periods. By bringing together various perspectives, Venuti allows readers to explore the key concepts that have shaped and still dominate translation studies, the role of the translator, and the impact of power dynamics in translation. Chinese SF Cargo Announces New Route...

SF Airlines, China's largest air cargo carrier by fleet, has launched a new air cargo route connecting Port Moresby, the capital of Papua New Guinea, with Shenzhen in southern China. The Shenzhen-Port Moresby route, launched on Sunday, is SF Airlines' first cargo route to reach Oceania, expanding its global air cargo service network covering Asia, Europe and North America, the company said in a statement. Headquartered in Shenzhen, SF Airlines is the aviation branch of SF Express, China's leading courier organization. SF Airlines operates a fleet of 84 cargo aircraft connecting more than 90 destinations at home and abroad.

IC Holding's Airport Move in Vietnam...

A consortium including Turkish company IC Holding has won the tender for the \$1.5 billion first phase of the Long Thanh International Airport in Vietnam's Dong Nai province. The project details for the airport, which will be built right on the coast of Ho Chi Minh City, the most populous city of the country, have become clear. The Long Thanh International Airport in Dong Nai province, which will be built with a project worth 336 trillion Vietnamese Dong, approximately 15 billion dollars, will be completed in stages in 2025. The tender process for the first phase of the airport, which will have a total capacity of 100 million passengers, was completed recently.
