IGU Continues Its Rise in Webometrics World University Rankings!

"Webometrics World University Rankings" have been announced, aiming to promote academic web presence by supporting "Open Access" initiatives to significantly increase the transfer of scientific and cultural knowledge produced by universities to the entire society.

While we continue our efforts to quickly achieve the results we aim for in our internationalization journey, our university, which has continued its rise for the last four years, is ranked 2278th in the world; it ranked 54th among Turkish universities and 12th among foundation universities.

Our university, which progresses with the vision of "Research University", is in the Webometrics Continental rankings;

- 132nd among CIVETS countries (including countries such as Colombia, Indonesia, Vietnam, Egypt, Turkey and South Africa),
- 183rd in the Middle East university rankings,
- 804th among European universities,
- Listed as 806th among Asian universities.

On February 11, International Day of Women and Girls in Science...

On 22 December 2015, the 81st United Nations General Assembly decided to observe 11 February each year as the International Day of Women and Girls in Science to promote the participation of women and girls in education and research in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM).

In her message published on March 8, 2022, UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay stated that according to UNESCO estimates, women represent only one out of every three researchers. In her message, Azoulay also emphasized the importance of making more efforts to achieve gender equality worldwide.

Especially in 2020 and 2021, when the Covid 19 pandemic was at its peak, the closure of schools and the implementation of the work-from-home system have shown that gender inequality has also increased significantly worldwide. One of the most important reasons for this is the social roles and responsibilities imposed on women. This inequality leads to lower publication rates and less visibility.

The theme of the 6th International Day of Women and Girls in Science Assembly, which took place at the United Nations Headquarters on February 11, 2021, was 'Women Scientists at the Forefront of the Fight against COVID-19'. The gender inequality that has persisted for years all over the world has been felt at all levels of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) disciplines. Although women have made tremendous progress over the years in increasing their participation in higher education, they are still underrepresented in these fields.

Ar proving to the information on the United Nations website for the February 11 ' premational Day of Women and Girls in Science;

- Women are often awarded smaller research grants than their male counterparts and only 12% of members of national academies of science are women, despite representing 33.3% of all researchers.
- Only a fifth (22%) of professionals in high-tech fields such as artificial intelligence are women.
- Despite the shortage in many of the technological fields driving the Fourth Industrial Revolution, women still make up only 28% of engineering graduates and 40% of computer science and informatics graduates.
- Women researchers tend to have shorter and less well-paid careers. Their work is underrepresented in high-profile journals and often overlooked for promotion (https://www.un.org/en/observances/women-and-girls-in-science-day, accessed February 26, 2024).

Given the data from UNESCO and the United Nations, it is our responsibility to ensure that girls have access to the education they deserve and can build a future for themselves in engineering, computer programming, cloud technology, robotics and health sciences.



Although William begins to think that the first murder was a suicide, a second death occurs in the monastery. The murders and clues that took place in the monastery try to take William and his assistant Adso to the library, but entering the library during this period is strictly prohibited due to the influence of scholastic thought. While trying to break this ban, the librarian assistant comes across as the third death. When William and Adso investigate the murders more deeply, they realize that the reason for all the murders is a forbidden book. Now all they have to do is find this forbidden book.

The Name of the Rose is a book that will stay with you for a long time after reading it. The fiction and narration of the book is fluent and although the book is long, it does not tire the reader. In the work, the philosophy, culture, contradictions and use of knowledge in the medieval period are reflected to the reader through the murder that took place in the monastery.






Fight for Bread - Orhan KEMAL


Yaban - Yakup Kadri KARAOSMANOĞLU



Against the Grain - - The Deep History of the Early States - James C. SCOTT

The work draws attention to the impact of grain, especially agriculture, on the formation and development of early states. Grain becomes the main food source of the communities that settled down with the Neolithic Age. This situation is directly associated with the emergence of the first states in the work. Grain became one of the main products of these new agricultural societies. The fact that grain is a constant and abundant food source enabled societies to move to larger and permanent settlements, and with the beginning of grain agriculture, changes occurred in the organization, management and resource distribution of societies.



Food and National Identity and Nationalism - Atsuko ICHIJO & Ronald RANTA

In the book, the relationship between food and nationalism is examined comprehensively in the context of nationalist politics and global capitalism. INTERVIEW

ŞEF ÇAĞKAN GÜNER:

"Everyone will want to look at a good photo, so why not be the one who frames the best one?"

Thank you for accepting our FoAS Monthly E-Bulletin interview request. Can you tell us about your process of becoming a food photographer?

We have a photography adventure before food photography. Because, food photography brings with it a technical knowledge. I discovered that I. was interested in photography, which I did as a hobby, when I was shooting the post-practice plates of the cookery I studied in high school. Afterwards, the process deepened even more with my research on subjects such as composition and food stylistics. I discovered that the process is directly related to gastronomy knowledge, kitchen equipment knowledge, color-contrast knowledge and most importantly light knowledge rather than what is seen. After researching these aspects one by one, I was taking plate and product photos with my own experiments. Later, I became more involved in food photography when I took menu photos of a cafe in Ankara. I am currently continuing to take plate and product images as a hobby.





INTERVIEW

What should be considered when photographing food? Lighting, camera, angle and background?

The main element of photographing food is to have a good command of light and composition. This is followed by knowledge of the camera, angle, props and background. You also need to follow new trends in food photography and be a good internet user.

What is the basis of good food photography and photography? How do you know when you have taken a good photo?

First of all, you need to have a very good knowledge of light. Then you need to design the plate and plan according to the emotion you want to give in the photo. A good food photographer often works with food stylists. Shooting tricks are often used while shooting. Contrary to popular belief, a lot of glue is used for an image of oats with strawberry yogurt, while glycerin sprays are used for a glass that looks like ice. When all this is filtered through information and light, we get a good photograph. When photographing food, the background and colors made according to the product are also important to create integrity with the plate. For example, imagine a copper-embroidered plate from the Ottoman period being photographed on a white background with facade light, and imagine it being photographed like a painting, diversified with warmer color tones and various accessories in the appropriate form... When you combine all these, what emotion do you see on the plate and if you are making a financial gain, attention should be paid to which aspects of the product the customer wants to highlight.

What can we gain by developing in the field of photography?

The world food and beverage industry has developed very fast in the digital age and continues to grow every day. A new product made by a chef in Tokyo is instantly watched and inspired by a chef in our country. Of course, there are so many visuals, the one we see is the most beautiful with its light and color. If we want to open up to the whole world, we should photograph and share what we do as a chef in the best way, and if you are a photographer, food photography is rapidly gaining momentum in the developing world.

What does developing in the field of food photography bring to our students? What are your suggestions and recommendations? Thank you very much for your time and comprehensive information in the FoAS Monthly E-Bulletin.

If you are already studying gastronomy, the photography education you will receive can be a tool to take you to different and high positions in the sector. Smartphones and computers are the tools of the digital world, and in the future, everyone will be recognized by their posts, and even now there are people who have become famous for products made at home or in the studio without working in any business. I think it will become even more important in the coming years, it may be useful to catch the train early. To summarize, everyone will want to look at a good photo, so why not be the one who frames the best one?

ERASMUS+

Hello, I am Assist. Prof. Dr. Ahmet Esad Yurtseven from Istanbul Gelişim University, Department of Management Information Systems. In this chapter, I would like to share with you my visit to University Business Academy in Novi Sad in Serbia within the scope of Erasmus+ Staff Teaching Mobility and my experiences here.

Within the scope of the ten-day mobility, I visited the university between October 16-27, 2023. Before reaching Serbia, I reached North Macedonia. I transferred from there and reached the region where the University is by bus. Then the located Erasmus+ coordinator made a presentation introducing the school, showing how many students they received within the scope of Erasmus, showing the campuses of the faculties on the map, etc. The Erasmus coordinator, who had visited Istanbul before, shared her experiences with me. Coordinator organized a joint trip with participants from different countries joining in mobility and showed me the workshops and laboratories. During the lecturina period. gave lectures on international product marketing to both undergraduate and graduate economics departments. At the end of the first week of the intensive lecturing period, I took the opportunity to visit Sarajevo on the weekend. On the way back, I took advantage of another opportunity to visit Skopje.



Since I had already visited Slovakia as a student, it was a different experience to participate in the mobility as a lecturer. I recommend that those who want to benefit from this program and gain experience abroad should choose countries that can touch their lives.


Van Gogh (March 17, 2024)

Youtube Celebrated the 19th Anniversary with 2.7 Billion Users...

YouTube, the video sharing platform that has completed its 19th anniversary, is the world's largest video sharing channel with 2.7 billion users. Founded in the USA by 3 entrepreneurs in 2005 and later acquired by Google, YouTube reached 2.7 billion active users by 2024. YouTube, which 52 percent of internet users use at least once a month, is visited 113 billion times a month. The platform's paid services, YouTube Premium and YouTube Music, are actively used by 100 million users worldwide. In the list of countries where YouTube is used most, India ranks first, while the USA ranks second. Turkey ranks 11th on the list. The platform has reached 2.7 billion active users and is expected to reach 2.85 billion next year.
