### WATER, ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY\*

The total surface area of the Earth is approximately 510 million km2, of which approximately 1/3 (149 million km2) is land and 2/3 is seas and oceans. Land occupies more land in the northern hemisphere and seas in the southern hemisphere. For this reason, the northern hemisphere is called the "Land" hemisphere and the southern hemisphere is called the "Sea" hemisphere. Sea waters are in constant motion with large water currents. For example, there is the Golfstrim current in the North Pacific, the Hombolt current moving clockwise in the northern hemisphere and counterclockwise in the southern hemisphere. These currents not only affect the distribution of marine organisms, but also the climate of nearby landmasses. There is also a cold and intense current from the polar regions to the equator, which is not very fast and very deep. Freshwater habitats are completely separate from marine and terrestrial habitats. But they cover a very small area. Inland lakes contain 1.8% of the Earth's surface and flowing waters 0.3%. All freshwater habitats are combined with terrestrial and wetland habitats.

Freshwater habitats can be divided into backwaters (lakes, small lakes, wetlands) and rivers (rivers, streams and springs), and each of these can be subdivided. In general, clean water is abundant in the world, but like food, it is unevenly distributed and often available in unsuitable locations. Transporting water from one region to another is both expensive and easily contaminated. Some 66% of the world's major rivers flow through two or more countries. Most of these rivers are located in the tropics, in seasonally dry areas. The increasing pollution of the water flowing on earth and the inability to transmit water from one region to another for economic and political reasons will become more and more important in the future.

After the earth began to meet human beings, the coasts became the cradle of civilizations. Villages and cities were first established on the coasts. Gods, legends, empires and colonies were born and died on the coasts. In short, it can be said that the history of humanity also began on the coasts; then it marched inland and wherever it found a "subasi" it stopped, developed and flourished. Therefore, we can say that it is human beings who create history and culture. But it is Su that creates civilizations. Within the framework of known history, the most advanced civilizations were established around the Tigris and Euphrates in Mesopotamia and on the Nile River. The common feature of these civilizations is that they were coastal cities.

Istanbul perhaps owes all its splendor to a "geography of coasts" unique in the world, the fascinating picture of the Bosphorus-Bosphorus Golden Horn-Marmara triangle. The legendary city of the North Aegean, the seven-storeyed Troy; Behramkale or Assos, integrated with the Gulf of Edremit; Pergamon, which has not changed its name since antiquity; Izmir or Smyrina, the pearl of the Aegean that has been shining for thousands of years; Ephesus, once the richest port city and a center of culture and art; Prienne, Miletus and Didim, once the most magnificent coastal civilizations; Bodrum or Halicarnassus, the longed-for tourism center with its historical monuments further south; Cnidos, Caunos, Letoon, Patara, Kekova, Faselis, Side, Alanya, Tarsus and many more unforgettable historical settlements of the Mediterranean coast owe their strength and beauty to the coasts where they are located. Ceyhan and Seyhan have given us the civilizations of Çukurova from the Hittites to the present day; the Euphrates and Tigris have given us the Mesopotamian civilizations that bear even the oldest footprints of mankind on earth; the Asi River has given us Antakya, "the city of Habib-i Neccar"; the Yesilirmak has given us Amasya, "the city of Strabo"; and the Kızılırmak has given us Cappadocia, "the mysterious country". The lakes of Bafa, Iznik, Van, Eğirdir, Beyşehir and Akşehir have served as much as the seas and rivers to make Anatolia the richest cultural heritage on earth.





The continuity of human life on earth is only possible with the preservation of ecological balance. Coasts have both an "influencing" and "affected" position within this balance. "Air, water and soil", the three pillars of life, embrace on the coasts and create an immeasurable ecological wealth. However, all the wastes that pollute the earth on land and sea end up on coasts. For example, toxic barrels dumped in the open seas end up on the shores. Pet bottles, garbage, plastic bags meet on the shores. Dying fish and all kinds of aquatic creatures surface on the coasts. Pollution carried by streams and underground rivers collects either on coasts or on land. This sensitive position of coasts on the ecological balance has also left its mark on many international environmental conventions.

According to a United Nations report published in November 2000, more than one billion people lack clean drinking water. An average of 10-20 thousand children die daily from preventable water-borne diseases. The report also reveals that efforts to address these problems are steadily declining. Experts estimate that by 2025, 40% of the world's 7.2 billion people will face severe water shortages. Thirst will hit water-rich countries such as the United States and China even harder. The report published by the World Health Organization (WHO) at the end of 2000 revealed how important water, the source of life, is for the earth and that the water crisis in the world is increasing. According to the report, one out of every 6 people in the world is trying to live without sufficient drinking water. One in every 2 people drinks unhealthy water. Every day, 10,000 people, most of them children, die due to lack of water or the use of unhygienic water.

The most important ecological difference between humans and other living things on Earth is that other living things adapt to the existing ecological conditions, while humans partially change the natural environmental conditions and take them under their control. Indeed, humans have taken natural ecosystems under their influence in various ways with their superior technical practices, especially since the 1960s. As the extent of human domination of nature has expanded, the destruction of nature has increased. This thoughtless interference with nature or disruption of ecological balance has brought about many economic, social, political and environmental problems.

Nowadays, "environment" has gained vital importance and has become so current that it has entered the spoken language. When this term is used, it brings with it the connotation of all physical, chemical and biotic factors that are effective in a given living space. In fact, since the human factor has recently taken precedence over all living things, the term "environment" brings to mind "all factors that affect the condition, life and development of human beings and arise from their surroundings". Accordingly, a rich "Environmental Terminology" has emerged in various branches of science (Environmental Analysis, Environmental Pressure, Environmental Factors, Environmental Research, Environmental Control, Environmental Protection, Environmental Protection Policy, Environmental Problems, etc.). In the content and essence of all environmental terms, there are complex relationships between the living conditions of living things and the factors affecting them.

Environmental policy has emerged as a new discipline in recent years. The legal and social institutions related to the environment, voluntary organizations, the approaches of different parties and political systems to environmental issues, the objectives and formation function of environmental policy are among the subjects of environmental policy. In a narrower sense, environmental policy is defined as "the determination of a country's environmental preferences and objectives". The world has been discussing the "Right to the Environment" since 1972, and it is becoming more and more important and embraced with each passing day. As ecological problems, the destruction of natural and cultural values, and the continuous pollution of air, water and soil turn the paradise on earth into a "hell", the link between the "right to environment" and the "right to life" becomes stronger.

Until thirty or forty years ago, issues such as erosion, forest protection, overpopulation, urbanization, coastal destruction, air and water pollution were seen as separate problems and dealt with individually. The view that not only some but all of these problems are interrelated is becoming increasingly widespread in Turkey, as it is in most countries of the world. The United Nations' 1987 Report on Environment and Development, which resonated around the world, was published under the title "Our Common Future". The main purpose of the report is to examine the long-term solutions to environmental problems and the prerequisites for environmentally friendly economic development and to make recommendations to countries. According to the report, the basic condition for an environmentally friendly economy is "Sustainable Development". The definition and implementation of sustainable development is mainly guided by the "United Nations Agenda 2030" published in 2015. In relation to sustainable development, 17 main goals have been set by the United Nations. The sixth of these goals is the "Clean Water and Sanitation" goal to ensure the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation services for all.



Since classical ecology is a biological science, it is insufficient in analyzing humanenvironment relations within ecosystems. For example, environmental problems are not only scientific and technological problems, but also social and economic problems. The socio-economic structure of a country, the population, energy, agriculture, fisheries, transportation, regional development, efficient use of resources, technological innovations and biodiversity protection policies are closely related to environmental problems. Some principles are needed for these policies to be successful.

- Loving and protecting nature and loving people are not separate things. Human love begins with love of nature; in societies that are in harmony with their environment, human relations are also harmonious.
- Environmentalism is first and foremost about future generations. When short-term profits and long-term ecological values conflict in a society, the responsibility for future generations must also be considered.
- The quality of water, air and soil are not abstract values, but are directly related to the quality of life of people. Giving importance to environmental quality will directly ensure the protection of the quality of life, thus preventing wrong practices in the name of economic development.

In order for the principles listed above to be adopted and accepted by a society, the individuals who make up that society must first change their perspectives on the environment and their values about the environment. For this reason, the awareness of individuals' sensitivity to the environment should be developed at a young age, first in the family and then in education, and continue throughout life.







# THE PLACE OF ECOFEMINISTIC THOUGHT IN TURKISH LITERATURE WITH THE EXAMPLE OF LATIFE TEKIN:

"According to ecofeminist thought, there is a direct relationship between women and nature."

According to ecofeminist thought, masculine forces treat nature in the same way they treat women. It is believed that masculine forces are trying to conquer and control nature. Therefore, it can be said that there is a clear relationship between the exploitation of nature and the oppression of women in the basic view that dominates ecofeminist thought.

When we consider the ancient history, we see that the Mother Goddess "Matar" in Hittite culture, "Kybele" in Anatolia, "Gaia" in Ancient Greek civilization, "Ina" in Native American culture and female shamans in Shamanistic cultures all point to powerful female beings who are friends with nature and know its secrets. Today, it is believed that all of these cultural elements originate from the idea of "Mother Nature". Because, after all, women are as fertile as the earth and for this reason, throughout history, women have been respected and believed to be a sacred being identical with nature. According to ecofeminist thought, the world and nature were thought to be out of balance as a result of masculine domination.

"Muinar" by Latife Tekin, a world-renowned writer of Turkish literature, is a narrative shaped around the ecofeminist idea. In this narrative, which we know was written as a "women's narrative", it is explained that the world and nature lost its mystery, magic and fertility at a great speed after being dominated by a male-dominated, exploitative and ultimately capitalist mentality. In addition to this, the work also draws attention to the fact that when women dominated the world, "magical and secretive" nature existed in beauty and compassion.

Author Latife Tekin's two most recent narratives, "Sürüklenme" and "Manves City", which were published at the same time, also talk about the massacre of nature and the fact that the damage to the vitality of nature must be stopped, but since it is not, the evil is increasing. According to the shamanistic beliefs, the fact that the repercussions of the damage done to the "living" nature will be evident with the increase in evil is one of the themes emphasized in these narratives.

As a result, Latife Tekin, a world-renowned woman writer of Turkish literature, has made the ecofeminist thought trajectory visible in Turkish literature with her narratives "Muinar", "Manves City" and "Sürüklenme". In these narratives, the idea that the damage caused by human beings to nature is now at an irreversible stage and that the cruel behaviors against mother nature should be replaced by compassion and mercy is emphasized.





### INTERVIEW OF MARCH

"Everything we see on the face of the earth is the work of women." M. Kemal Atatürk

#### TRANSLATOR/SCHOLAR: Dr. Ebru AK:

Women translators, especially poets and poetry translators, are now more visible with their own magazines and fanzines. Indeed, women translators need to be more visible.

First, thank you for accepting our UBF Monthly E-Bulletin interview request. Could you tell us how you got into academia and more importantly, how you got into the translation profession?

About 15 years ago, I was writing stories and sending them to literary magazines and my stories were being published in magazines. One day, one of the magazine editors told me that it would be great if I could translate. Translation introduced me to the field of translation studies. While sending translations to magazines such as Yediiklim, Lacivert Öykü Roman, Natama, Kargış, I felt a sense of uneasiness. I turned to the field of translation studies with the idea of how to cope with the interventions I made while translating a literary text from another language into Turkish. For this reason, while my undergraduate and master's degrees were in English Language Teaching, I completed my PhD in Translation Studies.







#### **INTERVIEW**

## What kind of problems do you encounter during the translation process and how do you overcome them?

After the story translations I mentioned in the first question, I have a translation book called "Feminist Fairy Tales for Adults", which is also related to my thesis topic. When I was translating it, the most difficult thing for me was to preserve its form. The work was written in the style of fables and the endings of the fables were consciously changed from a feminist perspective. I remember having difficulties with cultural expressions and norms that restrict gender and women's freedom, such as not being able to preserve the author's rebellious and sometimes offended language, masculine-feminine subject transpositions, and tales from Indian culture. I try to overcome difficulties through research. I try to find a solution to my difficulties by asking someone who knows (consulting a biologist if the field expert is, for example, a plant), searching academic texts, dictionaries, parallel texts.

## Are you subjected to sexist discrimination in the world of translation? What would you like to say about the existence and struggle of women translators in the translation industry?

Not only in the translation world, women are sometimes discriminated against in the academic world as well. In the world of translation, I have not been exposed because I work with a publishing house that knows and cares about feminist translation. They took my opinion from the cover image to the back cover article. While this is a good example, sometimes we can say that monthly magazines that are published with the names of male translators are an indication of this. Women translators, especially poets and poetry translators, are now more visible with their own magazines and fanzines. Indeed, women translators need to be more visible. Issues such as equal pay for equal work are still important problems. Finally, as a good reader, I would like to share an observation I have made; when it comes to translation errors and criticism, women translators are more often criticized in the field of literature.

What are your suggestions and recommendations especially for our translator candidate students who continue their education in the Department of English Translation and Interpreting?

I advise all students to be hungry for knowledge. I want them to pursue every piece of information and grow a huge learning monster inside them. The end of March means April and spring. The world is a wonderful season not only for humans but also for the greedy beast. Let them look at grass, flowers, plants, trees, clouds, animals. To know the name of a tree, to look it up in a dictionary or search the internet is such a beautiful feeling that it makes you happy. "You say you have learned, you see it in a text, you say you know it", I have never known a more beautiful feeling. I would like to conclude with the words of Ayşegül Sönmezay, one of the translators I interviewed during my thesis process, which I have never forgotten; "Curiosity is the most important trait for human beings", let them be curious and read or listen a lot.

Dr. Ebru AK completed her undergraduate education at Selçuk University, Faculty of Education in 2000. She is currently working as a faculty member at Bolu Abant izzet Baysal University, Department of English Translation and Interpreting.



#### **Blindness - Jose Saramago**

'Blindness' is one of the most impressive books written in recent years by Portuguese writer Jose Saramago, winner of the 1998 Nobel Prize in Literature. A man driving a car suddenly goes blind while waiting for a green light. His blindness infects the doctor he visits. This blindness spreads like an epidemic throughout the city, and although it is not fatal, it manages to destroy all moral values. Society witnesses murders and rapes with blind eyes. The only ones who survive are the strong. The only person in the whole city who survives blindness is the ophthalmologist's wife. Jose Saramago, Portugal's most important living writer, has used the phenomenon of blindness as a metaphor in this striking novel, and has created the unhealthy environment that liberal democracy has dragged people into with extraordinary mastery, without resorting to simple images and ordinary word games, with an intense narrative, turning the narrator's and the protagonists' conversations into a joint monologue, and without naming people in order to universalize the fiction. The work, with all its psychological analysis, descriptions of places and simple language, encourages you to think while reading. Blindness is one of the most creative thriller novels of recent times.



Hello, I am Bora Cankut Görgen, a student of Istanbul Gelisim University Gastronomy English Department.
