The list of "The World's Most Influential Scientists" published annually by Stanford University has been announced. This year's list included the names of 5 academicians from Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU). In the list, which was evaluated by many criteria such as the impact value of scientists' research, the number of published articles, the number of citations and international criteria, IGU's academic achievements once again came to the fore.

Stanford University's annual list, which is based on international criteria such as the impact value of the journal in which the articles of scientists are published, the number of qualified publications, the number of citations to their works, h-index, hm-index, the number of first name and single name articles, the number of cited articles and the impact value of the journal in which the cited article is published, was announced. Five academicians from Istanbul Gelisim University were included in the list of "The World's Most Influential Scientists" published by Dr. John P. A. Loannidis from Stanford University in the Elsevier database in two categories as "Career-Long Impact" and "Annual Impact" and ranked in the top 2% according to the 2023 citation year.

An Important Project from Istanbul Gelisim University: Drinking Water Lines Under Earthquake Impacts

Muhammet Ceylan, Lecturer at Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School, Department of Construction Technology, started to work as a visiting researcher at the University of Colorado Boulder in the United States of America within the scope of TUBITAK BİDEB 2214-A project as of September 2023. The project will continue for one year as part of Ceylan's PhD thesis.

This important research aims to investigate the behavior of drinking water lines under earthquake effects using both experimental and numerical methods. The experimental studies are carried out in the CIEST (Center for Infrastructure, Energy, and Space Testing) laboratory of the Department of Civil, Environmental and Architectural Engineering. This laboratory has advanced technology and equipment, such as centrifuge experiments, and offers great opportunities to study the behavior of structural systems against earthquake effects in detail.

Within the scope of the project, the performance of PVC pipes under earthquake effects with new generation fasteners is being investigated in detail. In addition, the behavior of pipelines buried in liquefying soils is also analyzed with advanced numerical methods. These studies will provide important data to improve the performance of infrastructure systems during future earthquakes.

The project will be completed by October 2024 and the results will be presented in a comprehensive report. This report aims to make a significant contribution in terms of both academic and sectoral applications. Muhammet Ceylan's work is of great importance for infrastructure safety in today's world where earthquake risk is on the rise.







BECOMING "FINANCIALLY" LITERATE...

What is financial literacy? We always say that health is the most important thing, what does money matter? Of course health is important, even very important, but is money unimportant? Isn't it also very important to earn money, spend it correctly and save money? I have some savings, should I buy a car? No, I should buy gold, I gave up, my Aunt Ayse was saying that the currency would appreciate. Uncle Butcher said we should "play" in the stock market? This is exactly where financial literacy comes into play. First, we learn to say that you don't play the stock market, you invest in it, then we learn how to create savings from the money we earn and how to turn those savings into investments in a way that reduces the risks with financial literacy.

Today, financial literacy courses are taught even in primary schools, but can young people invest properly? One of the most important issues in an economy is savings. Sometimes they say that we cannot save, but is the level of income very important for saving? Of course income is important, but regardless of income, it is essential to be able to save regularly. This is what financial literates know. They say, "I can save regardless of my income". Individuals or businesses then set aside a certain portion of their earnings and turn it into investment. However, the most basic and critical point in the concept of investment is to create a portfolio in a way to minimize risks.

What is this portfolio concept that we always hear about? In the lessons, I explain the portfolio as an investment basket consisting of more than one asset with the most summarized definition. It is easy to understand, but then questions come up about how we will know which assets to put in a portfolio. This is where the concept of being financially literate comes into play again. Because one should know what return is, one should know what risk is, one should know that risk can be calculated, one should know what interest is, is it enough to know only what interest is? Not enough... One should know the real interest rate, the nominal interest rate, the deposit interest rate, the policy interest rate... They should know so that they can calculate the return on their investment basket.

In short, a financially literate person knows basic financial concepts, budgeting, balance sheet reading, calculating return and risk, and making money from money... He knows how to use and evaluate his money, and contributes to both himself and the national economy. To conclude, financial literacy is important for all economic units.





INTERVIEW

ASSISTANT SPECIALIST OF LOCAL GOVERNMENTS SALES DIRECTORATE SAMIYE ANAR:

"I recommend to be friendly, to be able to behave calmly, to manage stress, to have a marketing language and to spare time for their interests in accordance with their personal skills."

First of all, thank you for accepting our UBF Monthly E-Bulletin interview request. How did you step into the banking sector? What were the reasons for your orientation towards this field?

In 2011, I started the Department of Political Science and Public Administration at Ondokuz Mayıs University. In 2014, I studied at Gazi University for 1 year within the scope of the Farabi programme and graduated from my department in 2015. In my last year, seminars were organised in our school for business life and career. I gained familiarity with the banking sector in the career journey of İİBF graduates through these career events. After graduation, I started my master's degree at Istanbul University, Afterwards, I decided to work in the public sector in order to start business life and work in a corporate job. For this purpose, I took the banking exams. In 2017, I started working as an assistant specialist in the Local Governments Sales Directorate, which is a unit of Vakifbank General Directorate. The head office building. corporate clothing, self-expression, feeling safe in the future in the institution where I work, career plan, many social benefits provided by the workplace and the title given satisfied me. The financial relationship between the department I graduated from and the unit I worked in enabled me to continue in this field. I was interested in the borrowing instruments of municipalities and public institutions, payment methods, seeing the equivalent of banking in public institutions, contributing to social outputs, and the sustainability of public and finance.





INTERVIEW

As a banker, what were the challenges you faced at the beginning of your career and how did you cope with these challenges?

First of all, banking is a very comprehensive, very wide field. In banking, there is a difference between working in a branch and working in the head office. There are also differences between the units in the general directorate. A banker cannot know everything. There is specialisation, A person specialises in what he/she does. In the banking profession, you know and do the job you are working in, and when you move to another unit, you start to learn again, Group work is common. Although I was familiar with economics and economics as a graduate of the Faculty of Economics and Administrative Sciences, I did not know how the banking system worked. I encountered the intensity of credit calculation processes, customer segment, performance target, payment plan preparation processes. In some periods, work intensity increases. Work intensity increases at the beginning and end of the period. There are works that need to be completed in a short time. Reports prepared for senior management. Real money does not pass through our hands, but numerical expressions are very important. Any zero or numerical expression can change a lot. Coping with work intensity and stress is the most important situation. When you are in business life, your self-confidence increases as you learn to behave calmly and gain practice in what you do. Knowing and being careful, being coordinated with your colleagues and manager when it is necessary to question, makes the process more sustainable. Having a life after working hours, dealing with a job-hobby makes your work life more quality. I am an active volleyball player. Doing regular sports, socialising, making time for myself, travelling help to make my work life more quality. My bank has social clubs. You can participate in the one that suits you. I am in the folk dances team. Socialising with your colleagues and participating in an activity increases the effectiveness of your working life and loyalty to the institution. It is important to relieve the stress of work at the end of the day so that tomorrow we can continue to work with a new day and excitement.

What have you done so far to improve yourself in your profession (such as books, courses or mentoring)? How do you ensure your professional development?

Banking is a system that supports lifelong learning. My workplace has a training portal. Continuous trainings are assigned to keep us up to date and aware of cyber security in the digitalised system. Employees are included in this system. Banks launch new products and ensure that the personnel are informed before marketing them. I attended the Banking Association of Turkey trainings for my profession. Financial mathematics, SEGEM, SPL Licensing exams, Webinar-Qlik Sense Training, Our Bank Product and Services Trainings, Internal Motivation, Simulation Training on Interpreting Markets and Economy, Dashboard Reporting in Excel, Microsoft Excel Advanced Level Training, Microsoft Excel Macro, SAP Bo Report Design, Introduction to Business 4. O Introduction Training, Successful Credit Management, Understanding the Economy Training, Written Communication Skills, Intelligence and Financial Analysis Training, Time Management, Problem Solving, Basic Finance Accounting Law and Banking Training, Teamwork Training, etc. The Banks Association of Turkey website, Udemy, BRSA publications, CBRT announcement page, Official newspaper announcements, other banks' websites, examining the financial reports of our bank and other banks, following the agenda contributes to keeping up to date and improving ourselves in the changing and transforming banking system. Banking is a sector open to change, innovation and transformation.



INTERVIEW

As in every sector, a transformation is expected in the banking sector with technology. So, which personal characteristics are needed to be successful in this transformation?

Digital transformation in banking is progressing very fast. Today, banking provides the opportunity to perform transactions without going to branches with internet, mobile banking and ATMs independent of time and place. You can become a bank customer with an online interview. Digital transformation provides 24/7 access to finance. Digital transformation in banking increases the opportunity to do the work of many people online in a shorter time, without waiting in line. A new software and a new product are launched every day. The use of common ATMs is increasing. Payments, eft transactions, cardless payments, credit transactions, university tuition, invoice, municipal payments, exam payments are made with mobile banking. Almost everything can be done easily with mobile banking. Yes, there is a software behind, but there are people who create the system that thinks and implements it. We are not in a completely unmanned banking system at the moment. We will see what awaits us in the future. Group work and joint business plan gain importance. Many units or many banks come together and work for common business and products.

What advice would you give to our students planning a career in finance and banking? Thank you very much for taking the time and providing comprehensive information for the UBF Monthly E-Bulletin.

I would advise friends who are planning a career in finance and banking to first of all, to have mastered English, to obtain SPL licensing if possible, to improve their communication skills and to be familiar with applications such as SAP and SQR. Yes, there is digital transformation, innovations are very fast, CHATGPT responds to everything. Open banking, online services, eft-transfers made at any time from mobile banking, multinational use of cards, QR payments are just a few examples. While this system is in place, there are also the background sketches, balance sheet and matching of incoming and outgoing recipients. The system is coordinated with the software developer and the banker. For the software language, there is a need to know what the business will be. It is necessary to understand the legislation part. I recommend them to have verbal communication skills, group work and project management skills. I recommend to be friendly, to be able to behave calmly, to be able to manage stress, to have marketing language, personal skills, to spare time for their interests. Thank you.


SAMİYE ANAR RESUME:





Play and Reality - D. W. Winnicott


