







History


Istanbul Gelisim University's Vocational School of Health Sciences was proposed at the General Assembly of Higher Education on September 12th, 2013. Ever since then, VSHS has been providing education and training services for 40 programs (24 regular education, 16 secondary education) with 24 classrooms, 19 laboratory workshops, and 134 academic staff, per subparagraph (d) of paragraph 2 of Article 7 of Law No. 2547, as amended by Law No. 2880.





Being a Student in Istanbul




Which discounts can students benefit from?

Being a Student at Istanbul Gelişim University Vocational School of Health Services



- IGU Vocational School of Health Services is located in Block C.
- The IGU Vocational School of Health Services website address is **shmyo.gelisim.edu.tr**. Announcements, regulations and directives, academic forms and documents, academic and administrative staff information, academic calendars, departments, and communication can be found here.
- Student Information System is more commonly pronounced with the abbreviation "**OBIS**.". All course registration procedures and follow-up, grades, absenteeism status, and announcements can be followed here.
- Students coming from out of town are required to arrange a dormitory or house for accommodation. There are plenty of housing options available near IGU campuses. Whether our students' accommodation is within walking distance or far away from the school, commuting to Istanbul Gelisim University is very convenient. Metrobuses, buses, and minibus lines can easily reach our university.
- There are shuttles available to and from each campus of IGU that can take you to public transportation stations. **Shuttle service** hours are varied and frequent for both regular and secondary education.
- Students can wait for their lectures in common hallways where they can have a pleasant time before or between classes, such as the canteen, garden, classroom, gazebo, or libraries.

ACADEMIC SEMESTERS

1. SEMESTER When the syllabus is announced, information regarding the classroom schedule and courses becomes available on **OBIS**. Our students can easily access this information by signing in to their OBIS accounts.

By attending the orientation meetings held by the program head in the first month, our students can have all the information they need about IGU-VSHS, classrooms, laboratories, general rules, and other necessary directives to facilitate their studies.

It will be useful for students to actively participate in all of the first courses, to meet the lecturers and the class groups of the courses, and to get an idea about the rules, procedures, curriculum, weekly course topics, exam methodologies, etc., which may vary for each course.

2. SEMESTER As of the 2nd semester, our students will have acquired all the necessary information regarding examinations and university procedures. As of this semester, we think that all our students will be more experienced and will feel more comfortable and settled in.

Our students must follow all the necessary guidelines for carrying out a 'Summer Internship' by the end of the second semester. Students will be required to complete the formwork and obtain internship approval based on the specified days and dates. All the necessary instructions and forms will be made available to students via announcements on the IGU-VSHS website.

SUMMER EDUCATION In the summer semester, students will have the opportunity to take courses that they have never taken in the lower semesters, have taken but failed, or wish to take to increase their grade point average (GPA).

The courses to be opened in summer education are announced on the VSHS website and OBIS.

3.
SEMESTER

During the course registration period specified in the academic calendar, students are advised to prioritize courses from lower semesters (if any). The courses that can be taken in one semester must have a maximum of **45 ECTS**.

Another crucial part of this semester is '**Professional Practice**'. Students are required to follow the internship guidelines published in the announcements on the VSHS website and consult their program advisory heads before starting their fall internship.

Students who wish to complete their program for 4 years can attend our school's **free DGS Mathematics courses** this semester. Those who succeed in the DGS exam and choose to continue their education at IGU are offered extra opportunities as well.

4.
SEMESTER

In the second year of the spring semester, students are prepared for graduation. This is the last academic semester for students; however, those who wish to participate in **grade improvement or single course exams** are required to apply between the dates mentioned in the academic calendar and by following the necessary guidelines. Students are required to follow all the relevant announcements on the IGU-VSHS web page and OBIS.

Graduating students can attend the **diploma ceremony** at IGU, which is organized every year. Students are allowed to bring along their families and friends to share these memories at the graduation ceremony.

STUDENTS' AFFAIRS ADMISSION & ACCEPTANCE

Admission-Registration-Acceptance

You can enroll in our programs through central placement, additional quotas, and transfer, as outlined below.

Student Admission with OSYM

Students are placed in undergraduate and associate degree programs based on ÖSYM's Higher Education Transition Examination (YGS) and Undergraduate Placement Examination (LYS), while graduates of associate degree programs are placed in undergraduate programs at Istanbul Gelisim University based on Vertical Transfer Examination (DGS) results.

Additional Quotas

After OSYM's central placement, candidates who have not been placed in any higher education institution by ÖSYM must include Gelişim University in their preferences on the dates announced by ÖSYM for vacant quotas in higher education institutions (excluding quota-free AÖF programs). ÖSYM-placed students are eligible to register at our school.

Horizontal Transfer

Horizontal transfers to Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School follow the provisions of the "Legislation on the Principles of Horizontal Transfer between Higher Education Institutions at the Associate Degree Level." Horizontal transfer and admission procedures from other Vocational Schools of Health to our institution are determined by "The Vocational Institution of Health Board." Horizontal transfers to Istanbul Gelisim University are carried out under the "Regulation on the Principles of Undergraduate Transfer between Higher Education Institutions." Horizontal transfer and entrance procedures from other universities to our school are decided by "The Istanbul Gelisim University Board." Since our Horizontal Transfer procedures are carried out through the Rectorate, the Horizontal Transfer Application requirements are publicized at gelisim.edu.tr.

Student Admission by Special Talent Exam

To be eligible for programs that need an aptitude exam, students must both pass the Istanbul Gelisim University aptitude exam and complete the application requirements for special aptitude exams listed in the Higher Education Institutions Examination Guide created by ÖSYM.

Student Admission by Vertical Transfer Exam

Students who take the Vertical Transfer Exam are placed by OSYM if they score enough points. If an Istanbul Gelisim University associate degree student obtains a paid quota with DGS, he or she can continue his or her studies while making use of the unique opportunities offered to him or her.



<u>Double Major for Associate Degree Programs</u>

The Double Major program's objective is to provide free bachelor's degree studies in a second major to students who have excelled in their major undergraduate programs. Free enrollment in the second major diploma program is available to students with a cumulative grade point average in their major program of 2.90 out of 4.00 and a success rate of 20% in their undergraduate degree. The earliest possible time for students to apply to the second major diploma program is during the third semester of the major diploma program; for four-year programs, this is the beginning of the fifth semester; and for five-year programs, it is the beginning of the seventh semester.

Before beginning the second major program, the student must have finished all of the courses required for the major program up until that point in time. Two undergraduate diplomas are given to students who successfully finish the double major program and are eligible for two undergraduate degrees. Students who complete the second major program are awarded the diploma of the program in question only if they graduate from the major program they are continuing.

Optional English-Preparatory Program

Students who are placed in the first year of the university with ÖSYM and enrolled in associate degree, undergraduate, and graduate programs, provided that they are included in the regulations, can apply to the optional foreign language preparatory class. The quota of students to be admitted to the optional foreign language preparatory class is determined with the approval of the Rectorate upon the recommendation of the School of Foreign Languages.

If the applications exceed the quota, a ranking is made within the quota limits based on the first placement score of ÖSYM. Students enrolled in the optional foreign language preparatory class can leave the preparatory class with a petition until the end of the add-drop period. Those who exceed this period cannot leave the preparatory class. For detailed information, please visit https://oidb.gelisim.edu.tr/



The videos of the courses specified in **Table 1** are followed via "OBIS" (student information system) and the ALMS system, with the "password" provided to students during their registration.

It is not necessary to view distance education courses on the days and times specified in the course schedule. But they need to be finished in the relevant week. For these courses, there is no face-to-face education at the school. Exams are held at the school during the weeks designated for the midterm and final exams in the academic calendar.


Distance education courses do not appear in the course schedule; they are listed in the list of courses taken.

ERASMUS MOBILITY

Istanbul Gelisim University attaches great importance to the Erasmus+ program. Erasmus exchange is carried out within existing bilateral agreements (within open quotas). Learning mobility activity involves a student (Turkish citizen and non-Turkish citizen) enrolled in a higher education institution to carry out one or at most two semesters of his/her education in a higher education institution with ECHE abroad, which is partnered with a bilateral agreement. The duration of the activity covers a period between a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 12 months that can be completed within the same academic year.

Istanbul Gelisim University has 382 Erasmus+ agreements with 142 universities from 27 European countries.

<u>General Application Requirements</u>


Application requirements constantly change over an annual period. Conditions that must generally be met:

- The grade point average (GPA) must be at least 2.20/4.00 at the associate's / undergraduate level and at least 3.00/4.00 at the master's or doctorate level.
- Formal Education (1st and 2nd Education) Associate, Undergraduate and Graduate Programs at Istanbul Gelisim University
- Students who are enrolled in a double major program and/or are at least in their first year can apply for study and/or internship mobility. Students enrolled in the Double Major Program can only apply from a single major.
- The student participating in the program must complete 60 ECTS for a full academic year and one ECTS for a two-semester academic year.
- 30 ECTS credits for a semester and 20 ECTS credits for a semester in a three-semester academic year is expected to be sent to follow the program.













Erasmus+ Student Internship Mobility Program

Erasmus Student Internship Mobility is the process by which students receive vocational training and/or gain work experience within a partner enterprise or organization in another participating country. All students can benefit from Erasmus+ internship mobility. Students who will be placed within the scope of internship mobility have the right to do an internship for a minimum of 2 months and a maximum of 12 months. Students are advised to carry out their mobility in a way that does not coincide with their semester's courses.

Every academic year may have a different set of application requirements. But generally speaking, the requirements are as follows:


- Between the specified dates, students must apply to the International Exchange and Coordinator's Office by getting signed and sealed acceptance letters from the institutions they wish to carry out their internship at.
- Students qualified to participate in an Erasmus+ internship mobility are granted a length of time to get an acceptance letter if they do not already have one at the time of application.
- Applications are being taken for the upcoming school year.
- Seniors have a year following graduation to do an internship.
- Should the student lack documentation demonstrating that he or she has at least 60 points out of 100 from YDS, YÖKDİL, and foreign tests recognized as equal by ÖSYM, the student will need to take the language exam that is scheduled specifically for Erasmus students.

Istanbul Gelisim University also offers study abroad options for a specific duration through a bilateral collaboration program, in addition to Erasmus+.

Bilateral Cooperation Program


Istanbul Gelisim University has bilateral agreements with eminent universities worldwide in addition to Erasmus+ mobility. Through this program, students can study at universities overseas.

- Students who wish to attend other universities abroad as guests from Istanbul Gelisim University must be full-time enrolled students in the university's associate, undergraduate, or graduate programs in the form of formal education.
- Students must have completed at least 1 semester in their major, excluding the preparatory year.
- Students' GPA must be at least 2.50/4.00 for associate and undergraduate students and at least 3.00/4.00 for graduate students in their last semester before applying to the program.
- Students must have taken at least 60/100 in the Exchange Programs Foreign Language Exam organized by the School of Foreign Languages or possess the Central Foreign Language Exam accepted by YÖK.
- Participating students are required to pay both the tuition fee determined by the destination institution and the tuition fee of our university.

Istanbul Gelisim University has 56 Bilateral Cooperation Agreements with 34 countries.

IGUMER

İGÜMER stands for "Istanbul Gelisim University Communication Center". It is a communication platform for Istanbul Gelisim University alumni, existing students, and staff. The IGUMER tool was created to facilitate the use of petitions and information rights for individuals not affiliated with the university.



Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School, established by the Council of Ministers on July 14, 2008, per Article 2 of Law No. 2547, was transformed into "Istanbul Gelisim University" on February 17, 2011, with Law No. 6114, and has been operating in Avcılar, Istanbul, ever since. In 2008, the Library Directorate was established within the Vocational School, and Ms. Alev Dülger initiated library activities as the first Library Director.

In 2011, the Department of Library and Documentation was established, and Mr. Ahmet Şenol Armağan began his role as the Founding Department Head. At that time, library services were conducted on a single campus, but with the growth of IGU, these services expanded proportionally to 2 campuses in 2012, 3 campuses in 2014, 4 campuses in 2017, and from 2018 onwards to 5 different campuses.

Within the Central Library, 4 branch libraries were established. These branch libraries, in order of their establishment, are the Vocational School Library (MYO), the Art and Engineering Library (SMK), the School of Foreign Languages Library (YDYO), and the Health Sciences Library (SBK).




















Psychological Counseling Services

The Psychological Counseling Unit operates on an appointment basis and is located on the 2nd floor of Building K. To receive counseling services, you can make an appointment through OBIS.





Free Mathematics Course


Graduates or prospective graduates of two-year vocational colleges with an associate degree can transition to a four-year undergraduate program related to their field by passing the Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS) and meeting the requirements. Students who complete their program will receive a bachelor's degree in their respective fields.

Istanbul Gelişim University supports the academic development needs and demands of its students. Students of Istanbul Gelişim Vocational School can participate in a free mathematics course offered when they reach their second year. This course helps them prepare for the DGS and transition to the undergraduate level.

Scholarships/Discounts

- **Preference Scholarship**: Students who choose Istanbul Gelişim University among their top 5 preferences and are placed in their preferred IGU department by ÖSYM will receive a preference scholarship.

Come to Gelişim Scholarship

What is 'Come to Gelişim'?

Launched in 2019 by Istanbul Gelişim University, the 'Come to Gelişim' program offers scholarships to students who aspire to achieve success with their talent, experience, ideas, or projects. The program allows prospective students to design their success criteria and provides special scholarships for areas they are open to developing. Applicants submit a motivational letter detailing their unique qualities and talents. Applications are evaluated by a commission, which awards scholarships based on its discretion.

Success Scholarship

Istanbul Gelişim University rewards successful students with 'Success Scholarships' throughout their educational period. The amount of the scholarship is determined by the Board of Trustees.

R&D Incentive Scholarship

Students who carry out innovative and entrepreneurial projects at Istanbul Gelişim University are eligible for R&D incentive scholarships. The scholarship amount is set by the Board of Trustees.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Support Scholarship

Students with an IB diploma and a diploma score between 35 and 45 receive a scholarship covering only the tuition fees. Other expenses, such as accommodation, meals, transportation, and books, are not covered. The scholarship is non-repayable and remains in effect for the normal duration of education, but will be terminated if the education duration is exceeded or if a disciplinary penalty is received.

Conditions for Scholarship Termination

- ÖSYM Scholarships: Terminated if the education duration is exceeded or a disciplinary penalty is received. The termination is effective from the date the penalty is finalized.
- Degree Scholarships: Terminated if:
 - The student's GPA falls below 2.00 for two consecutive semesters.
 - The student fails to renew enrollment without a legal excuse.
 - The student receives a disciplinary penalty.
 - o The student fails to meet legal attendance requirements.
 - Students who suspend their registration cannot benefit from the scholarship during the suspension period.
 - Scholarships are also terminated if the education duration is exceeded, a disciplinary penalty is received, or a conviction is finalized.

IGU Information Services

Student Communication:

- Students enrolled in the Health Services Vocational School programs can contact the student affairs office via face-to-face meetings, telephone, or email.
- To contact the director, program advisor, or department faculty members, students should use the email addresses found under their photo in the OBiS (Student Information System).
- Students can access their advisors' information by clicking on the advisor's name and the name of the relevant department head in the upper left corner of their photo in the OBİS system.

Student Mail System (MS)

All students enrolled in the Istanbul Gelişim University SHMYO programs are provided with an email address with the domain ogrenci@ogr.gelisim.edu.tr. Students can log in using their student email address and OBİS password via Gmail. Students who are unable to log in can visit the Information Technology Department's page to create or change their password. After logging into the E-Kap internet system, you can reset the passwords for all services available to you.

Students must conduct all correspondence with the university through their corporate student email address. All notifications from the university are sent to the student's email address. Therefore, students should periodically check their student email addresses. Email addresses for all university departments can be accessed through the OBİS system.

Corporate Archive System (DSpace)








REGULATIONS AND GUIDELINES







Student Discipline Penalties

Student disciplinary actions are conducted per Article 54 of the Higher Education Law No. 2547 (Official Gazette Date: 18.08.2012, Official Gazette No. 28388). Some situations that may result in disciplinary penalties include:

- Attempting to cheat, cheating, assisting others in cheating, preventing the removal of students who cheat from the exam room, having someone else take an exam in your place, or taking an exam for someone else.
- Engaging in actions that obstruct the freedom of learning and teaching or disrupt the operation and tranquility of higher education institutions.
- Providing a document that grants rights from the higher education institution to someone else, using someone else's document, etc.

Internship Procedures

The School of Health Services at Istanbul Gelişim University offers both professional practice and summer internships that are mandatory. Compulsory internships are carried out during the summer term after the first year and last for 30 working days. Professional practice internships are conducted during the academic term as part of the Professional Practice course.

Through internships, students can develop a deeper understanding of both themselves and their profession, which helps them create well-informed plans. They offer important experiences such as task perception, process preparation, intervention knowledge, professional experience, self-confidence, and careful time management. İGÜ has agreements with many institutions in Istanbul where students can complete their internships.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Duration of Study

The study duration at Istanbul Gelişim University School of Health Services is 2 years. During these 2 years, there are a total of 4+1 academic terms. Students can take courses in 2 fall semesters, 2 spring semesters, and 1 summer term. While taking courses in the fall and spring semesters is mandatory, there is no obligation for the summer term.

Course Registration

Course registrations are made on the dates announced in the academic calendar each year. During the course registration period, students can obtain detailed information about the courses from their respective program chairs. They can also get information about the courses by consulting the relevant faculty members. The principles applied during course registrations are as follows:

- Students must first enroll in the courses they failed in the previous terms and have not taken before. These courses are offered starting from the previous terms. If a course has been removed from the program or is not offered, students will take other courses determined by the relevant board.
- Re-taking an elective course previously taken is not mandatory. Instead, students may take another elective course from the same elective group.
- Starting from the third term, students who have passed all their courses from previous terms and have a GPA of at least 3.00 can take one course from the next year's term with the advisor's approval. Students with a GPA of 3.50 or higher can take two courses.

Add/Drop Courses

Students can make their course selections considering the "Add/Drop Days" mentioned in the academic calendar. During this period, they also have the right to drop a selected course and choose another one. With their advisor's approval, students can withdraw from one or more courses or register for new ones within two weeks from the beginning of each term.

Credit Load

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) is a credit system based on the workload required for students to achieve the targeted learning outcomes. Initially established for credit transfer under Lifelong Learning Programs and student mobility, ECTS is now one of the main objectives of the Bologna Process. It facilitates the recognition of study periods abroad and increases the quality and quantity of student mobility.

At Istanbul Gelişim University, courses are assigned based on both ECTS credits and local credits. ECTS credits are calculated based on class hours, midterms, finals, projects, other assignments, laboratory work, seminars, and other learning activities that contribute to the student's workload. ECTS credits are determined by the standards in the ECTS Users' Guide published by the European Commission.

An academic year at Istanbul Gelişim University consists of two semesters. The workload for one academic year is based on a total of 60 ECTS credits (1530 hours), with 30 ECTS credits per semester. One ECTS credit corresponds to a workload of 25.5 hours. A maximum of 45 ECTS credits can be taken per semester. At the School of Health Services, students are required to complete a total of 120 ECTS credits to achieve the learning outcomes and graduate.









Exam Rules

Students are responsible for adhering to certain rules during exams at our university. The rules to which students are accountable are summarized below. For detailed information, please refer to the "Associate and Undergraduate Education and Examination Regulation" available at https://gelisim.edu.tr/tr/gelisim-yonetmelikler.

- Ensure that you do not have any communication devices, such as mobile phones, computers, tablets, etc., with you during the exam. Responsibility for this is entirely yours.
- Your exam paper will not be evaluated if the personal information (name, surname, student ID, department, or program) on the question and answer sheets is incomplete.
- Cheating, attempting to cheat, or engaging in any form of dialogue with fellow students during the exam is strictly prohibited. No tolerance will be shown for such behavior. Actions will be taken per the relevant articles of the Higher Education Institutions Student Disciplinary Regulation. (Disciplinary offenses requiring reprimand: Article 5/D: "Attempting to cheat in exams" and disciplinary offenses requiring suspension for one semester: Article 7/E: "Cheating or assisting in cheating in exams"). Your exam will be canceled.
- Do not request additional time beyond what is given to you.
- Submit the optical answer sheet and all exam materials completely and accurately.
- If the optical answer sheet is not filled out according to the rules, it will not be evaluated.

Cheating

In all exams conducted within IGU, the exams of students who cheat, attempt to cheat, give, or try to give answers will be canceled. Additionally, the involved student(s) will be subject to actions according to the relevant articles of the Higher Education Institutions Student Disciplinary Regulation. (Disciplinary offenses requiring reprimand: Article 5/D: "Attempting to cheat in exams" and disciplinary offenses requiring suspension for one semester: Article 7/E: "Cheating or assisting in cheating in exams"). Grade Table

The final grade for a course is calculated by taking 50% of the grade from the course's midterm assessments and adding 50% of the grade from the final exam, provided the final exam score is at least 40. If a student scores below 40 on the final exam, an FF grade is recorded.

For each course, students receive one of the following letter grades from the instructor as the final course grade: **AA BA BB CB CC DC DD FD FF**. The grades not included in the GPA calculation are as follows:

- G (Pass): Given to students who pass non-credit courses included in the program.
- K (Fail): Given to students who fail non-credit courses included in the program.
- **D (Absentee):** Given to students who fail due to not meeting attendance or course application requirements. The D grade is treated like an FF grade in the GPA calculation.

Grade Explanation and Appeal for Material Errors

During the grade announcement process, the course instructor submits the exam results and exam envelope to the Student Affairs Office within the dates specified in the academic calendar. The announcement of grades is carried out by the Student Affairs Department on the dates specified in the academic year's calendar.

A student can appeal to the Student Affairs Department for grading errors in the exam results within five working days from the announcement of the grades by submitting a petition. The relevant department/program head will determine whether there is a grading error in the exam paper. If an error is found, the grade correction will be made by the relevant administrative board decision. The exam paper cannot be re-evaluated.











Repeating a Course

Students who receive grades of G, DD, or higher are considered to have passed the course. Students who receive grades of FD, FF, D, or K are considered to have failed and must repeat the course.

Students with a GPA of 2.00 or higher and who do not have grades of FF, FD, D, or K are considered successful. To complete an associate degree program, students must pass all the courses in the program and maintain a GPA of at least 2.00.

Graduation Ceremony

Students who have passed all the courses listed in the curriculum with a GPA of at least 2.00 and fulfilled graduation requirements are eligible for graduation. Graduates can collect their diplomas from the Student Affairs Office in person when they are ready. Students who are eligible for high honors and honors certificates will receive these certificates along with their diplomas. Students who have earned their diplomas must obtain a clearance certificate from the relevant department to receive their diplomas.

Graduation Ceremony

The graduation ceremony is held annually after the end of the spring semester on the dates announced in the academic calendar.

Make-up Exam

Students who miss a midterm exam due to valid reasons must submit a petition along with supporting documentation to the Student Affairs Office within one week from the exam date. Students whose excuses are accepted by the relevant administrative board will be given make-up exams on the dates specified in the academic calendar. Make-up exams are not provided for final exams. Medical reports for make-up exams must be obtained from fully-fledged state hospitals. Students who have medical reports and cannot participate in any exams during the period are reported sick. Any exams taken during this period will be canceled.

Withdrawal

Students who wish to leave the university voluntarily must submit a written application to the Student Affairs Office. Their registration will be canceled upon presenting a clearance certificate from the relevant department. Fees for the periods attended will not be refunded. 25% of the fee for the semester in which the withdrawal occurred will be charged. Upon request, students whose registration has been canceled will be provided with a certificate of their academic status and any diplomas and other documents submitted at the time of enrollment.









Registration Freezing

Students may apply to freeze their registration for up to two semesters due to valid reasons within thirty days from the start of the academic year. Valid reasons include illness, natural disasters, imprisonment, economic difficulties, legal convictions, and the removal of military deferment.

In cases of registration freezing due to the reasons mentioned above, students must apply to the Student Affairs Office within twenty days of the occurrence of the event and provide the necessary documentation. If the reasons persist, the relevant administrative board may extend the registration freeze period.

Students with a frozen registration cannot attend classes or take exams. A fee of 20% of the tuition for the frozen semesters must be paid.

Course Exemption

After enrolling, students may request exemption from some courses by presenting a document showing successful completion of equivalent courses from previous higher education. The relevant administrative board will review this request and may exempt the student from the courses deemed sufficient.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do you access the OBIS Automation Program?

You can log in to the OBIS system by using your student number and the password provided by the Student Affairs Office. If this is your first time logging in, please change your password.

How do I renew my registration?

Students must select their courses for the semester using the OBIS automation program on the dates specified in the academic calendar. It is important to check the program curriculum and the number of courses required through gbs.gelisim.edu.tr and verify any remedial courses needed.

How do I add or drop courses?

The academic calendar specifies the periods for adding and dropping courses at the beginning of each academic year. During this period, students may drop some of their selected courses and add new ones.

Who is the academic advisor at our university?

At the School of Health Services, the program head serves as the academic advisor for enrolled students. The advisor guides course selection, the suitability of the courses, and the course add/drop process from the first year. The advisor also oversees the process related to internships.









How do I obtain, use, and report a lost student ID card?

- **How to Obtain a Student ID Card:** After completing the registration process, student ID cards are issued by the Student Affairs Office. This card is given to students who have enrolled or renewed their registration at the university and is valid for one year.
- How to Use the Student ID Card: The card is a photo ID used for entering the university and accessing all student benefits and facilities provided by the university.
- If the Card is Lost: If the student ID card is lost, it is necessary to report the loss to the Student Affairs Office.

What is a travel card, and where is it used?

A travel card is a discounted transportation card used on public transport vehicles operated by the Metropolitan Municipality within Istanbul. The pricing for the card is set periodically by the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality (iBB). Monthly subscriptions for students are much more economical.

What is a student certificate, where is it used, and how do I obtain it?

- What is a student certificate? A student certificate is a document proving that a person is a registered student at the university.
- Where is it used? It can be used to prove student status to various institutions as required.
- How to Obtain a Student Certificate: Students can obtain their student certificates from the Student Affairs Office, the Secretary's Office of the School of Health Services, or via the e-Government (e-devlet) portal.

How and When to Handle Military Service Procedures?

Student information related to military deferment is shared daily with military recruitment offices via the Higher Education Information System. These offices monitor the student's academic status based on data.

How do I update student information?

If there are changes to contact information, students must update their details either by submitting a written request to the Student Affairs Office or by accessing the Student Information System (OBIS).

How are student grades, exams, and academic standing determined?

The success grade for a course is calculated based on:

- 50% of the grade comes from mid-term work (including assignments, projects, and quizzes).
- 50% of the grade from the final exam, provided the student scores at least 40 points in the final exam.

Grades below 40 in final exams are marked as FF. For courses with additional assessments like quizzes, labs, or projects, the mid-term exams must contribute at least 30% and other work must contribute a maximum of 20% to the final grade.







How do I apply for the Double Major Program?

The purpose of the double major program is to allow students who perform excellently in their primary major to simultaneously pursue a second major and obtain an additional diploma free of charge. Students who have a general grade point average (GPA) of 2.90 out of 4.00 and are in the top 20% of their primary major program can apply for the second major diploma program for free. If their application is successful, they can enroll in the second major program.

How do I establish a student club?

The area of activity for a newly proposed club must not be similar to that of an existing active club. Club establishment applications must be completed within six weeks of the beginning of each academic year. When applying to establish a student club, a draft of the club's charter, including the planned event dates for the semester, must be submitted. Students can only establish one student club and be involved in the management of that club. The required documents for establishing a club are available on the main page of the Health, Culture, and Sports Department (SKS).

Note: Club documents must be filled out electronically and submitted with a wet signature to SKS. After the application is approved, the relevant forms must also be submitted to SKS.

What is the Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS)?

The Vertical Transfer Exam (DGS) is an exam for students who have graduated from or are about to graduate from associate degree programs and wish to complete their undergraduate education. DGS is one of the central exams conducted by SYM (Student Selection and Placement Center). Students who score sufficiently can choose the departments and universities they want and enter the placement process.

What is a transcript? How do I obtain it?

A transcript is essentially a record of grades. It lists all the courses taken at the educational institution, along with the grades received. The transcript clearly shows the course name, the semester in which the course was taken, the grades received in exams, and the letter grade equivalents. At the end of the document, values such as the overall GPA for the indicated periods are also included. To obtain a transcript, students should request it through the document request section of OBİS (the student information system) and can obtain it from their department's student affairs office.

Can I freeze my registration?

- 1.A student can request to freeze their registration for up to two semesters with the decision of the relevant board if they apply within thirty days from the beginning of the academic year for valid and justifiable reasons.
- 2.A student can also freeze their registration during the semester for reasons such as illness, natural disasters, detention, economic issues, imprisonment, or the cancellation of military deferment, provided that these reasons are deemed acceptable by the relevant board.
- 3.In the case of the reasons mentioned in the second paragraph, the student must apply to the Student Affairs Department within twenty days of the occurrence of the event and prove the situation with the necessary documents. If the reasons continue, the relevant board may extend the registration freeze period.
- 4.A student who freezes their registration cannot attend classes or take exams. In the case of freezing registration, 20% of the tuition fee for the frozen semesters must be paid.
