







ISTANBUL GELİSİM UNIVERSITY RECEIVED YÖKAK CORPORATE ACCREDITATION FOR 5 YEARS!

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) was fully accredited for 5 years as a result of the institutional accreditation evaluation carried out by the Higher Education Quality Board (YÖKAK). After the detailed audit process in December, IGU was entitled to receive accreditation at the highest level with the high standards it has shown in the fields of education, research and development, management system and community service.

Institutional accreditation is an important process that evaluates whether universities meet the quality standards set in the fields of education, research, management and community service. This rigorous evaluation process carried out by YÖKAK aims to increase the competitiveness of higher education institutions on a national and international scale and to ensure that they establish a transparent and sustainable quality assurance system. Universities that are entitled to receive institutional accreditation prove that they successfully manage quality processes, adopt sustainable development in education and effectively fulfill their mission of adding value to society. Istanbul Gelisim University successfully completed this important process and made its name among the few universities in Türkiye that received full accreditation.

A LIMITED NUMBER OF UNIVERSITIES IN TÜRKİYE ARE FULLY ACCREDITED!

This year, 35 universities were subjected to a detailed evaluation by YÖKAK. According to the results, only 4 universities received full accreditation, 27 universities continued the process with conditional accreditation, and 4 universities could not obtain accreditation. Istanbul Gelisim University, as one of the 4 fully accredited universities, has once again proven that it carries the quality standards in higher education to the highest level.

Institutional accreditation is a significant indicator that proves that a university's educational quality, academic and administrative management processes, research activities and community service studies are of international standards. For students, institutional accreditation is considered as the assurance that the university they prefer has a sustainable quality understanding in education.

With 65 international accreditations and 45 Turkish Qualifications Framework (TQF) logos, Istanbul Gelisim University has achieved global recognition in many programs. The granting of institutional accreditation for 5 years shows that IGU's long-term strategic plans, quality management systems and understanding of excellence in education are guaranteed by YÖKAK.

Innovative projects developed in Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Technology Transfer

Office (TTO) and TEKMER ecosystem continue to commercialize with industry collaborations.

In this context, an important cooperation agreement was signed between ULAV Defense

Technologies established by IGU graduates and LENA Energy. Within the scope of the

agreement, one transport drone was sold to LENA Energi.

Developed with the support of IGU TTO and with a carrying capacity of 30 kg, this special drone is designed to ensure the safe and efficient transportation of solar panels to the roof where they will be installed.

This cooperation is considered as an important development that enables IGU's technology-oriented initiatives to step into the commercialization process in the sector. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Faculty of Fine Arts Department of Interior Architecture has added a new one to its efforts to improve the creativity and design competencies of its students. The furniture designed and produced by the students of the Department of Interior Architecture within the scope of Furniture III course met with the visitors with the Modular Furniture Exhibition.

Curated by Lect. Muhammed Said Erdemonar, the exhibition includes coffee table and seating element designs as well as modular and sustainable furniture concepts. Interior furniture design, which is one of the main areas of the Interior Architecture discipline, is presented concretely through student projects in this exhibition. While the event aims to encourage young designers by showcasing their original work, it also offers an important reference to their concept development and production processes.

then transformed into a concrete design tool with materials and production processes. We want our students to be proud to be part of this process."

MINISTERIAL SUPPORT FOR LECT. KEREM YÜKSELOĞLU'S SHORT FILM PROJECT!

Kerem Yükseloğlu, a lecturer in the Department of Radio, Television and Cinema of the Faculty of Fine Arts at Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), has been awarded the Short Film Production Support given by the General Directorate of Cinema of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism.

Yükseloğlu achieved great success with the project he initiated to overcome the difficulties of the short film production process. Yükseloğlu, who attracted attention by winning the Short Film Production Award and Flod Color Award at the 5th Esenler Film Festival, with his short film Tonight is Different from the Others, is now taking his project one step further with the support of the General Directorate of Cinema of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism.

Tonight is Different From Others focuses on the time spent waiting for a tow truck by two characters who met in a traffic accident on a deserted road. These two characters, trapped between life and death, get to know each other while remaining alone with the sense of insecurity brought by the new world. Stating that themes such as night, darkness, deserted roads, death, time and waiting are the basic building blocks of the story, Yükseloğlu said that the story of the two characters who had to wait patiently in a rapidly changing and rootless world is interesting.









Yükseloğlu expressed his feelings and thoughts about the project as follows: "I unintentionally reflect my mood, which goes back and forth between the peace of mind felt when I wake up in the morning of the most terrible nightmares and the disappointment caused by the morning alarm that ends a very beautiful dream, to the works I have done and written recently. There is a similar tidal state in the atmosphere of Different from the Others."

The first draft of the scenario was written at the 61st Golden Orange Film Festival. Yükseloğlu stated that they finalized the script as a result of their work with Perihan Taş Öz. Emphasizing that Koray Sevindi, who participated in the project as a producer, is a name they have been working with for many years and that things have accelerated with his support, Yükseloğlu added that the support of the ministry has made a great contribution to the project both financially and morally.

MINISTERIAL SUPPORT TO THE 3RD INTERNATIONAL SHORT FILM, VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHY SYMPOSIUM!

Organized by Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Faculty of Fine Arts, Department of Radio, Television and Cinema, The 3rd International Short Film, Video and Photography Symposium was entitled to be supported by the General Directorate of Cinema of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism.
