





THE TRICKS OF A HEALTHY AND BALANCED DIET IN RAMADAN!

Days before Ramadan, proper nutrition has become an important agenda item for those who fast. During long hours of fasting, the foods preferred in sahur are of great importance to maintain energy levels throughout the day and reduce the feeling of thirst. Nutrition and Dietetics Specialist Asst. Prof. Hande Nur Onur Öztürk shared the tips for a healthy and balanced diet during Ramadan.

PROTEIN IS ESSENTIAL TO STAY FULL ALL DAY LONG

Stating that foods that will delay the feeling of hunger and reduce thirst should be included in sahur, Istanbul Gelisim University Faculty of Health Sciences Department of Nutrition and Dietetics Asst. Prof. Hande Nur Onur Öztürk said, "Protein-rich animal foods such as eggs, yogurt, salt-reduced cheese, and plant protein sources such as legumes and crustaceans provide a feeling of satiety for a long time. Consumption of whole grain foods, especially whole wheat bread, oats and bulgur, keeps blood sugar in balance, prevents fluctuations during the day and reduces the feeling of hunger."

FLUID CONSUMPTION IS IMPORTANT TO PREVENT DEHYDRATION

Emphasizing that not only nutrients but also water consumption are important, Öztürk also said, "It is necessary to consume 1.5-2 liters of water after iftar to replace the water lost during the day. It would be beneficial to avoid such foods, as foods with high sugar and salt ratios can increase the feeling of thirst and hunger during the day."







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AVOID BEVERAGES THAT INCREASE FLUID LOSS

Stating that fluid consumption should be made intermittently from iftar to sahur, Öztürk added, "Liquid but high nutritional value foods such as soup, ayran, milk, yoghurt should be preferred. Drinks with high caffeine content such as tea, coffee and carbonated drinks should be consumed limited in the month of Ramadan as they increase water loss. In addition, fruits with high water content meet both energy and liquid needs."

PAY ATTENTION TO THE DESSERT CHOICE!

Stating that the desire to consume desserts after fasting is also normal, Oztürk said, "Meeting this need with milk desserts provides both protein and energy. As a second preference, fruit or low-sugar fruit desserts can be considered. On the other hand, syrupy desserts should be preferred less because they increase and decrease blood sugar rapidly."

Eating fast after a whole day of hunger may cause digestive problems. After fasting with foods such as dates and olives, tarhana, plateau and legume soups facilitate digestion. A short rest before switching to the main meal prevents the digestive system from being strained. Short walks after dinner and herbal teas also help the digestive process."

TTO AND TEKMER MANAGERS IN ISTANBUL MEET AT KÜLTÜR UNIVERSITY

The fifth meeting of the directors of the Technology Transfer Office (TTO) and the Technology and Innovation Center (TEKMER) of the universities in Istanbul was held on February 18, 2025, hosted by Kültür University. In addition to Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) TTO, and/or TEKMER managers and technical experts of many institutions such as Istinye University, Digital Park, Yeni Yüzyıl University, FSMVÜ TTO, BTM TEKMER, Nişantaşı University, Health Sciences University, Biruni Technopark and Beykent University participated in the meeting.









At the meeting, the importance of networking (business connection environment) was emphasized in order for technology transfer offices to provide effective coordination. Participants stated that strengthening collaborations played a critical role in the success of TTOs.

FIRST STEPS TAKEN FOR JOINT PROJECT

The meeting was organized in two phases: the morning session for the managers and the second session with the managers and technical experts. During the sessions, the preparation of a joint project for the three calls announced by the Istanbul Development Agency (ISTKA) within the scope of the 2025 Financial Support Program was put on the agenda.

In particular, a consensus was reached on the preparation of the joint project proposal within the scope of the "Cooperation Istanbul - Financial Support Program for Strengthening Collaborations between Corporate Companies and Startups" announced by ISTKA on 13 January 2025. While it was decided that the project coordination would be undertaken by Kültür University, each institution was asked to determine the corporate companies and startups it wanted to take part in the project call and forward them to Kültür University.

APPLICATIONS OPEN UNTIL APRIL 11

According to the roadmap set at the meeting, applications for these financial support programs will continue until April 11, 2025.

IGU TTO aims to strengthen cooperation and contribute to the city's innovation ecosystem in this process.









AN E-COMMERCE SUMMIT WITH THE THEME OF "EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION, STRONG CONNECTIONS" WAS HELD AT IGU!

Organized by the Digital Entrepreneurship and Electronic Commerce Club at Istanbul Gelisim University, the E-Commerce Summit themed "Effective Communication, Strong Connections" took place on February 25, 2025 at Mehmet Akif Ersoy Hall. The summit, attended by leading names in the industry, provided students with important information in the fields of e-commerce and digital marketing.

ACADEMIC AND SECTORAL PERSPECTIVE

Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Bahri Şahin drew attention to the contributions of the activities organized by the students to the youth in the opening speech. Prof. Şahin explained the comprehensive research and development opportunities offered by the university and emphasized that these supports make significant contributions to the careers of students.

In other speeches, the main theme was the transformation of e-commerce. Asli Seven, president of the Digital Entrepreneurship and Electronic Commerce Club, stated that the club aims to lead digital transformation by blending academic studies and sectoral experience. Pinar Bacaksiz, from the faculty members of the Department of Electronic Commerce and Management, emphasized the importance of digital transformation in the e-commerce world and the opportunities offered to the sector by current trends and technological developments.

IGU Faculty of Applied Sciences Dean Prof. Kamil Kaya, on the other hand, touched on the great impact of technology on digital life and the place of e-commerce today. E-COMMERCE EXPERTS SHARED THEIR EXPERIENCE

Murat Erdör, founder of Me Consultancy, discussed the strategies of being successful in the sector and the foundations of sustainable growth with his presentation titled "To be successful in e-commerce: Is it a dream?" Erdör emphasized that the right strategies and innovative approaches are the key to success.

Kriko founder Uğur Eskici mentioned the importance of SEO management in increasing the visibility of e-commerce platforms in the digital world. Eskici shared the competitive advantages offered to businesses with effective search engine optimization techniques and application examples.

At the closing of the panel, the Founder of Innovative 360 Agency Ulaş Gökhan Gümüş explained the integration of digital marketing and artificial intelligence. Gümüş explained in detail the impact of artificial intelligence technologies on digital marketing strategies and the innovations that they will bring to the sector in the future.

DIGITAL MARKETING AND E-COMMERCE DYNAMICS ARE DISCUSSED

In the afternoon session, influencer Jel Founder Canan Ulugöl explained the role of influencer marketing strategies in the e-commerce world with concrete examples. Ulugöl emphasized the power of social media platforms and the effect of influencer collaborations on increasing brand awareness.

STRATEGIC COOPERATION FROM LENA ENERGY AND IGU TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER OFFICE!

LENA Energy Founder Feridun Biçer took strategic steps to strengthen university-industry cooperation by revisiting Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Technology Transfer Office (TTO). In this meeting, which is a continuation of the previous negotiations, preliminary studies were carried out on a protocol that includes technical cooperation.

Within the scope of the visit, it was announced that LENA Enerji plans to supply the unmanned aerial vehicle developed by IGU with domestic facilities in order to ensure the effective installation of solar panels with less cost.

Founded in 2011 and initially operating in the field of lighting, LENA Energy has been standing out with its solar energy projects for the last five years. The company provides services in innovative areas such as off-road and rooftop solar systems, energy storage solutions, and vehicle charging stations.

IGU TTO Manager Yahya Kemal Kıran and Feridun Biçer stated that efforts will continue to turn the cooperation into concrete projects in the future. At the end of the visit, Kıran presented a plaque to Feridun Biçer for his contributions.

THE WORKS OF FAMOUS CARTOONISTS ERDOĞAN KARAYEL AND HİCABİ DEMİRCİ WERE EXHIBITED AT IGU!

Under the leadership of Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Art and Design Application and Research Center (SATMER), Gelisim Art Gallery hosted the cartoon exhibition of Erdogan Karayel and Hicabi Demirci on February 26, 2025. The exhibition, which







consists of the works of two important names representing Turkish cartoon art in the international arena, attracted great attention by university students and art lovers.

Rector Prof. Bahri Şahin emphasized the importance that IGU attaches to art and said, "We value artistic innovation as much as social and technical sciences in order to reach contemporary civilizations. For this purpose, we have implemented our Art and Design Center within our university."

ASSOC. PROF. AYSUN CANÇAT'S WORKS ARE IN THE "ZEN" GROUP EXHIBITION!
