







# MİMAR SİNAN'S LEGACY IS ON ITS WAY TO UNESCO: THE SIGNIFICANT PROJECT RECEIVED SUPPORT FROM TUBITAK!

The project prepared by Res. Asst. Hazal Türkmen Yazgaç, research assistant at IGU Architecture Department, under the consultancy of Prof. Demet Ulusoy Binan, was deemed worthy of support within the scope of TUBITAK's "1002-A Rapid Support Module". The project titled "A Study on the Outstanding Universal Value and World Heritage Potential of the Menzil Islamic-Ottoman Social Complexes of the Mimar Sinan Period" took an important step by successfully completing the scientific evaluation process.

IGU Architecture Department Research Assistant Hazal Türkmen Yazgaç's project focuses on the Menzil complexes built by Mimar Sinan, one of the groundbreaking names in the architectural history of the Ottoman Empire, on the Ottoman road network. These complexes, built by Mimar Sinan in a wide geography to meet the basic needs of passengers, have the potential to be included in the UNESCO World Heritage List as a serial heritage.

The research offers a critical perspective towards increasing Türkiye's representation on the UNESCO World Heritage List. At the same time, it aims to make Mimar Sinan's Menzil complexes more visible in the international arena. The project reevaluates the cultural, economic and social dynamics of the past by examining the Ottoman road network and the complexes on this network.

The findings are expected to contribute to today's heritage management and conservation approaches. This important work stands out as a critical step towards promoting Mimar Sinan's legacy at the international level.









# ISTANBUL GELİSİM UNIVERSITY ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEM HAS BEEN UPDATED!

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) has updated the Academic Performance Evaluation System (APSIS) Implementation Procedures and Principles for 2024. The new regulations aim to evaluate the performance of academic staff more comprehensively and objectively.

Updating the Implementation Procedures and Principles, the APSIS groups academic activities under six main headings: Publications and Citations, Project, Patent, Works of Art and Design, Achievements and Recognition, Scientific and Professional Activities, Educational Activities, Administrative and Contribution Activities to the Institution. The evaluation will be made over approximately 3,000 different criteria and the score values of each activity will be calculated over the determined tables.

The system was prepared to measure the academic performance of units and departments as well as IGU faculty members, to determine the types of activities to be considered in scoring this performance, and to clarify the principles regarding the functioning of the process.

The APSIS evaluation announced in the application calendar will be active on the system on the specified dates. Academic staff are required to submit their performance applications through THE APSIS platform.

This update stands out as an important step aimed at encouraging the achievements of IGU's academic staff and contributing to institutional development.

PLANE CRASHES ARE ON THE AGENDA: DOES THE SEAT CHOICE AFFECT THE SURVIVAL CHANCE?









The successive plane crashes in the last days of the year have caused public concern. While discussions on the reliability of the airline and the causes of increasing accidents continue, Asst. Prof. Haluk Kul from the Aircraft Maintenance and Repair Department made evaluations on the subject.

### "AIRLINE IS STILL THE SAFEST WAY TO TRAVEL"

Istanbul Gelisim University Faculty of Applied Sciences Department of Aircraft Maintenance and Repair lecturer Asst. Prof. Haluk Kul stated that although the recent increase in accidents has caused public uneasiness, the airline is still the safest method of transportation:

"Air transport is statistically much safer than other types of transport. For instance, an average of 40-50 million flights take place every year in the world. Compared to this number, there are only 3-5 accidents per year. On the other hand, hundreds of accidents occur on highways every day, but this situation does not become an issue in the same way."

Drawing attention to the low risk rates of aviation, Kul emphasized that the level of risk is quite low, such as 3-4 per million, thanks to the strict measures taken. However, Asst. Prof. Kul also pointed out the reasons for the increasing accidents:

"Each event has its own dynamics. For example, the incident in Azerbaijan was not a emergency issue, but a safety issue. It was a tragedy that a civilian aircraft was perceived and shot down as a military target in the war zone, which was difficult to prevent."

Stating that there is no clear information about the plane crash in Korea yet, Asst. Prof. Kul said that the technical details should not be evaluated before the cockpit examinations are completed.

"In order to understand the cause of the accident, it is necessary to know what happened during the landing. The speed at which the aircraft lands on the runway, the state of the braking mechanisms and the physical conditions of the runway are important factors.

Asst. Prof. Kul emphasized that aviation rules are shaped by the lessons learned from accidents:

"The rules in aviation are written as a result of accidents in the past. Strict enforcement of these rules ensures flight safety. That's why we have to keep believing the planes are safe."

### WHICH SEATS ARE SAFER ON THE PLANE?

There is a widespread belief that the possibility of surviving plane crashes is linked to seat placement. Asst. Prof. Kul shared the following information on this subject:

"The back of the plane is relatively safer. If the probability of survival is around 25 percent on the front side, this rate increases to 44-45 percent on the back side. In the middle part, it is around 35 percent. However, the survival rate does not reach as high as 90 percent in any region."

### "CROSSWALKS ARE MORE DANGEROUS"

Asst. Prof. Kul pointed out a striking point, stating that trust in airline transportation should continue:









"In Türkiye, people should be more afraid at the crosswalk instead of being afraid of the plane. Unfortunately, drivers do not pay attention to pedestrian crossings, speed limits are not followed. This makes road accidents more dangerous."

While these statements about the safety of air transport alleviate some of the postaccident concerns, experts stress that it is vital to strictly enforce the rules and minimize the risks.
