IGU 2025–2026 Academic Year Opening Ceremony Held with Broad Participation!

The Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) 2025–2026 Academic Year Opening Ceremony was held in a vibrant atmosphere at the Mehmet Akif Ersoy Conference Hall on the Avcılar Campus, with the participation of academics, students, administrative staff, and numerous guests.

Numerous prominent figures from public institutions and organizations attended the ceremony. Opening remarks were delivered by Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat, Chairman of the IGU Board of Trustees Abdülkadir Gayretli, and IGU Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin. The speeches emphasized Turkey's economic goals, the strategic importance of education, and the university's international vision.

Trade Minister Bolat stated that the topic of the first lecture held at Istanbul Gelisim University this year was "Gaza and the Israeli Genocide." Bolat shared information about the period during and after the Ottoman rule in Palestine and discussed Palestine's historical processes. He stated that the 1993 Oslo Peace Accords established a Palestinian state with its headquarters in Ramallah, and that this state, with the contributions of Turkey, has been officially recognized by over 150 countries.

Abdulkadir Gayretli, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Istanbul Gelisim University, emphasized that Istanbul Gelisim University continues on its path with ambitious, innovative, and productive vision, saying, "Our university continues to grow as an institution that aims to pioneer innovations unlike any other in the world."

Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin stated that the university began its educational activities in 2008 with a vocational school, but by 2025, it had reached 39,000 students. Şahin emphasized that 11,000 of these students are international students, saying, "We are the university that contributes most to our country's internationalization goal and ranks first in Turkey in this field. We expect the number of 11,000 international students to increase even further with the completion of registration this year."

Opening Lecture: "Gaza"

The first lecture of the new academic year was titled "First Lecture: Gaza," dedicated to the Palestinians. Dr. Ali Semin delivered the opening lecture. In his speech, Semin highlighted the historical and humanitarian dimensions of Gaza and emphasized the importance of raising students' awareness of global events.

IGU's 2025-2026 Academic Year Opening Ceremony marked a strong start to the new term, reflecting both the sensitivity given to economic and social issues and the university's internationalization goals. The messages delivered at the opening once again highlighted the university's leading role in education, science, and social responsibility.

International Academic Gathering at Istanbul Gelisim University: The 5th USBED Conference Held!

The **5th International Conference on Social Sciences Education (USBED)**, organized jointly by Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), Kastamonu University, and USBED, was hosted by IGU this year. **190 academics from 24 countries** participated in the conference, where 108 scientific articles were presented. The event, which began with an opening ceremony, emphasized international knowledge sharing and academic solidarity in the social sciences. The conference was chaired by **Prof. Dr. Aytekin Demircioğlu, Prof. Dr. Arda Öztürkcan, Assoc. Prof. Dr. Emel Tozlu Öztay, Prof. Dr. Emilia Aleverdov, and Dr. Tinatin Zhorzholiani**.

IGU Vice Rector Prof. Dr. Arda Öztürkcan expressed his pleasure in hosting the conference and expressed his hope that the event would become a sustainable academic tradition in the social sciences. Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya stated that the conference addressed a wide range of topics, from globalization to artificial intelligence, from gender studies to Islamic philosophy. IGU Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin stated in his speech, "Technical innovation cannot be sustained without social innovation. At our university, we aim for sustainable development by bringing together social, artistic, and technical innovation." The event provided an interdisciplinary perspective on current issues in the social sciences and strengthened Istanbul Gelişim University's international academic collaborations.

World Food Day Talk at IGU: "Hand in Hand for Better Food and a Better Future"

Istanbul Gelisim University hosted a meaningful talk on World Food Day, October 16th. At the event, Mr. Abuzer Sağdıç, the Istanbul Avcılar District Director of Agriculture and Forestry, and Asst. Prof. Nevruz Berna Tatlısu, Head of the Gastronomy and Culinary Arts Department at the Faculty of Applied Sciences, met with university students to discuss food safety, the situation in food and beverage businesses, inspections, sustainable production, and district agricultural policies.

The event, which was held in line with the FAO (Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations) theme for this year, "Hand in Hand for Better Foods and a Better Future," featured opening remarks from Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya, Dean of the Faculty of Applied Sciences. Following these remarks, Dr. Serap Yeşilkırbaydar, Director of the Life Sciences Biomedical Engineering Application and Research Center, and Dr. Lecturer Özcan, Director of the Social Responsibility Application and Research Center, Member Ayşe Aydın also reinforced the day's significance with her speech on access to safe food.

In her speech, Istanbul Avcılar District Director of Agriculture and Forestry, Ms. Abuzer Sağdıç, stated that the District Directorates of Agriculture and Forestry are one of the most dynamic links in this process, saying, "Food safety can be achieved through meticulous field inspections and the conscious participation of the public. Every individual is a part of this chain."

Throughout the talk, topics such as food waste, digital inspection systems, the effects of climate change on the food chain, youth participation in the sector, and the importance of university-public collaborations were discussed. At the event, Dr. Tatlısu reminded that World Food Day is not only a day of awareness but also that access to food is a human right. "Every producer, every inspector, every consumer is a link in this chain. The sustainability of food is directly linked to the sustainability of soil, water, and labor. Protecting food is protecting the future," she said. During the talk, she emphasized that food is not only related to the production and consumption process; It was also emphasized that the program should be approached holistically, with principles of justice, sustainability, and social responsibility.

The program continued interactively with questions from students and contributions from participants. At the end of the talk, the shared idea that World Food Day is not just a celebration but a call to awareness was emphasized. At the end of the talk, held in the K Section Fırnas Auditorium, Faculty Dean Prof. Dr. Kamil Kaya presented Abuzer Sağdıç with a plaque for his valuable contributions, and the participants were served traditional aşure.

Dr. Tatlısu, Dr. Muzaffer Çakmak, Lect. Demirçakmak, Lect. Başgöze, Lect. Zehra Sümeyye Yalçın

During the four years I spent in the English Translation and Interpreting Department, which I began in 2021, I not only learned a profession, but also transformed the way I thought and perceived the world. This department taught me to seek meaning beyond words, to build bridges between cultures, and to listen patiently.



In the early years of my education, we began with theoretical courses that laid the foundations. We then consolidated our knowledge with foreign language and practical courses. We continuously improved ourselves through the countless translations we conducted in our Simultaneous Interpreting Laboratory. Reproducing a text with each translation, choosing the right words, and conveying emotion was truly an art form. In those moments, I felt a connection with the words. In this process, translation became not just a transfer between languages but also a form of understanding. I learned to think like a translator. I could now focus not only on the meaning of the text but also on how the message was perceived by the target audience. In a sense, I learned to participate on both sides of the communication.

Over the course of four years, I had the opportunity to experience many facets of translation. Working in diverse fields such as media and advertising translation, subtitling, economics, medicine, law, simultaneous, consecutive, and literary translation has given me a valuable insight into each. Sometimes I'd get lost in medical terminology, while other times I'd find myself immersed in dialogue while translating subtitles. These diverse courses further broadened my horizons. While learning legal terminology, we also discussed laws and discussed cases, strengthening my general knowledge. I've gained enough knowledge to grasp the importance of localization in marketing and advertising campaigns with a single word. Thanks to my knowledge of terminology, I can understand economic news without searching for terms. When watching a movie, my mind constantly echoes with the question, "If I were you, I could translate it this way." When watching a play, I find myself delving into research, wondering, "I wonder how these cultural elements resonate with the target audience's?" This diversity has given me a better understanding of my desired field of study.

We've also hosted many esteemed figures from the industry through our student club, İGÜÇEV, in which we actively participate. The experiences and suggestions we received from them increased my awareness of the profession. At the symposium and panel discussion on "Translation Studies and Translation Education in Turkey," held in our department, I had the opportunity to connect with and network with invaluable faculty members who are experts in their fields. I gained invaluable insights into the past, present, and future of translation.

The TÜBİTAK projects we developed together also demonstrated the value of going beyond theoretical knowledge and engaging in research and production.

Looking back today, I see that what this department has taught me has been not only a professional journey but also a personal one. While I struggled at times, each experience has taught me something new. Now, with graduation, I am advancing step by step in the world of translation. Thanks to İGU, I am already prepared for this journey, which will develop by putting what I've learned into practice, not just by translating, but also by expressing it.

Animal Rights and Stray Animals

“The suffering of animals should make us question how we treat them.”

Prof. Jane Goodall

Eric Fromm beautifully describes love in his book, “The Art of Loving.” According to Fromm, if someone says, “I love flowers,” they naturally take responsibility for their care. In other words, a flower lover exhibits behaviors such as determining the appropriate sunlight angle for the flower to grow and bloom, determining how much water it needs, watering it at specific intervals, and fertilizing it at specific times to stimulate its growth. Similarly, someone who claims to love animals defends the natural rights of animals and approaches them with a sense of responsibility. This animal could be a stray dog or cat, or a wild boar, deer, or gorilla. A person is responsible for the stray animals they pass by every day. He is also responsible for the polar bears who, living thousands of kilometers away, swim for miles to reach another glacier due to global warming caused by human consumption habits, only to swim for miles to reach another glacier where they can rest. Exhausted from swimming, he is also responsible for the mother cow who gives milk not because she is a cow, but because she is a mother. Just as humans do not steal a mother's milk to put in their coffee, he is also aware of not stealing the milk of a mother cow.

He also knows that the honey bees produce year-round is their sole food during the winter, and that they produce it solely for themselves, and he would never steal their food. He also knows that despite their canine teeth, humans are herbivores, not carnivores, because in nature, there are other animals with canine teeth. Carnivores drink by curling their tongues like spoons, like cats and dogs, while herbivores, like humans, suckle their milk. Scientific publications by vegan scientists have also been found: the protein content in 100 grams of beans is higher than in 100 grams of red meat, just as the calcium content in 100 grams of spinach is higher than in 100 grams of milk. It's he who has a cat and/or dog at home. He is compassionate, having educated himself through these miracles of nature, and he knows full well that a lamb, a calf, or a chicken actually forms an emotional bond and communicates with humans, and therefore, these creatures are no different from his own cat and/or dog in terms of behavior.

He also knows that every living creature with a central nervous system, just like a human, anticipates its death and experiences intense anxiety and pain before it dies. He knows the reality of shelters in his own country or even in European countries, and even if he doesn't see it, he suffers. Mustafa Kemal Atatürk beautifully describes this pain: "Just as when a needle pricks someone's finger, the person feels the pain not only in their finger but throughout their entire body. When someone on the other side of the world suffers, that same person feels the pain throughout their entire body and soul." He knows the reason: empathy. Like all living beings with a central nervous system, he suffers at dawn, during a coffee break, or in the dead of night. It is precisely at this point that he wages an individual and/or communal struggle for all living beings within this monstrous industrial network. He knows that this issue is, in fact, a matter of compassion, creation, conscience, love, responsibility, consistency, and an awareness of speciesism. And this person, my dear friends, is a bit like me.

I know I was born into a lucky family. My late father and I would go out every day to feed animals in and around the military lodge where I was born. Back then, there were no dry food or veterinary clinics. We would take any sick animal to Istanbul Cerrahpaşa Animal Hospital by military vehicle and have it treated. Before discharge, we would administer all necessary vaccinations and release it back into its natural habitat. How many times have I seen my sheep friend, whom I fed with carnations from my late grandmother's balcony and slept with at night, screamed and slaughtered before my eyes on a holiday, only to be devoured with great gusto by the family, who had come from various cities to gather at my grandmother's house in Izmir for the holiday. My dear late father was the one to wipe my tears and tell me I didn't have to eat my friend.

A final word: Dear friends, knowing that animal rights are, in fact, equal rights to life, living with this awareness and taking active responsibility is a culture, and a part of this culture exists in our land. My only wish is for this awareness in our country to be revived and continue to grow. If you decide to become a human being for at least one stray animal (not adopting, because humans are not the superior species), you will be amazed at what this animal will teach you over time; there will be no room for anger, resentment, or other negative emotions. I am sure you will gain a deeper understanding of patience, unconditional love, compassion, kindness, and conscientiousness. Greetings to the 10 cats and 1 dog at my home, the 60-odd cats I've fed and personally cared for in the complex where I've lived for years, my beloved Cheddar and Ağzı Kara, whom I adopted from the shelter, and the 3-4 cats I've just started fostering on our campus, the 25-30 cats I've just started fostering at the Altunizade Metro stop, the 200 dogs from Yeditepe whom I've fed for years, rolled around in the grass with, and couldn't get enough of, and many more. Greetings to all my animal rights activist friends. Greetings to my dear friend's son, Alaz Pesen, the composer of the song "I'm on Your Side," and the son of my dear friend. Hoping to see you in times when speciesism is no longer accepted.

Hello,

I had an incredible experience this year, thanks to the contributions of Istanbul Gelisim University. I made unforgettable memories that will last a lifetime, and it was a completely different experience for me. I'm sure these experiences will benefit me greatly in the future. First and foremost, I'd like to thank our university for providing us with this opportunity.

I completed my Erasmus program in Poland. Among the European countries, Poland was the country I was most curious about, and I was truly delighted when I chose a school in Poland.
