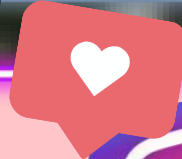

Research.com, one of the world's leading research and academia portals, has announced the list of the "Best Scientists" of the world and countries. Istanbul Gelisim University academics were shown among the best scientists in Turkey and the world with their degrees in "Engineering and Technology", "Economy and Finance" and "Neuroscience".

**Great success in the fields of "Engineering and Technology",
"Economics and Finance" and "Neuroscience"!**

Istanbul Gelisim University, which is modern, developing, producing and advancing with an understanding of quality education, stands out with its science, technology and R&D studies. According to the list created on the basis of the D-index created for the purpose of measuring, evaluating and monitoring the performance of scientists in terms of scientific productivity. 3 academicians from Istanbul Gelisim University were included in the list of "Best Scientists" with their successful work.

Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Dr. Bahri Şahin ranked 17th among 47 scientists from Turkey and 4020th in the world in the field of Engineering and Technology.

Prof. Dr. Kemal Sıtkı Türker from IGU Faculty of Dentistry achieved an important success by being 4th among 6 scientists from Turkey and 5870th in the world.

Asst. Prof. Dr. Festus Victor from the Faculty of Economics, Administrative and Social Sciences of IGU was the only scientist from Turkey to be ranked in the field of Economics and Finance, and he was ranked 1183 in the world.

Among the world universities: IGU is in THE World Universities Field Ranking!

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) achieved a significant success at the international level by ranking in the 1001-1200 band in the Times Higher Education (THE) World Universities Ranking in 2025. IGU has achieved another significant success in two different categories by appearing for the first time in THE World Universities Subject Rankings list. IGU succeeded in being represented in the rankings for the first time in THE World Universities Field Ranking 2025. The University was in the 601-800 band in the Business and Economics category and in the 501-600 band in the Social Sciences category.

IGU is in the top 10 among Turkish universities!

Continuing its activities with the vision of "World University", Istanbul Gelisim University, London-based international higher education rating agency Times Higher Education (THE) has achieved great success by ranking in the top 500 in the field of Research Quality in THE World Universities Ranking for 2025 and in the 1001-1200 band in the general ranking. THE World Universities Field Ranking in 2025;

In the field of Business and Economics, it was ranked 6th among the foundation universities in Türkiye, 10th in Türkiye, and in the 601-800 band in the world ranking; in the field of Social Sciences, it was ranked 3rd among the foundation universities, 5th in Türkiye, and in the 501-600 band in the world ranking. In the Communication and Media field of the Social Sciences category, it ranked 4th in Türkiye and 2nd among foundation universities.

These degrees revealed that Istanbul Gelisim University is effectively positioned not only in general rankings but also in certain academic areas and has a strong presence in these areas.

Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Bahri Şahin stated the followings about the achievements of THE World Universities Ranking and THE World Universities Field Ranking: "With our university ranking overall, it is a great source of pride for us to be included in the rankings in the fields of Business and Economics and Social Sciences for the first time this year. This achievement once again reveals our university's research capacity, quality of education and vision of internationalization. Our place in the 501-600 band, which is obtained especially in the Social Sciences category, embodies our goal of increasing the academic power of our university in the field of social sciences and its competitiveness on a global scale. As Istanbul Gelisim University, we will continue to maintain our understanding of excellence in education and research."

Istanbul Gelisim University's Vice Rector for Quality, Accreditation and Internationalization Prof. Arda Öztürkcan, on the other hand, said the following about THE success rankings:

"It is a pleasure for our university to enter the general ranking in THE World Universities Ranking and then to take part in THE World Universities Field Ranking on top of our success in THE Awards Asia 2025. This success is an important indicator that we are on the way to achieving our quality and internationalization goals in our education and research activities."

The grades obtained by Istanbul Gelisim University in THE rankings proved once again that the university has a competitive structure on a global scale and that it attaches importance to quality standards in the education it offers to its students. The university is determined to continue its work uninterruptedly to continue these achievements in the future.

SCImago 2025 results announced: IGU is at the top among foundation universities!

The results of "SCImago University Rankings 2025", in which the scientific research, innovation and social impacts of the world's universities are ranked according to SCOPUS and SciVal publication and citation data, were announced. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), which stands out with its studies, ranked 6th among foundation universities in the general ranking and 4th in the field of research, and ranked at the top in the categories of Economics, Planning and Civil Engineering.

The results of "SCImago University Rankings 2025", which measure the social, scientific impact and innovation of universities around the world, were announced. SCImago University Ranking, which aims to give a general idea about universities by measuring the performance of universities in terms of research, innovation and social impact, helps students learn about the quality, effectiveness and prestige of a university's education. Advancing with the vision of "World University", IGU attracted attention with its studies and opportunities for its students, and proved its success once again with the degrees it received in different fields in SCImago University Rankings 2025 results. IGU ranked 6th among foundation universities in the general ranking and 25th in Türkiye; ranked 4th among foundation universities in the field of research and 8th in Türkiye.

IGU is at the top in Economics, Planning and Civil Engineering!

According to SCImago's evaluation based on Scopus and SciVal data, Istanbul Gelisim University ranked at the top among foundation universities in many areas.

Drawing attention with its research studies in different fields, IGU ranked 1st among foundation universities in the fields of Economics, Econometrics and Finance and ranked 5th in Türkiye. In the field of Planning and Development, it ranked 1st among foundation universities and 4th in Türkiye. While ranking 1st among foundation universities in the field of Civil and Structural Engineering, it ranked 11th in Türkiye.



Top 2 in Business, Engineering & Social Sciences!

Istanbul Gelisim University continues to rise in the rankings every year with its investments in scientific research and innovation. While it ranks 2nd among foundation universities in the field of Business Administration, Management and Accounting, it rose to 5th place in Türkiye's overall ranking, where it ranked 7th last year. Standing out with its research activities, IGU ranked 2nd among foundation universities in the field of Engineering and ranked 5th by climbing 9 steps among Turkish universities. While ranking in the top 2 among foundation universities in the field of Social Sciences, it ranked 11th in Türkiye.

IGU, which has demonstrated its success in different fields, ranked 4th among foundation universities in the Energy category and 9th in Türkiye.

Istanbul Gelisim University Continues its Rise in Sustainability in THE Impact Rankings 2025

According to the 2025 Impact Rankings results announced by Times Higher Education (THE), Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) once again demonstrated its performance in the field of sustainability. In the ranking prepared in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the United Nations, IGU was in the 601-800 band worldwide. Having made a significant leap from last year's 801-1000 band with this success, IGU has once again proven that it continues its steady progress in the field of sustainability.



Evaluated Between 2526 Universities

In the ranking, in which 2526 universities from 130 countries applied and 2318 of them were evaluated, more than 220,000 evidence was collected from universities and more than 3.7 million articles on the SDG were examined. During the evaluation process, 75 metrics, 251 indicators and more than 230,000 criteria were analyzed. In the current list announced, 112 universities from Turkey were listed.

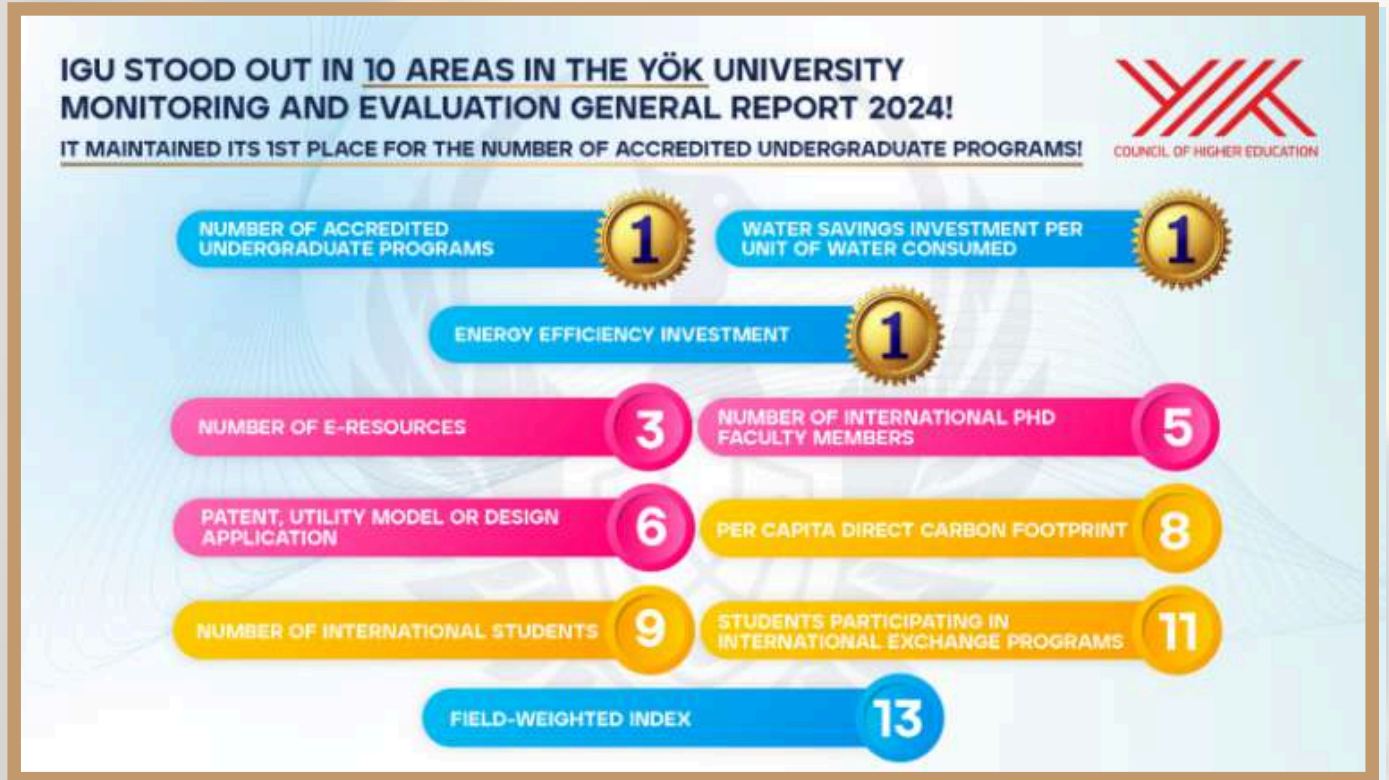
Global Achievement in Sustainability: At the Top in the Field of Accessible Clean Energy!

Istanbul Gelisim University entered the general ranking by scoring in the following four SDG areas in its 2025 evaluation:

- SDG 7: Accessible and Clean Energy – 1st among foundation universities in Turkey
- SDG 4: Qualified Education – 3rd in Turkey
- SDG 10: Reducing Inequalities – Shared 3rd place with Bilkent University across Turkey
- SDG 17: Partnerships for Purposes – ranked 4th among foundation universities in Turkey; in the 401-600 band worldwide

YÖK evaluated universities: IGU ranked 1st in 3 categories

The "University Monitoring and Evaluation General Report-2024" prepared by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK) was published. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), which stood out in 6 fields last year, stood out in 10 fields this year with its studies. While IGU was at the top with its studies in the field of water saving investment and energy efficiency investment per the amount of water consumed in the "Sustainability" category, which is one of the evaluations made by the Council of Higher Education, it maintained its 1st place as the university with the most accredited undergraduate programs.



The "University Monitoring and Evaluation General Report-2024", in which the Council of Higher Education evaluated 201 universities in Turkey according to 64 different indicators, was published. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) ranked 1st in the university category, where the use of energy efficiency investment and water saving investment per the amount of water consumed was the highest. IGU, which took firm steps towards internationalization, maintained its 1st place as the university with the most accredited undergraduate programs among both state and foundation universities.

IGU entered the rankings in 10 different indicators in 4 different categories

Istanbul Gelisim University, which proceeds with the vision of "Research University ", ranked 6th in the category of "applied patent, useful model or design" in the field of " Research-Development, Project and Publication" according to 2024 data, and 13th in the category of "Field-weighted citation impact". In the "University Monitoring and Evaluation General Report-2024"; IGU, which is the 1st university with the most accredited undergraduate programs in the field of "Education and Training", ranked 3rd in the "Number of E-Resources" category.

Advancing with the vision of the world university, IGU ranked 5th in the category of "Number of international doctoral academicians employed" in the field of "Internationalization", 9th in the category of "Number of international students" and 11th in the category of "Number of students participating in exchange programs".

Success in 3 different indicators in the sustainability field!

Istanbul Gelisim University, which attaches importance to sustainability studies in all areas, especially environmental sustainability by adopting the "Sustainable Development Goals", once again emphasized the importance it attaches to the practices for the effective use of natural resources as the 8th in the category of "Direct carbon footprint per capita" as well as its first place in the categories of "energy efficiency investment use" and "water saving investment per amount of water consumed" in the field of "Sustainability" in the 2024 report.

GreenMetric 2025 Results Announced: IGU's Success in Environment and Sustainability Continues

The results of the “UI GreenMetric World University Rankings 2025” have been announced. Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU), which draws attention with its environmental sustainability efforts, has achieved another significant success this year, continuing its upward trend from previous years. First included in the GreenMetric ranking in 2022, IGU increased its total score in 2025 and ranked 669th in the world. Evaluated among 1,547 universities in the overall ranking, IGU placed 71st in Türkiye and 14th among the foundation universities in Türkiye.



GreenMetric: A Global Benchmark in Sustainability

Launched in Indonesia in 2010, the GreenMetric World University Rankings evaluate universities worldwide based on their sustainability performance. The assessment is carried out across six main criteria: campus setting and infrastructure, energy and climate change, waste management, water resources, transportation, and education and research. It aims to increase environmental awareness and strengthen the culture of sustainability in higher education.

With this year's results, Istanbul Gelisim University has once again demonstrated its determined steps in sustainability and its systematic efforts to reduce environmental impact.

Another Addition to International Achievements

Standing out on international platforms with its sustainability initiatives, Istanbul Gelisim University reinforces its success with various global evaluation results. The GreenMetric 2025 outcomes serve as a complementary milestone, enhancing IGU's environmental policies and global competitiveness.

“Sustainability Is Not a Choice; It Is a Requirement of University Governance Culture”

Following the announcement of the results, Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Bahri Şahin emphasized the role of sustainability in the university's strategic vision with the following remarks:

“GreenMetric 2025 results are a strong reflection of the institutional vision our university has adopted in the field of environmental sustainability. Sustainability is no longer a factor that merely regulates campus life; it has become a fundamental approach that guides all academic and administrative processes from education to research, from energy management to community engagement projects.

As Istanbul Gelisim University, we carry out multidimensional activities in areas such as energy efficiency, rational use of resources, green area management, and environmental awareness education. This success is the result of the joint efforts of our academics, administrative staff, and students. We are committed to continuing our work in an even more comprehensive manner to ensure that the culture of sustainability becomes permanent at our university.”

With the GreenMetric 2025 results, Istanbul Gelisim University continues to advance its success as a higher education institution that centers environmental responsibility, strengthens sustainability policies, and enhances its international competitiveness. The university aims to further develop its multifaceted work in education, research, and community engagement in the coming years to support a sustainable future.

YÖK 2025 Report Released: IGU's Multidimensional Academic Success Officially Recognized

The “University Monitoring and Evaluation General Report–2025,” prepared by the Council of Higher Education (YÖK), has been published. The report presents the performance of universities in Türkiye across many dimensions, from academic output and internationalization to accessibility and quality assurance. According to the report, Istanbul Gelisim University ranked 1st nationwide in the number of “Patent, Utility Model, or Design” applications, achieving a significant success. The report also shows that Istanbul Gelisim University ranked among the top 20 universities in categories such as the number of accredited undergraduate programs, employment of international faculty members, international awards, and accessible library resources for individuals with disabilities.

Istanbul Gelisim University at the Top in Patent Applications

According to the data in the University Monitoring and Evaluation General Report–2025, Istanbul Gelisim University ranked 1st across Türkiye in the number of Patent, Utility Model, or Design applications. This result demonstrates the university’s strong capacity for research, innovation, and the production of commercially viable academic outputs.

The University with the Highest Number of Accredited Undergraduate Programs Among Foundation Universities

Based on data from the 2024 YKS guide, universities were ranked by the number of accredited undergraduate programs. With 44 internationally accredited undergraduate programs, Istanbul Gelisim University ranked 3rd nationwide and 1st among foundation universities. The report noted that this picture is one of the important indicators showing that accreditation is becoming increasingly decisive for both state and foundation universities.

Multidimensional Performance from IGU

According to the report, Istanbul Gelisim University is also among the universities employing the highest number of international faculty members as of 2024. With 49 international faculty members, IGU ranked 11th nationwide and 5th among foundation universities in this category.

In terms of internationally received awards, IGU ranked 15th nationwide and 9th among foundation universities with 14 international awards.

Regarding the number of audiobooks and accessible digital resources available in university libraries, Istanbul Gelisim University ranked 20th nationwide and 8th among foundation universities with 329,006 resources. The report emphasized that universities possessing resources at the level of hundreds of thousands or millions have become strategic centers in terms of accessibility and inclusivity.

“We Are Building a Sustainable Higher Education Model”

Commenting on the results achieved in the report published by YÖK, Istanbul Gelisim University Rector Prof. Bahri Şahin stated:

“The results obtained in this report published by the Council of Higher Education reveal that Istanbul Gelişim University is striving to realize its goal of becoming a research university through a holistic ecosystem approach. Ranking first nationwide in patent applications is a concrete outcome of our strategic approach that places university–industry collaboration at the center and transforms research into commercially viable outputs.

Our position among the top three universities in accreditation, internationalization, and accessibility indicators shows that we are building a sustainable higher education model that simultaneously addresses quality assurance, global academic interaction, and social responsibility. As Istanbul Gelisim University, we will continue in the coming period to strengthen this ecosystem shaped around research, innovation, and internationalization, and to contribute to our country’s higher education and R&D capacity.”

This initiative aims to help alumni adapt to the changing business world and continuously enhance their competencies.

In addition, as part of the event, four alumni were awarded free master's degree opportunities and scholarships. Through this support, the university encourages its graduates to re-engage in knowledge production processes.



Strong Alumni Network, Strong Future

Istanbul Gelisim University positions its alumni not merely as part of its past, but as strategic stakeholders in its institutional development and future. With comprehensive support mechanisms extending from education to career development and from academia to professional life, IGU continues to build a strong alumni network presenting a university model that grows, evolves, and creates value together with its graduates.



Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School started education in 2008 with 9 programs and became a school that forms the core of Istanbul Gelisim University. It has shown rapid development since its establishment; it has reached 19 departments, 37 programs and 10,630 students. Evening education is provided in 21 of 37 programs.

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School continues its educational activities with its experienced and strong academic staff. In addition to the permanent instructors, by employing the leading names of the sector part-time, the students are given the opportunity to learn their practical experience in business life.

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School, which has moved to its new campus as of the Fall Term of the 2017-2018 Academic Year, has a total of 22 workshops, including Aircraft Maintenance Workshops, Mock-Up, Kitchen, Electric, Construction, Automotive, Serigraphy, Ceramics and Fashion workshops, in its new campus so that students can apply their theoretical education practically. Besides it offers a field of application with 7 Computer Labs, one of which is MAC.

Our School's Aircraft Technology Program has the Recognized School Approval Certificate from the General Directorate of Civil Aviation (SHGM) as well as the Flight Operations Specialist Training (Dispatcher) Authorization Certificate from the DGCA. Apart from our two programs authorized by DGCA, the licensing processes for the Approved Cabin Crew Basic Training Organization Certificate for Civil Aviation Cabin Services Turkish and English Programs and the Approved Ground Handling Training Organization Certificate for Civil Air Transport Management Turkish and English Programs are continuing at the DGCA.

Istanbul Gelisim Vocational School students can benefit from the educational and social activity opportunities available in all campuses of our university without interruption.

Istanbul Gelisim University (IGU) Career Guidance Application and Research Center, in cooperation with İŞKUR, organized a major event shedding light on youth employment. Next Gen'25, titled "New Approaches in Youth Employment: The New Face of Career in the Era of Twin Transformation," brought together academics, industry representatives, and students to comprehensively discuss the ongoing transformation in the world of careers.

Next Gen'25, organized in cooperation with IGU Career Guidance Application and Research Center and İŞKUR, began with an opening speech by IGU Career Center Deputy Director Asst. Prof. Kenan Akpınar. Asst. Prof. Akpınar emphasized the importance of collaboration: "True success is possible through the harmony and coordination of university–public–industry cooperation. The "Autonomous Systems Fundamentals and Application Certificate Program," conducted by Lect. Ali ÇETİNKAYA of the Autonomous Systems Technician Program at IGVS, continues successfully within the Istanbul Gelişim University Continuing Education Center (IGU SEM).

The in-person training program is held on December 15, 16, 18, 22, 23, and 25, 2025, between 17:00 and 22:00. The training includes practical exercises and guidance to help participants build a technical portfolio using professional platforms such as GitHub, LinkedIn, and Google Colab.

The training covers the fundamental components of autonomous systems, sensor technologies, sensing and decision-making mechanisms, control systems, path planning and obstacle avoidance algorithms, communication protocols such as I2C, SPI, and CAN, autonomous system architecture, and basic applications using the Python language in detail. Furthermore, current application examples of autonomous systems in industry, defense, transportation, and robotics are shared with participants.

This training program, primarily aimed at students studying engineering and technology, as well as participants interested in robotics, embedded systems, automation, and artificial intelligence, also provides a significant technical foundation for professionals involved in autonomous vehicle technologies and R&D.

The goal is for participants who successfully complete the program to gain the knowledge and skills to evaluate the working principles of autonomous systems from a holistic perspective; to understand the relationship between sensor, sensing, decision-making, and control processes; and to develop fundamental applications.

Industry Experience Meets Academia: Neapolitan Pizza Workshop

As part of the Dough Techniques course led by Lect. M. B   ra Saęlam, a Neapolitan Pizza Workshop was held for first-year students of the Pastry and Bakery Program. Supporting the university's commitment to application-based learning, the event featured guest chefs and university alumnae H  meyra G  zeller and Ferihan Tezcan, who are currently pursuing successful professional careers in the industry.

During the workshop, students were provided with both theoretical and practical insights into the historical development and geographical origins of Neapolitan pizza, in accordance with traditional production criteria and international standards. The session covered detailed topics such as pizza dough formulation, the impact of flour selection on dough structure, types of yeast, kneading techniques, and the effects of fermentation time and temperature on dough rheology.

In the practical phase, students learned correct dough-stretching techniques and observed how elasticity and gas-retention capacity affect final product quality. The sauce preparation process emphasized fundamental gastronomic principles, including tomato varieties, acidity balance, and flavor development during cooking. In addition, students carried out applications following professional standards regarding ingredient selection, portioning, and product balance based on pizza types.

Industry Experience Meets Academia: Neapolitan Pizza Workshop



As the workshop progressed, students gained hands-on experience with the high-temperature baking process in a stone oven, observing the direct impact of baking time, oven heat, and hearth structure on the quality of the final product. The event concluded with an evaluation and tasting session of the pizzas prepared by the students.

At the end of the lesson, plaques were presented to guest chefs Hümeyra Gözeller and Ferihan Tezcan for their contributions, highlighting the importance of alumni-student interaction in boosting professional motivation and knowledge transfer. This workshop underscores the significance of integrating industry experience with academic education to enhance professional competencies and cultivate a high-quality workforce.

A Flavor Heritage from Tradition to the Future:

Technical Visit to Karaköy Güllüoğlu with Our Students

Under the leadership of Lect. Zeynep Kurhan, a technical visit was organized to Karaköy Güllüoğlu, one of the iconic brands of Turkish dessert tradition, with students of the Culinary Arts and Gastronomy Program. At the establishment, which stands out with its century-long accumulation of knowledge and craftsmanship, the entire baklava production process-from raw materials to final presentation-was observed on site. During the visit, students had the opportunity to closely examine the production stages of baklava through practical observation and to gain detailed insight into the traditional production process.

During the program held at the Karaköy Güllüoğlu production facility, the baklava production process was comprehensively explained to the students by company representative Nadir Güllü. The presentation focused on the deep-rooted history of Güllüoğlu Baklava, the brand's development within the sector, its growth story, and the dedication, craftsmanship, and quality philosophy behind this success. In addition, students were shown through practical examples how traditional production methods are integrated with modern production techniques.

Growth, Competition, and Structural Issues in the Civil Aviation Sector: Dynamics of a Developing Industry

The civil aviation sector is currently exhibiting a notable growth momentum driven by rapidly increasing passenger demand. This increase is evident not only in the number of passengers carried but also in the economic, social, and environmental impacts of the sector.

In response to demand, the number of businesses operating in the sector is growing, and employment opportunities are expanding in parallel. However, these developments simultaneously create an intense competitive environment. It is becoming increasingly difficult for smaller-scale businesses to sustain themselves in the sector, as high costs provide a competitive advantage to larger firms. Pricing strategies, service diversification, and the quality of in-flight services are among the determining factors in this competition.

Civil aviation, besides being a capital-intensive industry, is also grappling with several structural challenges. Pilot shortages, high capital costs, and inflexible labor laws are among the fundamental issues faced across the sector. Furthermore, in some periods, government decisions made without regard for the supply-demand balance can increase the fragility of the sector.

On a global scale, the constraint on supply stands out as a significant problem. In contrast, the demand for air travel is constantly rising. External factors, such as natural disasters, global health crises, and the socio-political structures of countries, can directly impact the sector's financial stability. This situation indicates that risk factors in the sector must be addressed not only at the company level but also at the macroeconomic level.

One of the basic characteristics of the civil aviation industry is its seasonality and cyclicity. The inability to stock products (such as seating capacity) places companies under significant time and revenue pressure. Investments made to increase capacity, especially during peak seasons, increase the fixed cost burden during off-peak periods, which can negatively affect the financial performance of companies.

Long-term aircraft acquisition processes and financial planning complicate the strategic decision-making processes in the sector. As often stated in academic literature, assumptions regarding current economic conditions and the operating environment increase the strategic risk for airline companies.

In conclusion, while the civil aviation sector continues to maintain its growth potential, competition, costs, the supply-demand balance, and structural issues stand out as key elements that must be carefully evaluated for the sector's sustainability.
